

1.Convulse:- to shake violently

Mnemonics:- pulse upar neeche hone lagi air
body convulse Karen lagi

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- shake, shudder, jerk

Antonyms:- Calm, Soothe, Quiet

Eg:- During the seizure, the man's muscles tightened, and his body began to convulse back and forth.

2.Flounder:- to act clumsily or confused

Mnemonics:- fumble / flow flow me flounder

Synonyms:- Fumble, Lurch, Muddle

Antonyms:- Idle, Do well, Succeed

Eg:- He floundered during the speech and forgot what he was talking about.



3.Complacent:- too satisfied with yourself or with a situation

Mnemonics:- placement hone ke baad ho complacent ho gyi.

Aman Sir English

Antonyms:- Contended, Pleased, Satisfied

Synonyms:- Unhappy, Discontent, Unsure

Eg:- She became complacent after getting placed at TCS and stopped preparing for government jobs.



4. Derisory:- ridiculously small or inadequate

Mnemonics:- dairy hain inki bhut saari fir dete hain derisory donation Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Laughable, Scornful, Disrespectful

Antonyms:- Flattering, Praising, Polite

Eg:- They donated a derisory amount for the cancer patients although they are very rich.



5.Defuse:- to stop a possibly dangerous or difficult situation from developing

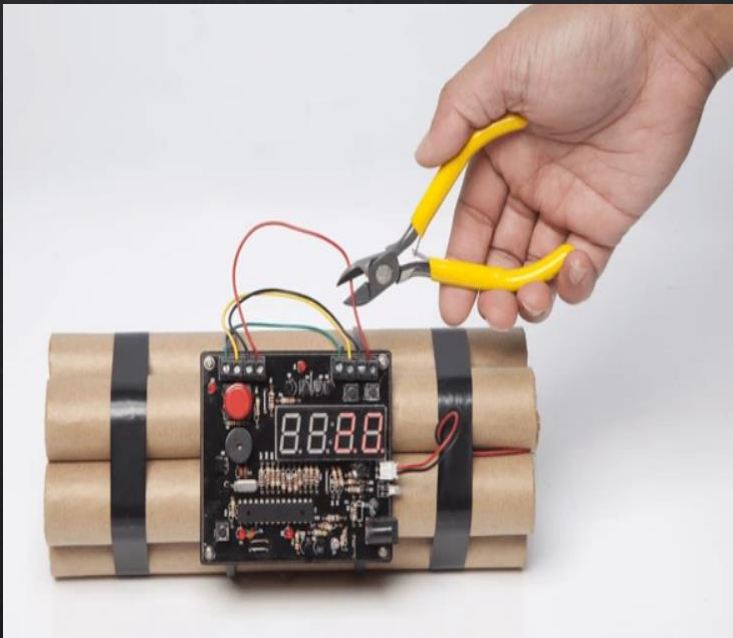
Mnemonics:- bomb ko defuse kar diya gaya

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Disarm, Deactivate, Lessen

Antonyms:- Increase, Agitate, Aid

Eg:- The bomb team was able to remove the explosive and defuse the dangerous situation before anyone was hurt.



6.Transpire:- to occur or take place / get revealed

Mnemonics:- You need fire inside you to transpire you aim

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Arise, Develop, Ensurue

Antonyms:- Cause, Stop, Barricade

Eg:- I will be meeting him tomorrow, let's see what transpires.

7. Infraction:- a violation of the rules

Mnemonics:- rules ko fracture karna / rules ke fractions kar dena

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Breach, Infringement, Crime

Antonyms:- Kindness, Obedience

Eg.:- He was fined for the infraction of traffic rules.



8. Aggrandizement:- an increase in power, importance, or reputation

Mnemonics:- uske grandfather ne grand level pe paisa aggrandize kar rakha hai

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Amplification, Augment, Boost

Antonyms:- Compression, Decline, Reduction

Eg.:- He does not give any money in charity
his main aim is personal aggrandizement.

9.Mobilize:- Prepare and organize troops for some operation

Mnemonics:- mob ko shant karne ke liye troops ko mobilise kiya gya Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Assemble, Organize, Gather

Antonyms:- Discourage, Disperse, Retard

Eg.:- The commander was able to mobilize the troops and send the group into the battle field.

10. Gibbous:- (of the moon) with the bright part bigger than a semicircle and smaller than a circle

Mnemonics:- G ke aakaar ka moon



Synonyms:- Asymmetrical, Awry, Crooked

Antonyms:- Even, Straight, Symmetrical

Eg.:- The large, gibbous moon illuminated the night sky with only a small sliver missing.

11.Torment:- extreme pain, especially mental pain

Mnemonics:- toe + bent / trauma/ torture

Synonyms:- Affliction, Agony, Anguish

Antonyms:- Cheer, Comfort, Pleasure

Eg.:- She suffered years of mental torment caused by her cruel husband.

12. Peerless:- better than all others of its kind

Mnemonics:- peerless performance ho to harne ke dar
se ho jaoge fearless

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Best, Faultless, Unmatched

Antonyms:- Inferior, Lowly, Mediocre

Eg.:- The peerless boxer never loses a fight.

13. Endearment:- a word or an expression that is used to show love

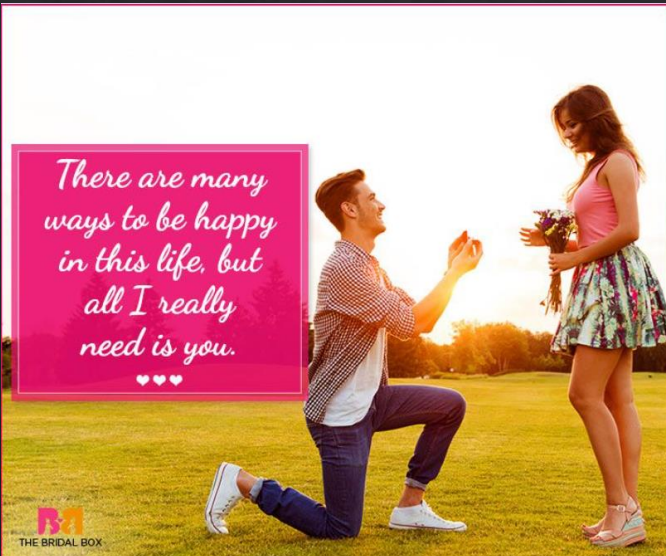
Mnemonics:- apne dear one ke liye karte hain endearment

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Affection, Fondness, Love

Antonyms:- Dislike, Hate, Hatred

Eg.:- When Babloo told Tanvi he loved her, he hoped she would respond with some type of endearment.



14.Forbearance:- the quality of being patient and kind towards other people, especially when they have done something wrong

Mnemonics:- staff galti kare fir bhi bear karna = forbearance dikhana

Synonyms:- Fortitude, Abstinence, Endurance

Antonyms:- Agitation, Impatience, Pursual

Eg.:- You should be grateful for the cooperation and forbearance of the boss after all your mistakes.



15.Smother:- to kill somebody by covering their face so that they cannot breathe

Mnemonics:- mouth +cover karke mar dena

Synonyms:- Choke, Douse, Suppress

Antonyms:- Encourage, Disperse, Release

Eg.:- He smothered his friend with a pillow.



16. Magniloquent:- using high-sounding, boastful language

root word :- magnus (big) + loqui (to speak)

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Boastful, Bombastic, Pompous

Antonyms:- Humble, Modest, Deprecating

Eg.:- He spoke in a magniloquent manner, drawing attention to himself.

17.Dynamic:- having a lot of energy and a strong personality

Mnemonics:- energetic like a dynamite

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Charismatic, Compelling, Effective

Antonyms:- Idle, Lazy, Incapable

Eg.:- He is a very dynamic actor and always performs with full energy.

18.Oratory:- the skill of making powerful and effective speeches in public

Mnemonics:- teacher , leader, preacher ye sab aksar ache orator hote hain Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Eloquence, Rhetoric, Diction

Antonyms:- Inability, Quiet

Eg.:- The crowd was held spellbound by her oratory.



19. Patron:- a person who gives money and support to artists and writers

Mnemonics:- patrons ki donation ki help se run
hoti hai artists ki NGO

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Benefactor, Philanthropist, Sponsor

Antonyms:- Antagonist, Opposer, Detractor

Eg.:- The patron donated great amount of wealth to
support local artists.



20.Reconnaissance:- the activity of getting information about an area for military purposes

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- re kon kon enemy hai wha sense karo

Synonyms:- Inspection, Exploration, Survey

Antonyms:- Neglect, Ignorance, Carelessness

Eg.:- Our government often sends reconnaissance drones into other countries to assess possible threats.

21.Replica:- An exact copy

Mnemonics:- replicate = duplicate

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Clone, Duplicate, Facsimile

Antonyms:- Original, Different

Eg.:- An artist painted replica of the famous Mona lisa painting.



22.Sardonic:- displaying disrespect in a scornful way

Mnemonics:- sardaro pe sardonic joke marte hain kuch log

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Acerbic, Caustic, Derisive

Antonyms:- Mild, Nice, Modest

Eg.:- The criminal had a sardonic smile on his face when he shot at the police officer.



23.Frolic:- to play and move around in a lively, happy way

Mnemonics:- friends ke sath picnic

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Amusement, Play, Spree

Antonyms:- Sadness, Seriousness, Work

Eg.:- It's fun to watch the playful children frolic in the garden.



24.Lowbrow:- having no connection with or interest in serious artistic or cultural ideas

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- the intellect level in this movie is low bro

Synonyms:- Uncultured, Banal, Ordinary

Antonyms:- Highbrow, Cultured, Educated

Eg.:- Many directors make only lowbrow movies these days .

25.Truancy:- skipping school without valid reason

Mnemonics:- truant student turant school se bhag jate hai

Synonyms:- Skipping, Hooky, Absence

Antonyms:- Attendance, Presence

Eg.:- My broher's truancy was discovered when my parents found him in a garden instead of his class.



26. Maleficent:- harmful or evil in intent or effect

root word :- mal (bad) + facto (to do)



Synonyms:- Corrupt, Destructive, Offensive

Antonyms:- Aiding, Agreeable, Friendly

Eg.:- She made a maleficent plan to kill her enemy and his family.

27.Bounty:- money given as reward

Mnemonics:- big amount to catch a criminal



Synonyms:- Bonus, Reward, Gratuity

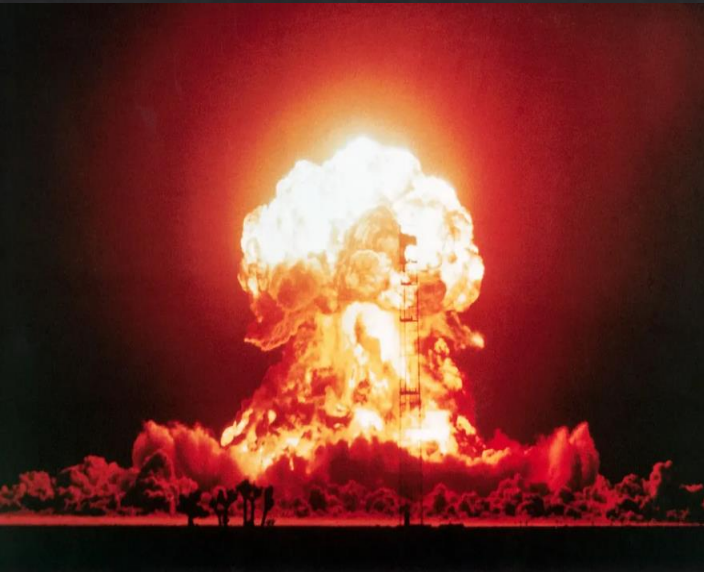
Antonyms:- Penalty, Punishment

Eg.:- A bounty hunter is a person who catches or kills criminals for reward.

28.Holocaust:- a situation in which many things are destroyed and many people killed, especially because of a war or a fire

Aman Sir English

Mnemonics:- Hiroshima bomblast created a holocaust



Synonyms:- Immolation, Inferno, Disaster

Antonyms:- Advantage, Fortune, Joy

Eg.:- The Hiroshima nuclear blast was a holocaust that killed lakhs of people.

29.Opportune:- (of time) at a useful or convenient moment

Mnemonics:- opportunity

WAIT TO LIFT THE CURSE

Synonyms:- Favorable, Convenient, Felicitous

Antonyms:- Adverse, Untimely, Inappropriate

Eg.:- This monetary help arrived at an opportune time.

30.Lopsided:- having one side lower, smaller, etc. than the other

Mnemonics:- less on one side

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Unbalanced, Unequal, Askew

Antonyms:- Balanced, Even, Level

Eg.:- Her face was lopsided so she went through a surgery to correct it.



31.Retrograde:- making a situation worse or returning to how something was in the past

Root word:- retro (past, old) + grade (condition)

Synonyms:- Declining, Reverting, Deteriorating

Antonyms:- Forward, Positive, Alleviating

Eg.:- Ranu modal went through a retrograde and went back to her miserable life.



32.Palatable:- having a pleasant or acceptable taste

Mnemonics:- plate me whi dalunga jo palatable hoga

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Enjoyable, Tempting, Toothsome

Antonyms:- Disagreeable, Repulsive, Untasty

Eg.:- Restaurants should serve palatable food but it must be hygienic also.



33.Dogmatic:- being certain that your beliefs are right and that others should accept them

Mnemonics:- ziidi like a dog

Synonyms:- Arbitrary, Arrogant, Assertive

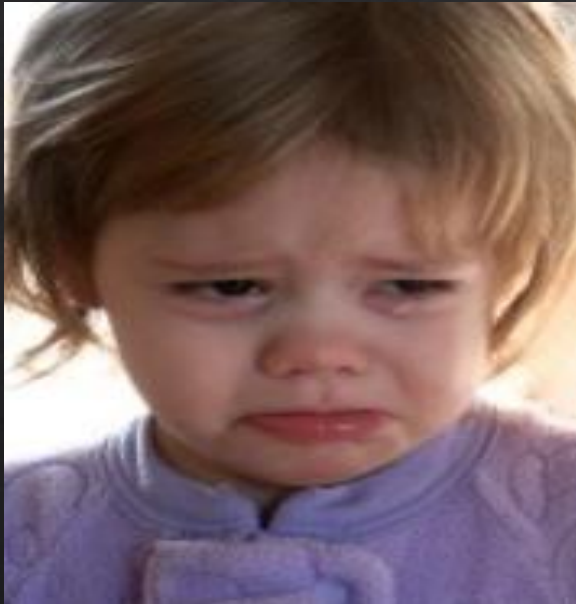
Antonyms:- Equivocal, Impartial, Willing

Eg.:- The preacher was a dogmatic individual who was quick to argue with anyone who challenged his opinion.



34.Sob:- to cry noisily, taking sudden, sharp breaths

Mnemonics:- subkiyan leke rona



Synonyms:- Lament, Weep, Wail

Antonyms:- Gloat, Praise, Be happy

Eg.:- Spoiled toddlers often sob when he doesn't get what he wants.

35.Errant:- Behaving wrongly or disobediently

Mnemonics:- ye rent pe rehne wala ladka errant manner me
behave karta hai

Aman Sir English

Synonyms:- Unruly, Delinquent, Straying

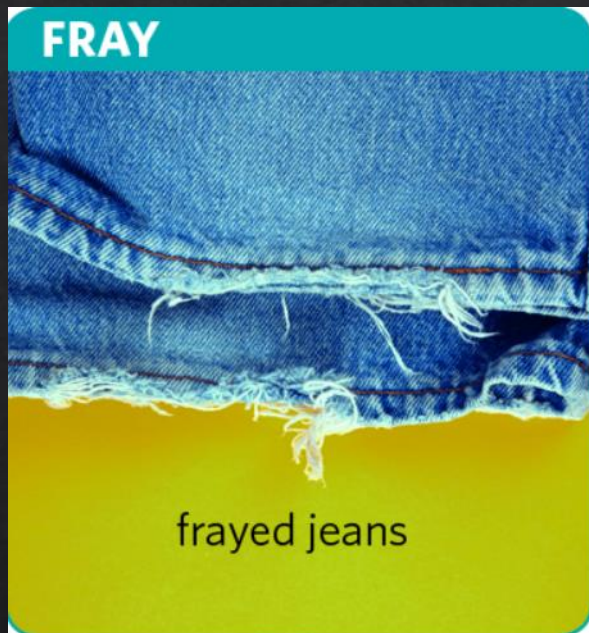
Antonyms:- Compliant, Disciplined, Conforming

Eg:- The errant tenant was fighting and misbehaving
with the landlord.



36.Frayed:- Something that is strained or exhausted

Mnemonics:- jeans kitni frayed hai ab kya bilkul fatne ka wait kar rhe ho



Synonyms:- Tattered, Ragged, Shabby

Antonyms:- Unspoiled, Pristine, Immaculate

Eg:- You should throw these frayed jeans and buy new ones.

37. Retributive:- Something related to act of seeking revenge

Mnemonics:- re tere karmo ki saza bhugat

Synonyms:- Vengeful, Punitive, Vindictive

Antonyms:- Merciful, Pardoning, Benevolent

Eg:- The retributive action taken by the mother showed how much she loved her daughter.



38.Capricious:- showing sudden changes in attitude or behaviour

Mnemonics:- kapdon se jaldi mood change hota hai uska

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Arbitrary, Careless, Flighty

Antonyms:- Cautious, Reliable, Steady

Eg:- She is very capricious and hard to please.

39.Candour:- the quality of saying what you think openly and honestly

Mnemonics:- candid



Synonyms:- Candid, Frankness, Probity

Antonyms:- Deceit, Lying, Dishonesty

Eg:- 'I don't like other stars,' he said in a rare moment of candour.

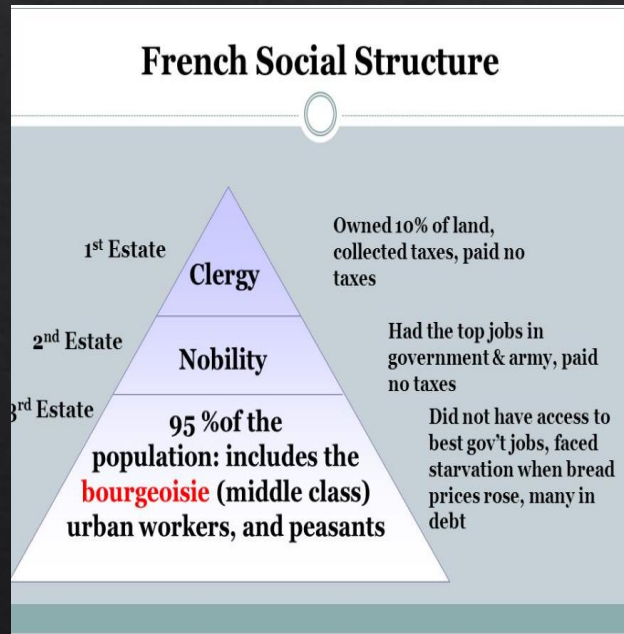
40.Bourgeois:- a person who belongs to the middle class
