<b>Titanic</b>	extremely large
<b>Implicate</b>	to show or suggest that someone is involved in a crime or wrongdoing.
<b>Discriminate</b>	To recognize or show a difference between things, often by making fine distinctions
<b>Remission</b>	to the forgiveness or cancellation of a debt, charge, or penalty
<b>Frivolity</b>	lack of seriousness; light-heartedness
<b>Austere</b>	severe or strict in manner or attitude
<b>Lousy</b>	very poor in quality, unpleasant or unsatisfactory
<b>Peculiar</b>	unusual, strange, or distinct from what is normal or expected.
<b>Affirm</b>	to publicly verify something
<b>Sceptical</b>	having doubts that a claim or statement is true or that something will happen
<b>Attire</b>	one's dress or clothes
<b>Alleviate</b>	to make something less severe
<b>Evasive</b>	not straightforward or honest
<b>Homilies</b>	a speech or piece of writing giving advice on the correct way to behave, etc.
<b>Candid</b>	to being honest, straightforward, and open in expression
<b>Gyration</b>	the act of turning quickly in a circle is gyration
<b>Reckon</b>	to calculate an amount, a number, etc.

<b>Dainty</b>	to something that is delicately small and pretty
<b>Fecundity</b>	the ability to produce children, crops, etc
<b>Entail</b>	to make something necessary, or to involve something
<b>Grisly</b>	Causing horror or disgust; gruesome
<b>Concordant</b>	in agreement with something
<b>Insipid</b>	having almost no taste
<b>Indigent</b>	Lacking basic necessities of life due to poverty
<b>Strive</b>	to work hard towards a goal
<b>Felicity</b>	a state of happiness
<b>Frisky</b>	full of energy; wanting to play
<b>Embezzlement</b>	the act of stealing money that you are responsible for or that belongs to your employer
<b>Insolent</b>	Showing a rude and arrogant lack of respect.
<b>Deprived</b>	Suffering from a lack of basic material benefits or necessities.
<b>Plethora</b>	A large or excessive amount of something
<b>Lullaby</b>	A soothing song or melody, typically sung to help a child fall asleep
<b>Envoy</b>	A person sent as a representative on a special diplomatic mission.
<b>Anchorites</b>	a religious person who lived alone and avoided other people

<b>Confiscate</b>	to officially take something away from somebody especially as a punishment
<b>Abscond</b>	escape into hiding; to leave quickly and hide to avoid punishment
<b>Interpret</b>	explain or understand the meaning of something
<b>Ablaze</b>	burning fiercely; in a blaze; on fire
<b>Ascend</b>	to rise; to go up; to climb up
<b>Venom</b>	` the poisonous liquid that some snakes, spiders, etc. produce when they bite or sting you
<b>Bliss</b>	perfect happiness or enjoyment
<b>Luminous</b>	shining in the dark; giving out light

<b>Retract</b>	to refuse to keep an agreement, a promise, etc
<b>Petty</b>	small and insignificant
<b>Assume</b>	to suppose to be true, especially without proof
<b>Condemn</b>	to express strong disapproval of something or someone,
<b>Mourn</b>	to feel or express deep sorrow or grief
<b>Bind</b>	to tie somebody/something with rope, string, etc
<b>Hypothesis</b>	a proposed explanation or theory that is studied through scientific testing
<b>Warm</b>	showing affection, kindness, or enthusiasm
<b>Enormous</b>	Extremely large in size, quantity, or extent
<b>Antique</b>	old and often valuable
