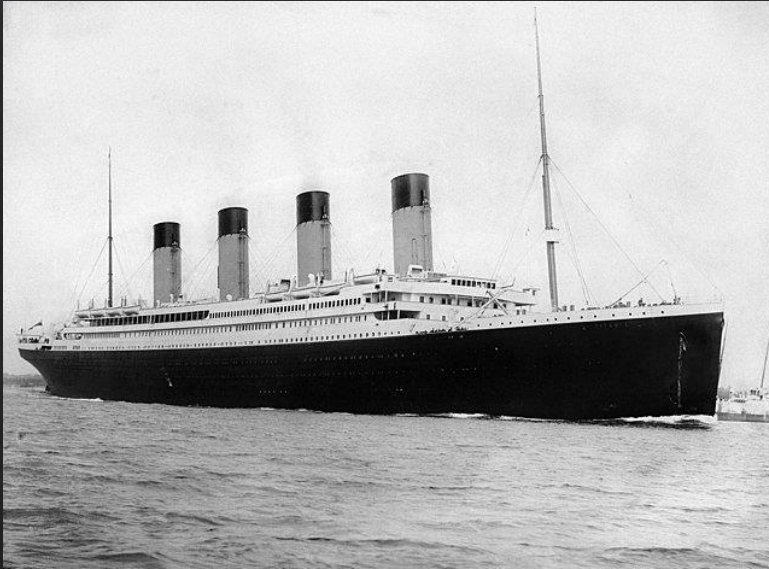


**Titanic :-** extremely large

**Antonyms:-** Tiny, Small,

**E.g.:-** The company faced titanic challenges as it tried to expand into new markets.

**Implicate :-** to show or suggest that someone is involved in a crime or wrongdoing.

**Mnemonics :-** he broke our gate isliye humne kiya usko  
implicate

**Antonyms:-** Exonerate, Vindicate, Exclude

**E.g.:-** If the evidence is found, it will implicate the person behind the brutal act.

**Discriminate :-** To recognize or show a difference between things, often by making fine distinctions.

**Mnemonics :-** this cream ate only by son

**Synonyms: -** absolution, amnesty, exemption,

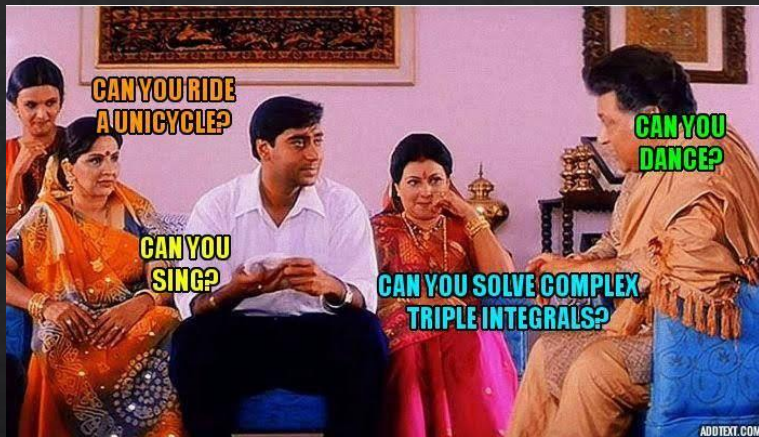
**Antonyms:-** Relapse, Punishment, Aggravation

**Antonyms:-** Gravitas, Sobriety, Earnestness

**Mnemonics :-** our strict teacher



**Synonyms:** - Severe, Stern, Ascetic

**Antonyms:-** Luxurious, Lavish, Lenient

**E.g.:-** He was a tall, austere, forbidding figure.



**Lousy :-** very poor in quality, unpleasant or unsatisfactory

**Mnemonics :-** lazy admi to lousy kaam hi karega



**Synonyms: -** Awful, Pitiful, Subpar

**Antonyms:-** Excellent, Fantastic, Wonderful

**E.g.:-** The government does a lousy job when it comes to managing floods.

**Peculiar :-** unusual, strange, or distinct from what is normal or expected.

**Mnemonics :-** pikku ka cooler ka bda hi peculiar

**Synonyms: -** Eccentric, Distinctive, Unique

**Antonyms:-** Normal, Ordinary, Typical

**E.g.:-** He had a peculiar way of arranging his books that only he understood.



**Affirm :-** to publicly verify something

**Antonyms:-** Deny, Refute, Reject

**E.g.:-** The army recruits affirm their commitment to the country by taking an oath.

**Mnemonics :-** jiska dimag shak pe tika

**Synonyms: -** Distrustful, Cynical, Suspicious

**Antonyms:-** Trustful, Believing, Confident

**E.g.:-** She was sceptical about the new study's findings, as they seemed too good to be true.

**Attire:-** one's dress or clothes

**Mnemonics :-** attire try kar kar ho gyi tired

**Antonyms:-** Disrobe, Undress, Nakedness

**E.g.:-** I hardly think jeans are appropriate attire for a wedding.

**E.g.:-** You should use this gel it can alleviate your back pain.

**Evasive:-** not straightforward or honest

**Mnemonics :-** evade

**Synonyms:-** Ambiguous, Vague, Avoidant

**Antonyms:-** Direct, Clear, Frank

**E.g.:-** Anjali was evasive about why she had not been at home that night.

**Homilies:-** a speech or piece of writing giving advice on the correct way to behave, etc.

**Mnemonics** :- home me lie nhi karte ye ek homily hai

**Antonyms:-** Silence, Absence of preaching

**E.g.:-** I don't need homilies from him about how to lead my life.



**Candid:-** to being honest, straightforward, and open in expression

**Mnemonics :-** candid interview

**Synonyms: -** Frank, Direct, Sincere

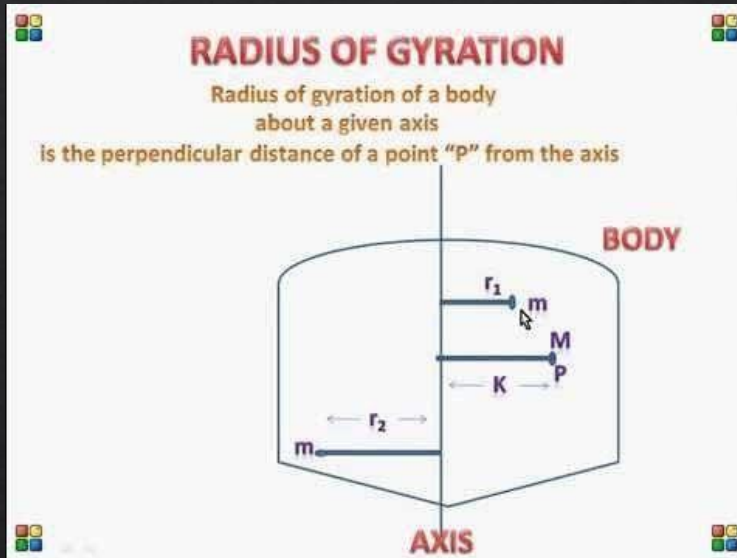
**Antonyms:-** Deceitful, Guarded, Insincere

**Mnemonics :-** rotation



**Synonyms: -** Revolution, Rotation, Spin

**Antonyms:-** Stillness, Stability, Immobility

**E.g.:-** Gyration in this manner will help in relieving your pain.

**Reckon:-** to calculate an amount, a number, etc.

**Mnemonics :-** re kon kon aaye hain reckon karo

**Antonyms:-** Disregard, Ignore, Mistrust

**E.g.:-** The age of the earth is reckoned at about 4.6 billion years.

**E.g.:-** She wore a dainty silver bracelet that complimented her elegant evening gown.

**Mnemonics :-** ye hen bhut ande deti hai ye fecund hai

**Antonyms:-** Sterility, Infertility, Drought

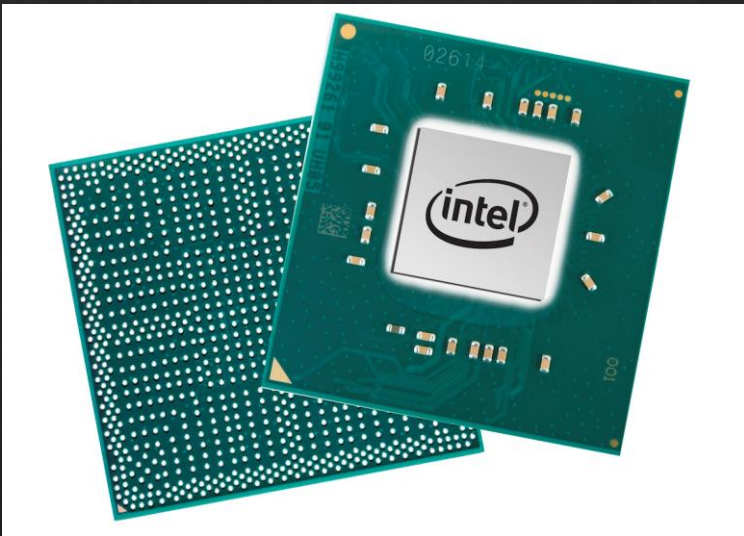
**E.g.:-** Fecundity declines rapidly after the age of 40.

**Synonyms: -** encompass, involve, necessitate

**Antonyms:-** Exclude, Prevent, Omit

**E.g.:-** The holiday party for three hundred guests will entail a lot of work from the event planner.



**Grisly :-** Causing horror or disgust; gruesome.

**Mnemonics :-** Grizzly bear is grisly

**Synonyms: -** Horrifying, gruesome, ghastly,

**Antonyms:-** Pleasant, delightful, cheerful, appealing.

**E.g.:-** The grisly details of the crime scene left everyone feeling deeply unsettled.

**Concordant :-** in agreement with something

**Mnemonics :-** accord / according to something



**Synonyms: -** Harmonious, agreeable, compatible.

**Antonyms:-** Discordant, conflicting, incompatible,

**E.g.:-** The findings are concordant with similar studies in other countries.

**Insipid :-** having almost no taste

**Mnemonics :-** insipid hai ye ek sip tak nhi le sakta iski

**Synonyms: -** Bland, dull, tasteless

**Antonyms:-** Flavorful, exciting, stimulating

**E.g.:-** The soup was insipid, lacking any distinct flavor.

**Indigent :-** Lacking basic necessities of life due to poverty

**Mnemonics :-** India ki bhut saari janta indigent hai

**Synonyms:-** destitute, needy, impoverished

**Antonyms:-** Wealthy, affluent, prosperous

**E.g.:-** The charity provides assistance to indigent families.

**Antonyms:-** idle, procrastinate, give up.

**E.g.:-** I will strive to win the race.

**Felicity :-** a state of happiness

**Mnemonics :-** festival ke time jab city decorated hoti hai to felicity feel hoti hai

**Synonyms: -** Bliss, joy, delight,

**Antonyms:-** Misery, sorrow, gloom.

**E.g.:-** She was filled with felicity when she received the news of her promotion.



**Frisky :-** full of energy; wanting to play

**Mnemonics :-** frisky hona acha baat hai but risky kaam mat karna

**Synonyms: -** Playful, energetic, spirited

**Antonyms:-** Lethargic, sluggish, tired

**E.g.:-** The puppy was frisky, running around the yard.

**Embezzlement :-** the act of stealing money that you are responsible for or that belongs to your employer

**Mnemonics :-** apne bag me daal lena management ka paisa

**Synonyms: -** theft, fraud, pilfering.

**Antonyms:-** Honesty, integrity, reimbursement

**E.g.:-** She was found guilty of embezzlement.

**Insolent :-** Showing a rude and arrogant lack of respect.

**Mnemonics :-** insulting ya rude way me baat karne wala

**Synonyms: -** Rude, disrespectful, impudent

**Antonyms:-** Polite, courteous, humble.

**E.g.:-** The student's insolent behavior towards the teacher shocked the entire class.

**Deprived :-** Suffering from a lack of basic material benefits or necessities.

**Mnemonics :-** Deprived bache private schools nhi ja paate

**Synonyms: -** Impoverished, destitute, needy

**Antonyms:-** Privileged, affluent, prosperous

**E.g.:-** They are probably the most deprived children in the whole city.

**Plethora :-** A large or excessive amount of something.

**Mnemonics :-** Thoda nhi hai plethora hai plate bhar lo

**Synonyms: -** Abundance, surplus, profusion.

**Antonyms:-** Scarcity, lack, deficiency.

**E.g.:-** The plethora of regulations is both contradictory and confusing.

**Envoy :-** A person sent as a representative on a special diplomatic mission.

**Synonyms: -** Messenger, delegate, ambassador

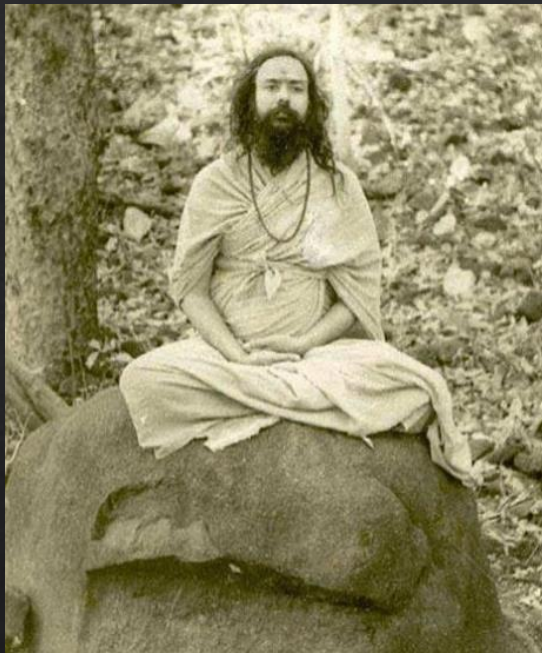
**Antonyms:-** resident, non-representative.

**Confiscate :-** to officially take something away from somebody especially as a punishment

**Synonyms:** - Appropriate, Expropriate, Impound.

**Antonyms:-** Return, release, restore.

**E.g.:-** According to school policy, the principal has the authority to confiscate suspicious items from students.



**Abscond :-** escape into hiding; to leave quickly and hide to avoid punishment

**Mnemonics :-** Wo kaand karke kar gya abscond

**Synonyms: -** Flee, Escape, decamp

**Antonyms:-** Stay, Abide, Avoid

**E.g.:-** He absconded from the trial, leaving the court without permission.

**Interpret :-** explain or understand the meaning of something

**Ascend :-** to rise; to go up; to climb up

**Mnemonics :-** accent car hills me bhi asani se ascend kar jati hai

**Synonyms: -** Elevate, Soar, Climb

**Antonyms:-** Descend, Fall, Decline

**E.g.:-** The hikers began to ascend the mountain early in the morning.

**Venom :-** the poisonous liquid that some snakes, spiders, etc. produce when they bite or sting you

**Synonyms:** - Poison, Toxin, Malice

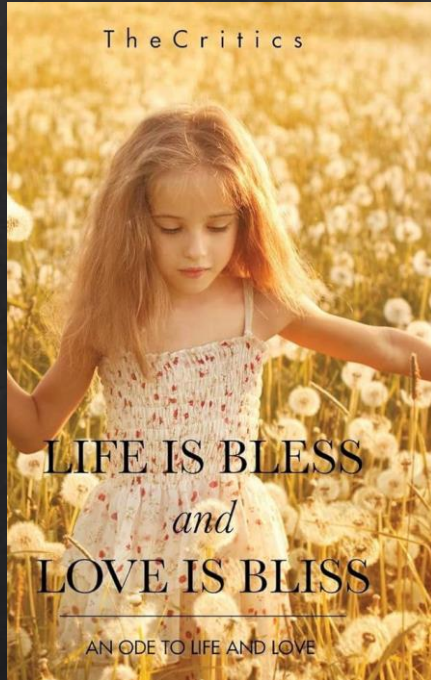
**Antonyms:-** Antidote, Benevolence, Kindness

**Synonyms: -** Euphoria, Ecstasy, Contentment

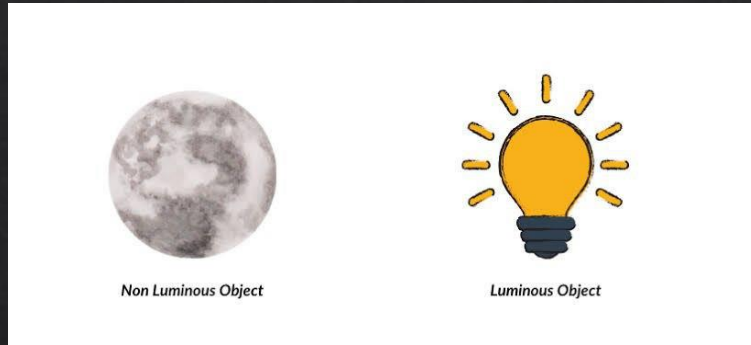
**Antonyms:-** Misery, Sorrow, Agony

**Luminous:-** shining in the dark; giving out light

**Root word :-** lumen (light)



**Synonyms: -** Radiant, Lustrous, Bright

**Antonyms:-** Obscure, Shadowy, Dull

**E.g.:-** The luminous stars lit up the night sky, creating a breathtaking view.

**Retract:-** to refuse to keep an agreement, a promise, etc.

**Mnemonics** :-Re + track



**Synonyms:** - Revoke, Renounce, Recede

**Antonyms:-** Assert, Reaffirm, Confirm

**E.g.:-** Soldiers of both the countries retracted after the ceasefire.

**Petty:-** small and insignificant

**Mnemonics :-** agar mai pretty hoti to itni petty tip na milti

**Synonyms: -** Trivial, Narrow, Unimportant



**Antonyms:-** Significant, Major, Grand

**E.g.:-** She became angry when he picked up the petty tip left by the customer.



**Assume:-** to suppose to be true, especially without proof

**Mnemonics :-** assumption/ aas lgana ki kuch sach hai

Assume	Presume
<b>Verb</b> To suppose something without any evidence.  <b>For example:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I <b>assume</b> it's Yasmin calling.</li><li>• I <b>assume</b> you wake up early.</li></ul>	<b>Verb</b> To suppose something with some evidence or probability.  <b>For example:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• I <b>presume</b> it's Jasmine calling me.</li></ul>

**Synonyms:** - Presume, Believe, Take on

**Antonyms:-** Prove, Reject, Disregard

**E.g.:-** It is never wise to automatically assume anything to be true, especially without any kind of proof.

**Condemn:-** to express strong disapproval of something or someone,

**Mnemonics** :-jab uske father ne usse condom buy karte pakda to condemn kiya.

**Synonyms:** - Denounce, Criticize, Blame

**Antonyms:-** Praise, Acquit, Commend

**E.g.:-** The council condemned the company for its unethical business practices, urging people to boycott its products.

**Mourn:-** to feel or express deep sorrow or grief

**Mnemonics** :-Mourn ke time 2 minutes ka maun rakha gya.

**Synonyms:** - Grieve, Lament, Sorrow

**Antonyms:-** Rejoice, Celebrate, Exult

**E.g.:-** The entire community gathered to mourn the loss of their beloved leader.



**Bind :-** to tie somebody/something with rope, string, etc.

**Mnemonics :-** bandha hua / bond



**Synonyms: -** Secure, Obligate, Confine

**Antonyms:-** Release, Free, Liberate

**E.g.:-** The contract will legally bind both parties to the terms and conditions agreed upon.

**Hypothesis :-** a proposed explanation or theory that is studied through scientific testing

**Mnemonics :-** guess

**Synonyms: -** Theory, conjecture, assumption

**Antonyms:-** Fact, certainty, conclusion

**E.g.:-** Each student gave a hypothesis and theorized which plant would grow the tallest during the study.

**Warm :-** showing affection, kindness, or enthusiasm.

**Mnemonics :-** warm welcome, warm hug

**Synonyms: -** cozy, friendly, affectionate.

**Antonyms:-** chilly, distant, indifferent.

**E.g.:-** Her smile was warm and friendly.



**Enormous :-** Extremely large in size, quantity, or extent.

**Mnemonics :-** this bus is enormous
