

Berserk :- out of control with high emotions; wild
(पागलों की तरह उग्र या बेकाबू हो जाना)

Mnemonics :- be sarak gya hai



Synonyms:- Frenzied, Crazy, Unhinged

Antonyms:- Tranquil, Peaceful, Serene

E.g.:- He received a perfect score and the crowd went berserk.

Deplorable :- very bad and unacceptable (ऐसा काम या हालत जो बहुत खराब हो और जिसकी निंदा की जाए)

Mnemonics :-dustbin ke floor pe sone se jada deplorable aur kya hoga.

Synonyms:- abhorrent , horrible , disgusting

Antonyms:- Admirable, Commendable, Praiseworthy

E.g.:- They are forced to live in deplorable conditions.



Pugnacious :- ready to fight or to argue very forcefully (लड़ाकू स्वभाव का, झगड़ालू)

Mnemonics :- dono pugs bhut pugnacious the



Synonyms:- Combative, Aggressive, Belligerent

Antonyms:- Calm, Agreeable, Amiable

E.g.:- His pugnacious attitude often led to arguments, even over trivial matters.

Overstrung :- (of a person) extremely nervous or Stressed.
(बहुत ज्यादा तनावग्रस्त या भावनात्मक रूप से चिड़चिड़ा)

Mnemonics :- jiski strings jada kheech hui hon

Synonyms:- anxious, Apprehensive, Nervous

Antonyms:- Calm, Composed, Tranquil

E.g.:- She was overstrung before her dance performance.

Consort :- a partner or associate with whom one shares something
(साथी या जीवनसाथी)

Mnemonics :- kon sath / concert jate hain consort ke sath



Synonyms:- Companion, Spouse, Associate

Antonyms:- Opponent, Enemy, Rival

E.g.:- The criminal forced his wife to be his consort in crime.

Acquiesce :- to accept something reluctantly but without protest. (चुपचाप मान जाना)

Mnemonics :- ek question tak nhi pucha aur order maan liya



Synonyms:- Accede, Comply, Concur

Antonyms:- Reject, Refuse, Oppose

E.g.:- The employees acquiesced to the new policies, although they were not entirely happy about them.

Mellifluous :- a sound that is sweet, smooth, and pleasant to hear. (बहुत मधुर और मीठी आवाज वाला)

Root Word :- melody + flow



Synonyms:- Melodious, Harmonious, Lyrical

Antonyms:- Harsh, Grating, Cacophonous

E.g.:- Her mellifluous voice captivated the audience, leaving them spellbound.

Respite :- refers to a short period of rest, relief, or delay from something difficult or unpleasant. (थोड़ा आराम या राहत का समय)

Mnemonics :- garmi se respite ke liye pee li sprite



Synonyms:- Intermission, Rest, Relief

Antonyms:- Continuation, Endurance, Perseverance

E.g.:- The workers were granted a brief respite from their demanding schedule.

Garnish :- to enhance or improve, especially in a decorative way (सजाना या सजावट करना (खासकर खाने को))

Mnemonics :- Green dhaniya garnish ke kaam mein liya jata hai



Synonyms:- Decorate, Adorn, Ornament

Antonyms:- Strip, Disfigure, Deface

E.g.:- Grated cheese and fancy pieces of tomato were used to garnish the salad bowl.

Fallacy :- an idea or belief that is false but many people think is true (गलत धारणा या भ्रम)

Mnemonics :- false belief



Synonyms:- Misconception, Error, Misbelief

Antonyms:- Truth, Fact, Reality

E.g.:- The notion that the camera never lies is a fallacy.

Beseech :- to ask someone for something in an urgent and sincere way (बिन्ती करना, गिड़गिड़ाकर अनुरोध करना)

Mnemonics :- beekh ki tarah request



Synonyms:- Beg, Plead, Implore

Antonyms:- Refuse, Reject, Dismiss

E.g.:- She beseeched him to reconsider his decision, hoping he would change his mind.

Miraculous :- astounding in a way that suggests a miracle (चमत्कारी, अद्भुत)

Mnemonics :- miracle



Synonyms:- Marvelous, Incredible, Supernatural

Antonyms:- Ordinary, Commonplace, Expected

E.g.:- The doctors described his recovery from the accident as miraculous, as they hadn't expected him to survive.

Cherish :- to treasure or deeply care for something (बहुत प्यार से संभालकर रखना या मान देना)

Mnemonics :- cheer karna



Synonyms:- Treasure, Adore, Appreciate

Antonyms:- Disregard, Neglect, Abandon

E.g.:- He cherished the memories of his childhood spent with his family.

Immense :- refers to something that is extremely large, vast, or great in size, amount, or degree. (बहुत बड़ा, अत्यधिक विशाल)

Mnemonics :- uss immense statue ko dekh ke I was out of my senses



Synonyms:- Huge, Vast, Enormous

Antonyms:- Tiny, Minuscule, Petite

E.g.:- The museum was so immense it took us two days to make our way through it.

Obstinate :- who is stubbornly refusing to change their opinion or chosen course of action (जिद्दी)

Mnemonics :- obstinate bache nhi karte ghiya ko eat



Synonyms:- Stubborn, Inflexible, Unyielding

Antonyms:- Flexible, Compliant, Yielding

E.g.:- Despite the team's advice, he remained obstinate about his decision, unwilling to compromise.

Dodge :- to manage to avoid being caught (चकमा)



Synonyms:- Baffle, Confound, Elude

Antonyms:- Face, Confront, Meet

E.g.:- Ravi managed to dodge an extra shift today by pretending that he had to pick up his grandma from the hospital.

Evoke :- to bring a feeling, a memory or an image into your mind (जगाना या याद दिलाना)

Mnemonics :- awake some memories

Synonyms:- Elicit, Conjure, Recall

Antonyms:- Suppress, Ignore, Dismiss

E.g.:- The old song evoked memories of her childhood summers by the beach.

Grotesque :- extremely ugly and strange (बहुत अजीब या भद्दा)

Mnemonics :- goat man wala character grotesque tha



Synonyms:- Distorted, Bizarre, Monstrous

Antonyms:- Attractive, Beautiful, Pleasant

E.g.:- The horror film featured creatures with grotesque features that left the audience both terrified and fascinated.

Affiliated :- formally associated with a group or organization (जुड़ा हुआ या संबद्ध)

Mnemonics :- mera college MD university se affiliated tha



Synonyms:- Allied, Related, Partnered

Antonyms:- Independent, Unrelated, Separate

E.g.:- The research center is affiliated with the university, allowing students access to its resources.

Derogatory :- conveying a poor opinion of something or someone

Mnemonics :- tumhare jaise dhero mere gate pe roj aate hain



Synonyms:- Disparaging, Insulting, Belittling

Antonyms:- Appreciative, Praising, Positive

E.g.:- His derogatory remarks about her appearance were hurtful and unnecessary.

Carcass :- to the dead body of an animal, especially after it has been slaughtered or decayed. (मरा हुआ जानवर का शरीर)

Mnemonics :- car se crash hone ke baad dog ka carcass road par pada tha



Synonyms:- Remains, Cadaver, Skeleton

Antonyms:- Vitality, Beingm, Organism

E.g.:- The hunters found the carcass of the deer in the forest, left behind by predators.

Regime :- to a system or form of government, often one that is authoritarian or controlling. (शासन या सरकार का तरीका)

Mnemonics :- raja ka regime



Synonyms:- Government, Administration, Rule

Antonyms:- Anarchy, Disorder, Chaos

E.g.:- The country has been under a strict regime for several years, limiting civil liberties.

Iota :- to a very small amount or an extremely tiny quantity of something.

(ज़रा-सा भी, बहुत छोटा हिस्सा)

Mnemonics :- bhut chota

Synonyms:- Bit, Speck, Scrap

Antonyms:- Abundance, Plenty, Whole

E.g.:- He didn't show an iota of interest in the proposal.

Rejuvenate :- to make someone look or feel young and energetic again (फिर से जवान या ताज़ा बना देना)

Root Word :-juven (youthful)



Synonyms:- Revitalize, Refresh, Renew

Antonyms:- Weaken, Deteriorate, Damage

E.g.:- The football players consume sports drinks to rejuvenate themselves during the game.

Slack :- lack of activity, lazy or careless (ढीला या सुस्त)

Mnemonics :- lack of work



Synonyms:- Negligent, Lazy, Careless

Antonyms:- Tight, Taut, Diligent

E.g.:- The job is taking a long time because the workmen are so slack.

Munch :- to chew or crunch on food (चबाकर खाना)

Mnemonics :- munch ko munch karna



Synonyms:- Chew, Nibble, Crunch

Antonyms:- Sip, Drink, Swallow

E.g.:- She sat on the couch, happily munching on a bag of chips.

Debilitate :- to weaken or impair the strength or ability of someone or something. (कमजोर कर देना)

Root Word :- de + able



Synonyms:- Weaken, Enfeeble, Undermine

Antonyms:- Strengthen, Fortify, Empower

E.g.:- A quick punch to the throat will debilitate most attackers.

Brat :- to describe a child who behaves badly, is spoiled, or is difficult to manage. (शरारती या बिगड़ा हुआ बच्चा)

Mnemonics :- bad habit wala child



Synonyms:- Rascal, Spoiled child, Mischief-maker

Antonyms:- Polite child, Charmer, Saint

E.g.:- That little brat threw a tantrum when he didn't get the toy he wanted.

Shimmer :- to shine with a flickering or wavering light (हल्की चमक या झिलमिलाहट)

Mnemonics :- shine / cham cham



Synonyms:- Sparkle, Twinkle, Shine

Antonyms:- Dull, Fade, Disappear

E.g.:- The water shimmered under the moonlight, creating a beautiful reflection.

Leverage :- power to influence people and get the results you want: (अपने लाभ के लिए उपयोग करना।)

Mnemonics :- love marriage ke leverage



Synonyms:- Influence, Power, Advantage

Antonyms:- Weakness, Disadvantage, Powerlessness

E.g.:- If the United Nations had more troops in the area, it would have greater leverage

Abstain :- to limit oneself from doing or enjoying something (परहेज करना या दूर रहना)

Mnemonics :- ab stop



Synonyms:- Cease ,Forgo, Refrain

Antonyms:- Join, Participate, Involve

E.g.:- Because of my health, I am going to abstain from the consumption of alcoholic beverages.

Humdrum :- without excitement or variety; boring (उबाऊ, नीरस)

Mnemonics :- boring humming + drum



Synonyms:- Monotonous, Dull, Boring

Antonyms:- Exciting, Thrilling, Stimulating

E.g.:- His speech was so humdrum that half the audience fell asleep.

Harass:- to constantly bother or attack (परेशान करना या तंग करना)



Synonyms:- Bother, Persecute, Annoy

Antonyms:- Comfort, Support, Assist

E.g.:- She felt harassed by the constant phone calls demanding payment.

Toxic :- to something poisonous or harmful. (ज़हरीला या नुकसानदायक)



Synonyms:- Harmful, Noxious, Venomous

Antonyms:- Healthy, Beneficial, Nurturing

E.g.:- After drinking the toxic substance, the man's face ballooned to three times its normal size before he died.

Tremble :- to shake uncontrollably, usually from fear or excitement (काँपना या थरथराना)



Synonyms:- Shiver, Shudder, Wobble

Antonyms:- Steady, Stabilize, Calm

E.g.:- She began to tremble as she stepped onto the stage for her first performance.

Crux :- to the most important or central point of an issue, problem, or situation. (मुख्य बिंदु या सबसे जरूरी हिस्सा)



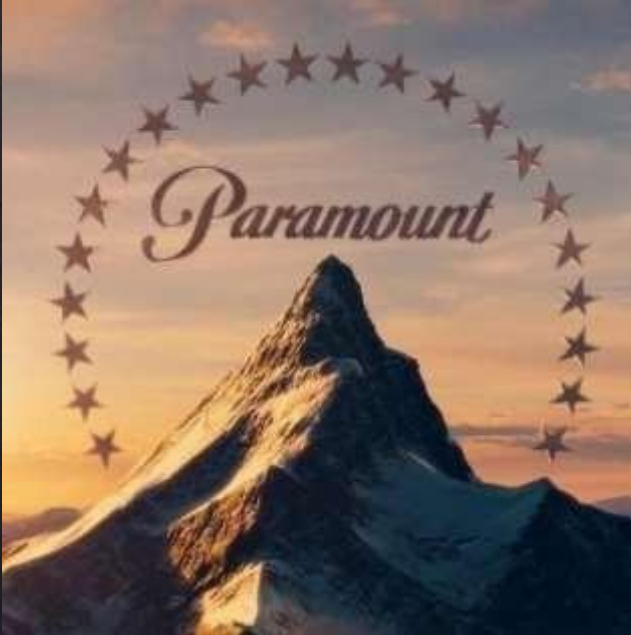
Synonyms:- Core, Essence,

Antonyms:- Fringe, Nonessential, Superficial

E.g.:- The crux of the debate was whether the new policy would actually improve the economy or harm it.

Paramount :- of the greatest concern /higher in rank, authority, more important than anything else. (सबसे महत्वपूर्ण, सर्वोपरि)

Mnemonics :- mount (mount everest)

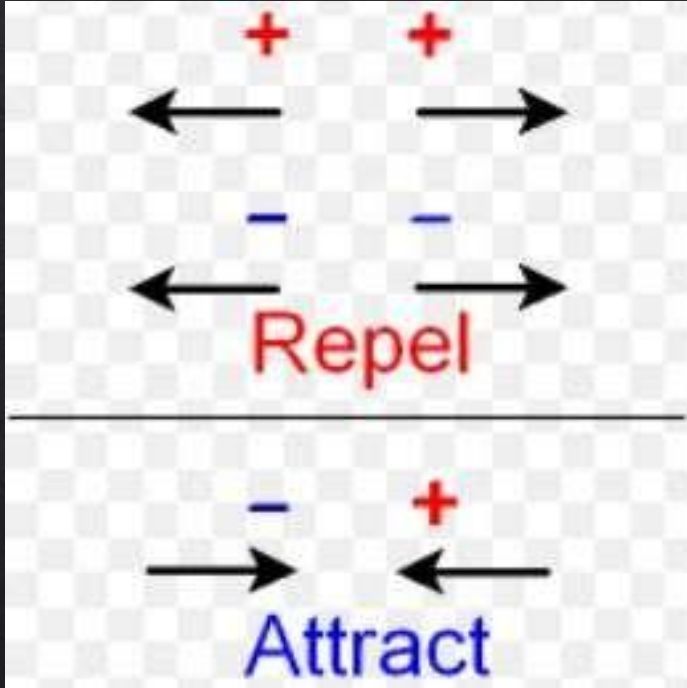


Synonyms:- Predominant, Preeminent, Ascendant

Antonyms:- Insignificant, Secondary, Minor

E.g.:- There are many priorities, but reducing the budget deficit is paramount.

Repulse :- to drive back or repel an attack or unwanted action.
(पीछे हटाना या घृणा पैदा करना)



Synonyms:- Reject, Repel, Disgust

Antonyms:- Attract, Welcome, Embrace

E.g.:- The army was able to **repulse** the enemy's attack and defend their position.

Bully :- a person who torments a weaker person (दादागिरी करने वाला व्यक्ति)



Synonyms:- Intimidator, Harasser, Oppressor

Antonyms:- Protector, Supporter, Ally

E.g.:- The bully at school kept picking on smaller kids during recess.

Forsake :- to give up or abandon (छोड़ देना या त्याग देना)



Synonyms:- Desert, Relinquish, Renounce

Antonyms:- Embrace, Support, Retain

E.g.:- He promised never to forsake his friends, no matter how difficult life became.

Tendency :- frequently having the inclination to do something (झुकाव या आदत)



Synonyms:- Inclination, Trend, Propensity

Antonyms:- Disinterest, Aversion, Indifference Aman Sir English

E.g.:- She has a tendency to overthink every decision, which sometimes causes unnecessary stress.

Decency :- to behavior that conforms to accepted standards of morality, ethics, or good manners. (अच्छा और सम्मानजनक व्यवहार करना)



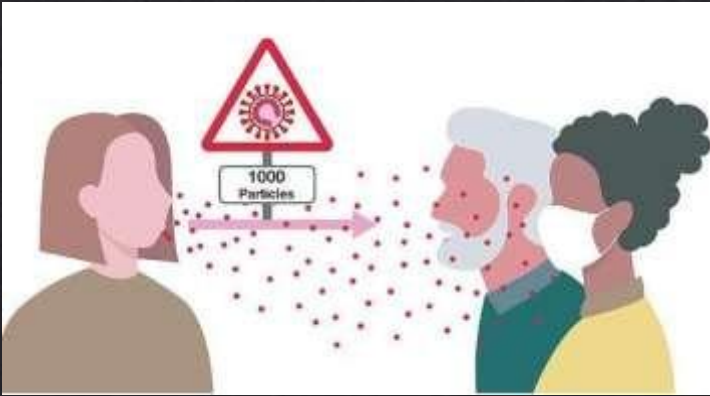
Synonyms:- Integrity, Honor, Virtue

Antonyms:- Indecency, Immorality, Rudeness

E.g.:- He treated everyone with decency and respect, regardless of their status.

Transmit :- to cause something to pass from one person or place to another (भेजना या पहुँचाना)



Synonyms:- Send, Transfer, Convey

Aman Sir English

Antonyms:- Receive, Block, Retain

E.g.:- The virus can be transmitted through close contact with an infected person.

Numerous :- a large quantity of something (बहुत सारे, अनेक)



Synonyms:- Abundant, Plentiful, Several

Antonyms:- Few, Scant, Sparse

E.g.:- The advantages of this system are too numerous to mention.

Chaos :- a state of confusion (अव्यवस्था, पूरी तरह की गड़बड़ी)



Synonyms:- Disorder, Confusion, Pandemonium

Antonyms:- Harmony, Peace, Calm

E.g.:- The sudden power outage caused chaos at the airport as passengers scrambled for information.

Testify :- to state what you witnessed or provide evidence to the court
(गवाही देना)



Synonyms:- Witness, Assert, Affirm

Antonyms:- Deny, Disprove, Oppose

E.g.:- The witness was nervous to testify about what she had seen during the robbery.

Breakthrough :- a sudden discovery or overcoming of an obstacle
(बड़ी सफलता या महत्वपूर्ण खोज)

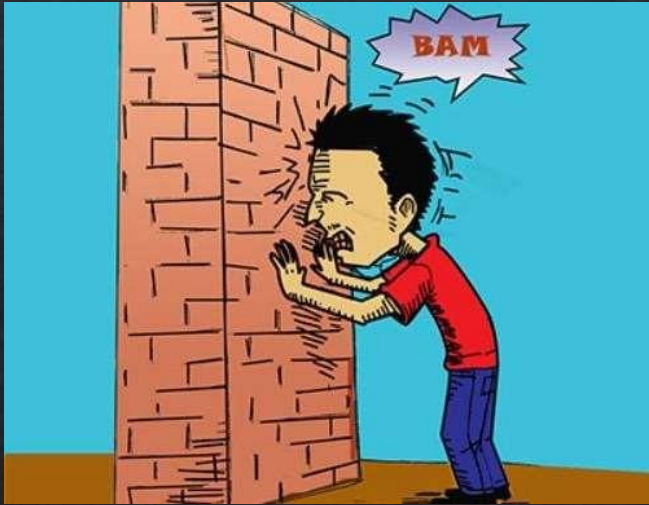


Synonyms:- Discovery, Advancement, Progress

Antonyms:- Setback, Stagnation, Regression

E.g.:- The discovery of antibiotics was a major breakthrough in medical science.

Bang :- To strike or hit something with a loud noise, or to make a sudden, loud sound. (टकराना)



Synonyms:- Crash, Clap, Beat

Antonyms:- Silence, Hush, Quiet

E.g.:- The door slammed with a loud bang, startling everyone in the room.
