<b>Depose</b>	remove someone from a post suddenly and forcefully.
<b>Furtive</b>	behaving in a way that you want to hide something
<b>Dearth</b>	A scarcity or lack of something.
<b>Desecrate</b>	to treat a sacred place or object with disrespect
<b>Tawdry</b>	Showy but cheap and of poor quality
<b>Upshot</b>	The final result or outcome of a process, event, or discussion.
<b>Contaminate</b>	to make something dirty, dangerous or less pure
<b>Illicit</b>	not approved by the law, illegal
<b>Resourceful</b>	good at finding ways of doing things and solving problems, etc.
<b>Alluring`</b>	attractive and seductive in an enticing way
<b>Juvenile</b>	relating to a young person who is not yet old enough to be considered an adult
<b>Deflate</b>	To let the air or gas out of something, causing it to collapse or shrink.
<b>Boisterous</b>	Noisy, energetic, and cheerful
<b>Vehement</b>	Showing strong feeling
<b>Comical</b>	funny in a strange or silly way.
<b>Shrill</b>	(Of a voice or sound) characterized by a sharp, high, and penetrating quality.
<b>Skeptic</b>	A person who questions or doubts accepted opinions, claims, or beliefs.`

<b>Grumpy</b>	easily annoyed; in a bad mood
<b>Despondency</b>	the quality of being unhappy, with no hope or enthusiasm.
<b>Serene</b>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled
<b>Squirm</b>	to move about in distress as a result of fear or shame`
<b>Reverie</b>	An abstracted, dreamy, or imaginative state of mind
<b>Commence</b>	To begin or start something.
<b>Outflow</b>	the movement of a large amount of money, liquid, people, etc. out of a place
<b>Ghastly</b>	extremely awful
<b>Uniformity</b>	the state of overall sameness or being identical in every way
<b>Confound</b>	To cause confusion or surprise in someone
<b>Ebullient</b>	cheerful and full of energy
<b>Upright</b>	(of a person) behaving in a moral and honest way
<b>Incinerate</b>	To burn something completely
<b>Vanquish</b>	To defeat or overcome someone completely
<b>Accolade</b>	praise or an award for an achievement that people admire
<b>Wisp</b>	a small, thin piece of hair, grass, etc.
<b>Conformity</b>	acting according to certain accepted standards
<b>Quaint</b>	attractive in an unusual or old-fashioned way
<b>Hysterics</b>	an uncontrollable crying or laughing spell`

<b>Rue</b>	to feel regret or remorse for something.
<b>Incarcerate</b>	To imprison or confine someone, typically as a punishment for a crime.
<b>Impose</b>	to order that a rule, punishment, etc.
<b>Melancholy</b>	a feeling of deep sadness
<b>Proactive</b>	taking action to make changes yourself rather than reacting to things that happen
<b>Joyless</b>	without happiness
<b>Interacts</b>	to communicate with somebody, especially while you work, play or spend time with them
<b>Worsened</b>	To become worse or more severe
<b>Cowardice</b>	lack of bravery
<b>Lenient</b>	not strict in enforcing rules, laws, or discipline.
<b>Blunt</b>	very direct in one's words, usually in a negative manner and in a rude way
<b>Impulsive</b>	tending to make decisions without thinking

<b>Massive</b>	very large, heavy and solid
<b>Fluctuate</b>	to change, especially continuously and between one level or thing and another
<b>Confidential</b>	showing that what you are saying is private or secret
<b>Pitiable</b>	deserving pity or sympathy
<b>Sarcastic</b>	Intended to ridicule or express scorn in a humorous or cutting manner.
<b>Troublesome</b>	causing a lot of problems for someone
<b>Ambitious</b>	strongly desirous and determined to succeed
<b>Elegance</b>	being graceful and stylish in appearance
<b>Desperate</b>	a feeling of hopelessness in which someone is willing to try the impossible to solve a problem
<b>Nepotism</b>	The practice of showing favoritism, especially in business or politics
