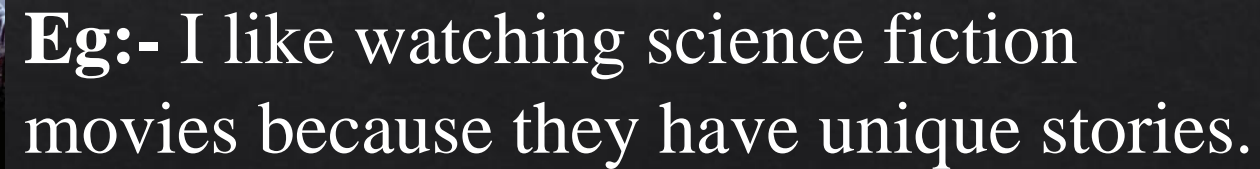


## 1.Fiction:- something that is imaginary or not real

# Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** science fiction movies ki ho gyi addiction



**2.Covet:-** to greatly desire something you lack

**Mnemonics:-** kuwait ke prince ki life ko sab covet karte hain

**Synonyms:-** Crave, Envy, Fancy

**Antonyms:-** Dislike, Hate, Abjure

**Eg:-** I covet the luxurious life of kuwait prince who has so many luxurious cars and houses.



### **3.Shove:-** to roughly push

**Mnemonics:-** shove the shoes in suitcase

**Synonyms:-** Cram, Dig, Nudge

**Antonyms:-** Discourage, Dissuade, Hinder

**Eg:-** He tried to shove all the shoes in his suitcase.

**4.Lofty:-** great and worthy of praise

**Mnemonics:-** loft jaise height pe hoti hai waise high  
moral wala person

**Synonyms:-** Exalted, Utopian, Noble

**Antonyms:-** Below, Beneath, Low

**Eg:-** He is a lofty person. He is will not  
pass this illegal project.

## 5. Tumult:- confusion or disorder

**Mnemonics:-** tu tu main main

**Synonyms:-** Convulsion, Disturbance, Upheaval

**Antonyms:-** Agreement, Calm, Harmony

**Eg:-** There was a state of tumult between those boys when they came to know they both are in relationship with the same girl.



**6.Despise:-** to dislike and have no respect for somebody

**Mnemonics:-** Tu desi peeta hai tbhi sab tuje despise karte hain

**Synonyms:-** Abhor, Deride, Scorn

**Antonyms:-** Praise, Adore, Cherish

**Eg:-** I despise him because he is always drunk.

**7.Fasten:-** to join together or to attach

**Mnemonics:-** fasa dena hook mein

**Synonyms:-** Affix, Attach, Tighten

**Antonyms:-** Detach, Disjoin, Loosen

**Eg:-** She is trying to fasten her seat belt.

**8.Wrench:-** to pull or twist something away violently

**Mnemonics:-** pipe wrench

**Synonyms:-** Dislocate, Bend, Distort

**Antonyms:-** Deter, Untwist, Straighten

**Eg:-** The plumber used a pipe wrench to tighten the pipe.



**9.Gaudy:-** too brightly coloured in a way that looks cheap and of low-quality

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** ye bright colour ki gadi badi gaudy hai



**Synonyms:-** Flashy, Jazzy, Showy

**Antonyms:-** Modest, Refined, Dull

**Eg:-** This car looks very gaudy. It is not suitable for a corporate employee like you.

**10. Flabbergasted:-** extremely surprised and amazed

**Mnemonics:-** babbar sher ko ghas khate dekh kar hum  
flabbergasted ho gye

**Synonyms:-** Astonished, Awed, Baffled

**Antonyms:-** Aware, oriented, Understanding

**Eg:-** we were flabbergasted by the sight of  
a lion eating grass.



**11. Ubiquitous:-** seeming to be everywhere or in several places at the same time; very common

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** mosquitoes are ubiquitous



**Synonyms:-** Omnipresent, Universal, Pervasive

**Antonyms:-** Rare, Scarce

**Eg:-** Mosquitoes are ubiquitous and they transmit a lot of diseases.



**12.Chaste:-** not showing sexual feelings, pure in thought

**Mnemonics:-** jo chaste hote hai ho ladkiyo ko chase nhi karte

**Synonyms:-** Celibate, Platonic, Subdued

**Antonyms:-** Corrupt, Defiled, Dirty

**Eg:-** The priest took an oath to avoid impure temptations in order to remain chaste.

**13.Prevaricate:-** to avoid giving a direct answer to a question in order to hide the truth

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** prevent verification



**Synonyms:-** Falsify, Cheat, Distort

**Antonyms:-** Accept, Face, Confront

**Eg:-** When she asked him about the girl he tried to prevaricate

**14.Suave:-** confident , elegant and charming man

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** smart like dev



**Synonyms:-** Affable, Urbane, Charming

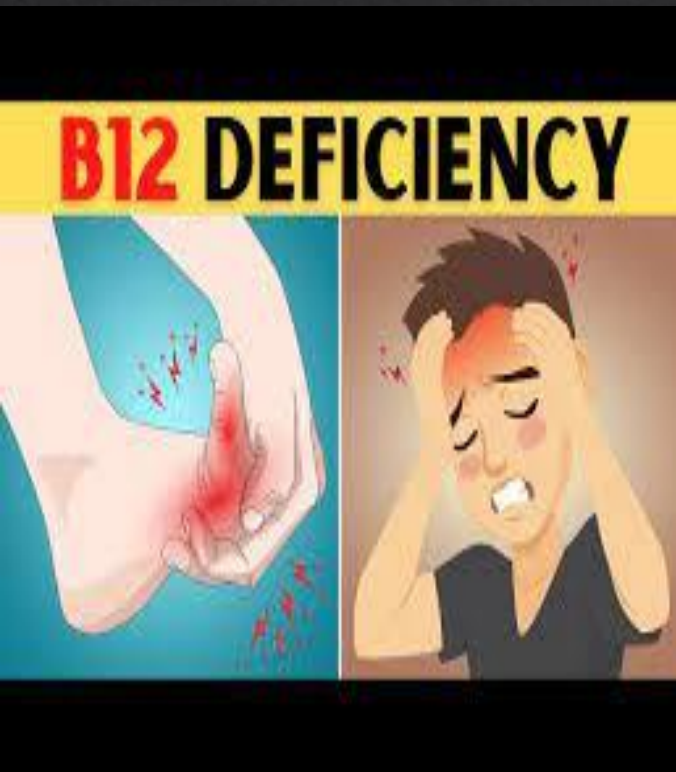
**Antonyms:-** Uncivil, Rude, Unfriendly

**Eg.:-** It was easy for the suave detective to get the female suspect to confess.



## 15. Deficiency:- a lack of something needed

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Dearth, Defect, Flaw

**Antonyms:-** Abundance, Advantage, Enough

**Eg:-** Because he has a vitamin deficiency, the patient was given tablets for replacing the missing minerals.

**16.Quibble:-** to quarrel about minor matters

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** quarrel over small issue



**Synonyms:-** Criticise, Argue, Vituperate

**Antonyms:-** Praise, Agree, Concur

**Eg:-** It is normal for married couples to quibble over small things like who controls the television remote.

**17.Muster:-** to gather or collect something

**Mnemonics:-** master ji subh students ko prayer ke muster karte hain



**Synonyms:-** Assemblage, Collection, Company

**Antonyms:-** Division, Separation, Bufurcation

**Eg:-** Students are required to muster in the playground for morning assembly.



**18.Revive:-** to return to a healthy condition

**Mnemonics:-** revive woolen kapdo ko revive kr deta hai

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Energize, Invigorate, Overcome

**Antonyms:-** Damage, Depress, Weaken

**Eg:-** This new liquid for washing will revive the woolen fabric.

**19. Depredation:-** damage or destruction

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** destruction



**Synonyms:-** Devastation, Plunder, Spoliation

**Antonyms:-** Boon, Construction, Miracle

**Eg:-** The bomb blast caused severe depredation of the building.

**20.Menace:-** an individual or situation that causes problems/damage

**Mnemonics:-** men breaking ice

**Synonyms:-** Danger, Hazard, Peril

**Antonyms:-** Safety, Comfort, Delight

**Eg:-** They keep doing activities that are menace to the neighbours and environment.



**21. Vanity:-** excessive pride in or admiration of one's own abilities, appearance or achievements

**Mnemonics:-** costly van kharidne ke baad usme vanity as gyi



**Synonyms:-** Arrogance, Pride, Affectation

**Antonyms:-** Humility, Modesty, Mildness

**Eg:-** Since he bought that costly van , the vanity in his behaviour is very apparent.

**22.Ferocious:-** very aggressive or violent

**Mnemonics:-** furious

**Synonyms:-** Dangerous, Barbaric, Cruel

**Antonyms:-** Calm, Affable, Gentle

**Eg:-** Lions are ferocious by nature and very difficult to tame.

**23. Ignite:-** to start the fire or burning something

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** night ke time hum diye ko ignite krte hain



**Synonyms:-** Inflammation, Kindle, Flare up

**Antonyms:-** Cool, Extinguish, Quench

**Eg:-** Nothing is visible here so please ignite a lamp.



**24.Usurp:-** to take a position or power illegally by force

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** usne president ko usurp kar dia



**Synonyms:-** Annex, Assume, Displace

**Antonyms:-** Offer, Refuse, Relinquish

**Eg:-** Democratically elected representatives should not be usurped by terrorists.

**25. Abysmal:-** extremely bad or of a very low standard

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** very small and bad score



**Synonyms:-** Depthless, Bottomless, Immeasure

**Antonyms:-** Superb, Splendid

**Eg:-** Since Troy did not study for the test, he earned an abysmal score on the exam.

**26.Arable:-** Land suitable for growing crops

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** arab areas ki land arable nhi hai

## Arable land



**Synonyms:-** Fertile, Farmable

**Antonyms:-** Barren, Infertile

**Eg:-** The soil in the front yard is arable and perfect for planting a rose garden.



**27.Battered:-** attacked violently or repeatedly and injured

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** bat se battered kiya

**WIFE BEATS HUSBAND WITH  
CRICKET BAT, WATCH**



**Synonyms:-** Damaged, Destroyed, Deteriorated

**Antonyms:-** Healthy, Intact, Fit

**Eg:-** The abusive man swore that he didn't batter his wife, but her black eye and busted lip told a different story.

**28.Crabby:-** angry and irritable

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** cab driver crabby hote hain



**Synonyms:-** Quarrelsome, Irritable, Blunt

**Antonyms:-** Amiable, Pleasant, Friendly

**Eg:-** The cab driver was crabby because of the traffic jam.

**29.Doltish:-** very stupid or foolish

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** mature age mein doll se khelne wale are doltish



**Synonyms:-** Foolish, Insane, Inane

**Antonyms:-** Intelligent, Smart

**Eg:-** She is 21 years old and still fighting with sister over a doll , isn't it doltish?



**30.Evince:-** to show clearly that you have a feeling or quality

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** sounds like evidence means to show clearly



**Synonyms:-** Declare, Manifest, Display

**Antonyms:-** Hide, Conceal, Cover

**Eg:-** She evinced that she loves Rahul  
but he ignored her.

**31.Heinous** :- morally very bad

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** haivaniyat



**Synonyms:-** Abhorrent, Abominable, Hateful

**Antonyms:-** Delightful, Kind, Wonderful

**Eg:-** The criminal received the death penalty for his heinous crime.

**32.Haggle:-** bargain / negotiate to reach a deal

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** hum agli dukan se le lenge nhi to



**Synonyms:-** Bargain, Negotiate, Barter

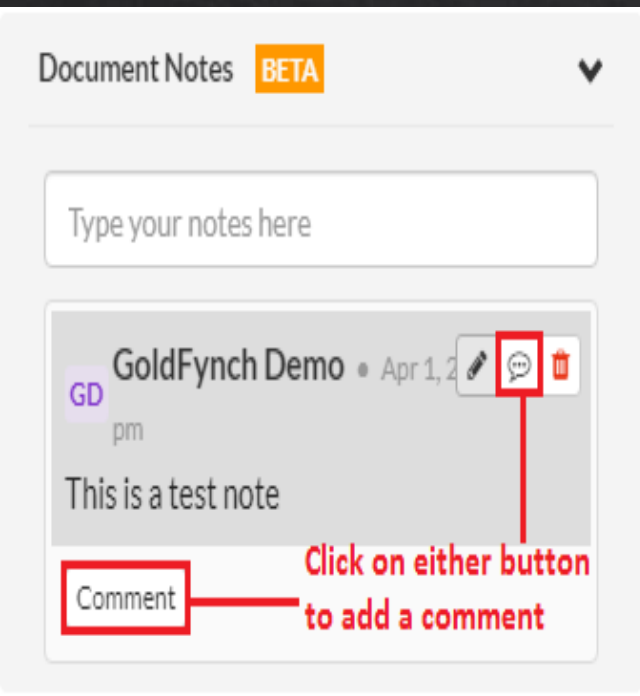
**Antonyms:-** Agree, Comply

**Eg:-** I'll pay the sticker price because I do not want to haggle with the trader.



**33. Interpolate:-** to add something to a piece of writing

**Mnemonics:-** inter + put



**Synonyms:-** Insert, Admit, Annex

**Antonyms:-** Erase, Exclude, Subtract

**Eg:-** Since the author would often interpolate the stories of others by adding his own text, the critics did not view him as a real writer.

**34.Moribund** :- at dying stage /no longer effective

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** mar jana / saans band ho jana



**Synonyms:-** Dying, Decaying, Weakening

**Antonyms:-** Creating, Permanent, Reviving

**Eg:-** Because the wounded man has lost a great deal of blood, he is moribund and probably will not make it through the night.

**35.Multitude:-** an extremely large number of things

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** multiple cheezein



**Synonyms:-** Mass, Legion, Horde

**Antonyms:-** Minority, Little, Portion

**Eg:-** A multitude of people lined up to watch their favorite celebrities walk into the movie premiere.



## 36. Mammoth :- very large in size

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Colossal, Huge, Elephantine

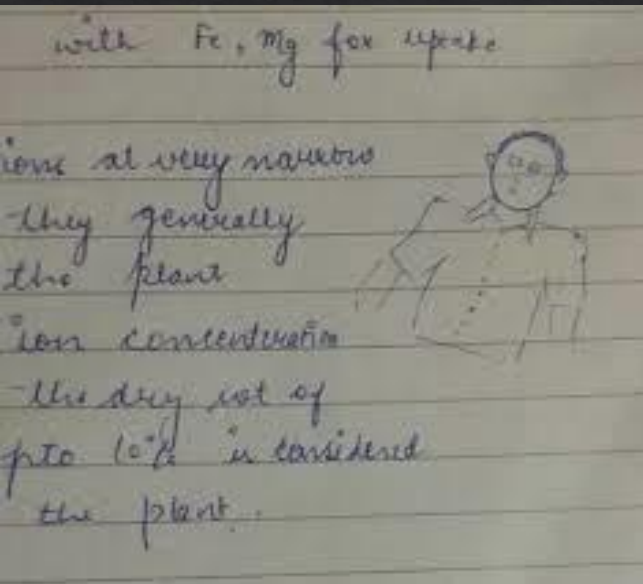
**Antonyms:-** Miniature, Short, Miniscule

**Eg:-** They are building a mammoth sized statue of their favourite movie star.

**37. Nugatory** :- Useless / Having no purpose or value

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** not necessary



**Synonyms:-** Barren, Worthless, Useless

**Antonyms:-** Effective, Fruitful, Important

**Eg:-** My son keeps on making nugatory drawings in my note book.

**38.Occult:-** relating to magical or supernatural abilities

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** cult ke log occult practice karte hain



**Synonyms:-** Supernatural, Mystical, Magical

**Antonyms:-** Bare, Clear, Obvious

**Eg:-** It is believed that he performs some occult practices at night near the cemetery.



**39.Probity** :- the quality of being completely honest

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** truthfulness ki 100 % probability



**Synonyms:-** Honesty, Virtue, Rectitude

**Antonyms:-** Corruption, Dishonesty, Deceit

**Eg:-** The person who returned the lost necklace to the police showed a great deal of probity.

**40.Paltry:-** too small to be considered as important or useful

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** party me cake paltry tha



**Synonyms:-** Meager, Measly, Trivial

**Antonyms:-** Significant, Plenty, Worthwhile

**Eg:-** Only paltry amount of cake was available at the party.
