

Depose:- remove someone from a post suddenly and forcefully. (पद से हटा देना)

Mnemonics :- de + position



Synonyms:- Remove, Displace, Oust

Antonyms:- Appoint, Elect, Inaugurate

E.g.:- She was deposed from her post by upsc.

Furtive:- behaving in a way that you want to hide something (चुपके से किया गया, छिपा हुआ)

Mnemonics :- fugitive ko furtive hona padta hai

Synonyms:- Secretive, stealthy, clandestine.

Antonyms:- Overt, obvious, transparent.

E.g.:- He made one or two furtive phone calls to his friend.

Dearth:- A scarcity or lack of something. (कमी या अभाव)

Mnemonics :-Hum chahte hain humare dear ones ko kisi cheez ki dearth na ho



Synonyms:- deficiency, paucity, insufficiency

Antonyms:- Abundance, surplus, plenty

E.g. The test scores revealed a dearth of comprehension.

Desecrate:- to treat a sacred place or object with disrespect (अपमान या नुकसान करना)

Mnemonics :- mandir me desi daru ya cigarette pina desecrate krana hua.

Synonyms:- Violate, defile, profane

Antonyms:- Honor, sanctify, consecrate

E.g. Vandals attempted to desecrate the ancient temple by spray-painting graffiti on its walls.

Tawdry:- Showy but cheap and of poor quality (दिखावटी और भद्दा)

Mnemonics :- towel dress of rakhi sawant



Synonyms:- Gaudy, flashy, tacky

Antonyms:- Elegant, refined, sophisticated.

E.g. The market was full of tawdry souvenirs, with brightly colored trinkets that were poorly made.

Upshot:- The final result or outcome of a process, event, or discussion.(अंतिम परिणाम या निष्कर्ष)

Mnemonics :-dhoni ke shot ne upshot india ke favour me kar dia



Synonyms:- Result, outcome, conclusion

Antonyms:- Cause, origin, beginning

E.g. The upshot of the investigation is that the police will not face any charges.

Contaminate:- to make something dirty, dangerous or less pure (गंदा या अशुद्ध कर देना)

Mnemonics :- contaminated water

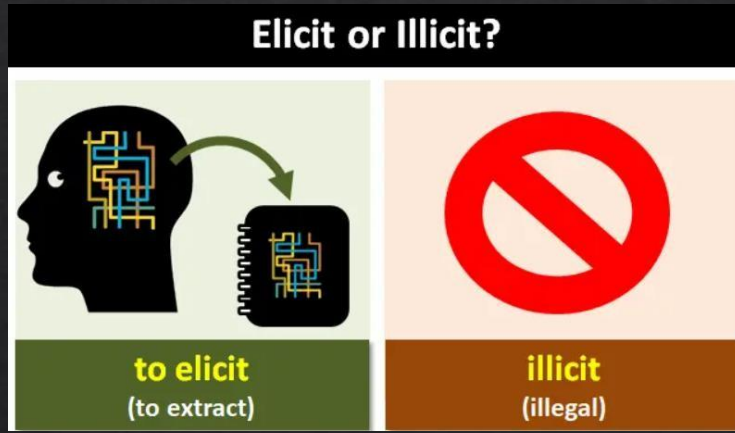
Synonyms:- Pollute, Spoil, Befoul

Antonyms:- Purify, Sanitize, Clean

E.g. If you touch the food with dirty hands, you might contaminate it with bacteria.

Illicit:- not approved by the law, illegal (गैरकानूनी या अवैध)

Mnemonics :- illegal



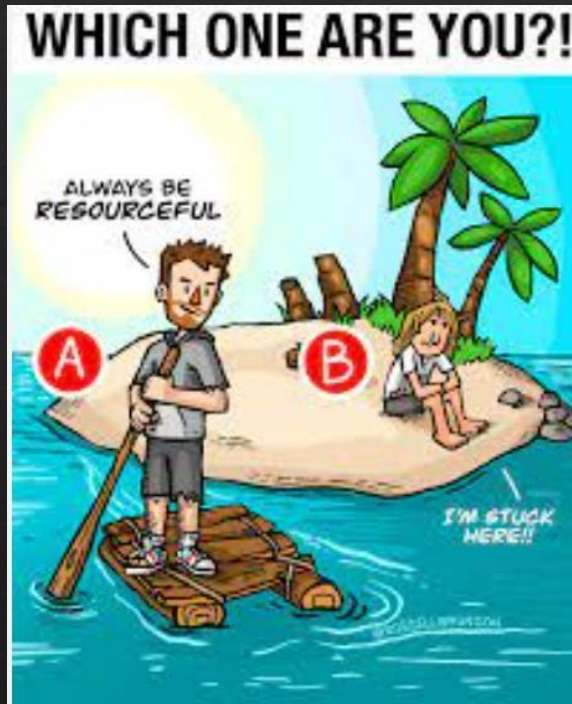
Synonyms:- illegal, unlawful, illegitimate,

Antonyms:- Lawful, Permitted, Legal

E.g. When the church elders found out about the minister's illicit affair, they asked him to resign from his position.

Resourceful:- good at finding ways of doing things and solving problems, etc. (सूझबूझ वाला, समझदारी से काम निकालने वाला)

Mnemonics :- full of resources (ways to get things done)



Synonyms:- Ingenious, Inventive, Versatile

Antonyms:- Incompetent, Clueless, Helpless

E.g. He is a very resourceful manager that is why the company doesn't want him to leave the job.

Alluring:- attractive and seductive in an enticing way (बहुत आकर्षक या लुभावना)

Mnemonics :- all boys want to give her a ring because she is alluring

Synonyms:- Enticing, Captivating, Seductive

Antonyms:- Repellent, Dull, Repulsive

E.g. The fragrance of the flowers was so alluring that it drew people into the garden.

Juvenile:- relating to a young person who is not yet old enough to be considered an adult (बच्चों जैसा)

Root words :- juven (youthful)



Synonyms:- Adolescent, Immature, Childish

Antonyms:- Mature, Dull, Sophisticated

E.g. The boys will be held at a juvenile facility because they are too young to be housed in an adult jail.

Deflate :- To let the air or gas out of something, causing it to collapse or shrink. (हवा निकाल देना)

Mnemonics :- flat tyre



Synonyms:- Collapse, Shrink, Diminish

Antonyms:- Inflate, Expand, Boost

E.g. After the balloon deflated, it lay flat on the ground.

Boisterous :- Noisy, energetic, and cheerful, (बहुत शोर मचाने वाला)

Mnemonics :- boys are boisterous during young age



Synonyms:- Loud, Energetic, Raucous

Antonyms:- Calm, Subdued, Mellow

E.g. The boisterous crowd at the concert made it hard to hear the music.

Vehement :- Showing strong feeling (बहुत ज़ोरदार/ जोशीला)

Mnemonics :- strong feelings like cement



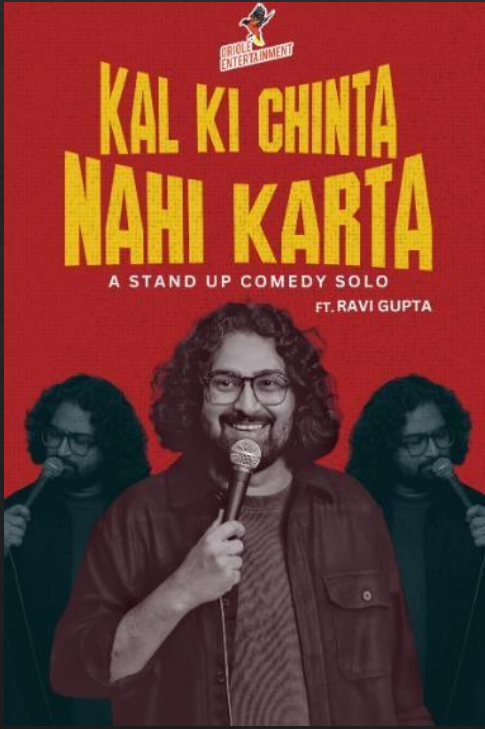
Synonyms:- Passionate, Intense, Fervent

Antonyms:- Mild, Indifferent, Apathetic

E.g. His vehement declaration of support for the cause inspired many others to join.

Comical:- funny in a strange or silly way. (मजेदार)

Mnemonics :- comedy



Synonyms:- Funny, Humorous, Ridiculous

Antonyms:- Serious, Boring, Solemn

E.g. The comedian's comical anecdotes had the audience in stitches.

Shrill:- (Of a voice or sound) characterized by a sharp, high, and penetrating quality. (तीखी आवाज़ वाला)

Mnemonics :- drill ka shor bda shrill hota hai

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- Piercing, Harsh, Cacophonous

Antonyms:- Mellow, Smooth, Soft

E.g. The shrill sound of the alarm woke everyone in the house.

Skeptic:- A person who questions or doubts accepted opinions, claims, or beliefs. (संदेह करने वाला)

Mnemonics :- shakki type ka admi



A jealous husband does not doubt his wife, but himself.

Synonyms:- Cynic, Disbeliever, Pessimist

Antonyms:- Optimist, Advocate, Supporter

E.g. People say it can cure colds, but I'm a skeptic.

Grumpy:- easily annoyed; in a bad mood (चिड़चिड़ा)

Mnemonics :- jiska mood jaldi garam ho jata hai



Synonyms:- Irritable, Cranky, Grouchy

Antonyms:- Cheerful, Pleasant, Happy

E.g. I hadn't had enough sleep and was feeling kind of grumpy.

Despondency:- the quality of being unhappy, with no hope or enthusiasm. (गहरी निराशा की स्थिति)

Mnemonics :- Disappoint



Synonyms:- depression, despair, gloom

Antonyms:- Hope, Optimism, Elation

E.g. When my husband died, I lived in a state of despondency for over a year.

Serene:- Calm, peaceful, and untroubled (बहुत शांत और सुकून भरा)

Mnemonics :- iss scenery jo place hai wo kitni serene hai



Synonyms:- Tranquil, Calm, Placid

Antonyms:- Agitated, Chaotic, Anxious

E.g. This is place is really beautiful and serene.

Squirm:- to move about in distress as a result of fear or shame (बेचैनी से मचलना)

Mnemonics :- lag jata hai jab kuch garam karte hain hum squirm

Synonyms:- Wriggle, Fidget, Wiggle

Antonyms:- Still, Steady, Relax

E.g. The fish squirmed on the ground for a few moments and then lay still.

Reverie:- An abstracted, dreamy, or imaginative state of mind.(खयालों में खो जाना)

Mnemonics :- reverie karo river kinare gf ke sath



Synonyms:- Daydream, Fantasy, Trance

Antonyms:- Focus, Concentration, Alertness

E.g. She was jolted out of her reverie by the sound of the doorbell.

Commence:- To begin or start something. (किसी चीज़ को शुरू करना या आरम्भ करना।)

Mnemonics :- when chief guest comes program commence

Synonyms:- Initiate, Embark, Inaugurate

Antonyms:- Conclude, Terminate, Cease

E.g. The ceremony will commence at 10 a.m. sharp.

Outflow:- the movement of a large amount of money, liquid, people, etc. out of a place (बड़ी मात्रा में बाहर की ओर निकास या बहाव)

Mnemonics :- out + flow

Antonyms:- Absorption, Influx, Accumulation

E.g. The outflow of water from the dam was carefully controlled to prevent flooding.

Ghastly :- extremely awful (बेहद डरावना या बहुत बुरा)

Mnemonics :- causing horror like a ghost



Synonyms:- Horrible, Gruesome, Appalling

Antonyms:- Pleasant, Delightful, Appealing

E.g. The crime scene was so ghastly that it left everyone speechless.

Uniformity:- the state of overall sameness or being identical in every way (एकसमानता या हर तरह से एक जैसा होना)

Mnemonics :- uniform

Synonyms:- Consistency, Conformity, Homogeneity

Antonyms:- Variation, Variety, Diversity

E.g. The uniformity of the soldiers' movements during the parade was impressive.

Confound :- To cause confusion or surprise in someone (चकित करना या पूरी तरह उलझा देना)

Mnemonics :- confused

Synonyms:- Perplex, Baffle, Mystify

Antonyms:- Clarify, Enlighten, Assure

E.g. The magician's tricks confound the audience.

Ebullient :- cheerful and full of energy (जोश और उत्साह से भरपूर)

Mnemonics :- birthday pe ek bullet Enfield mil jaye to ebullient ho jaoge

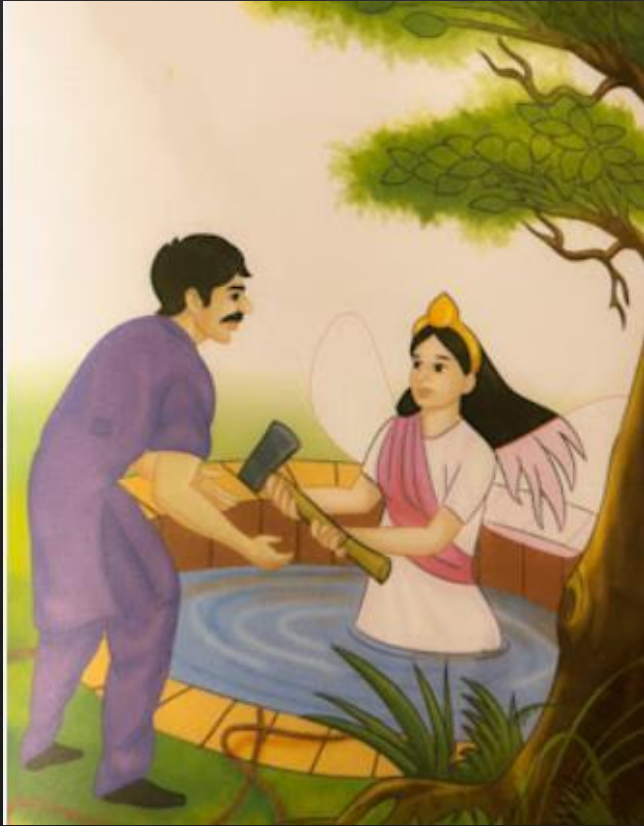
Synonyms:- Enthusiastic, Exuberant, Effervescent

Antonyms:- Gloomy, Apathetic, Melancholic

E.g. The ebullient song was so uplifting that I danced in my chair.

Upright :- (of a person) behaving in a moral and honest way (जो हमेशा सच बोले और अपने उसूलों पर चले)

Mnemonics :- right behaviour



Synonyms:- Righteous, Upstanding, Ethical

Antonyms:- Dishonest, Corrupt, Immoral

E.g. He is known as an upright citizen who always does the right thing, even when it's difficult.

Incinerate :- To burn something completely (किसी चीज को जलाकर पूरी तरह राख कर देना)

Mnemonics :- sin karne walo ko hell me incinerate kiya jata hai

Synonyms:- Consume, Ignite, Cremate

Antonyms:- Extinguish, Douse, Quench

E.g. The thieves decided to incinerate the building after leaving fingerprints on the wall.

Vanquish :- To defeat or overcome someone completely (किसी दुश्मन या चुनौती को पूरी तरह हरा देना)

Mnemonics :- win a competition/ vanish your opponent

HOW TO KNOCKOUT SOMEONE



Synonyms:- Conquer, Subdue, Crush

Antonyms:- Surrender, Yield, Succumb

E.g. In the movies, the superheroes usually vanquish the villains.

Accolade :- praise or an award for an achievement that people admire
(किसी की उपलब्धि पर मिलने वाला सम्मान या पुरस्कार)

Mnemonics :- a college aid

Synonyms:- Tribute, Recognition, Commendation

Antonyms:- Criticism, Reprimand, Condemnation

E.g. The Medal of Honor is the highest accolade a soldier can win.

Wisp :- a small, thin piece of hair, grass, etc. (धुं या बालों का एक छोटा और पतला टुकड़ा)

Mnemonics :- he wishes to touch just the wisp of her hair

Synonyms:- Compact, Petite, Minor

Antonyms:- Abundance, Heap, Condemnation

E.g. Rita brushed back the stray
coppery wisps of hair escaping
her braid.

Conformity :- acting according to certain accepted standards (समाज के नियमों या रिवाजों के अनुसार चलना)

Mnemonics :- confrom / confirm according to rules

Synonyms:- Compliance, Adherence, Alignment

Antonyms:- Rebellion, Dissent, Defiance

E.g. The company's strict dress code is an example of conformity to its professional standards.

Quaint :- attractive in an unusual or old-fashioned way (पुराने ढंग का जो देखने में अजीब पर प्यारा लगे)

Mnemonics :- saint ka statue bda quaint hai

Synonyms:- Charming, Idyllic, Enchanting

Antonyms:- Modern, Ordinary, Unremarkable

E.g. As I walked through the quaint shop, I felt as though I was transported back in time.

Hysterics:- an uncontrollable crying or laughing spell (जज्बातों पर काबू खोकर रोने या हंसने लगना)

Mnemonics :- hassi or cry uncontrollable



Synonyms:- Panic, Agitation, Outburst

Antonyms:- Calm, Composure, Serenity

E.g. She was in hysterics after hearing the shocking news, unable to stop crying and laughing at the same time.

Rue:- to feel regret or remorse for something. (अपनी किसी गलती पर बहुत अफसोस करना या पछताना)

Mnemonics :- regret / rona aye

Synonyms:- Lament, Repent, Mourn

Antonyms:- Rejoice, Relish, Delight

E.g. He must be ruing his decision now.

Incarcerate:- To imprison or confine someone, typically as a punishment for a crime. (किसी को कैद करके जेल में बंद कर देना)

Mnemonics :- inhone car churai thi inhe incarcerate karo

Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- confine, detain, imprison

Antonyms:- Release, Liberate, Discharge

E.g. The police are going to incarcerate the teen who keeps committing acts of violence.

Impose:- to introduce a new rule, punishment, etc. (किसी पर कोई नियम या बोझ जबरदस्ती डाल देना)

Mnemonics :- impose rule



Synonyms:- Enforce, Dictate, Command

Antonyms:- Withdraw, Relieve, Revoke

E.g. The city is going to impose a recreation tax to pay for new parks.

Melancholy:- a feeling of deep sadness (एक गहरी और लंबी उदासी का एहसास)

Mnemonics :- melenge kholi me



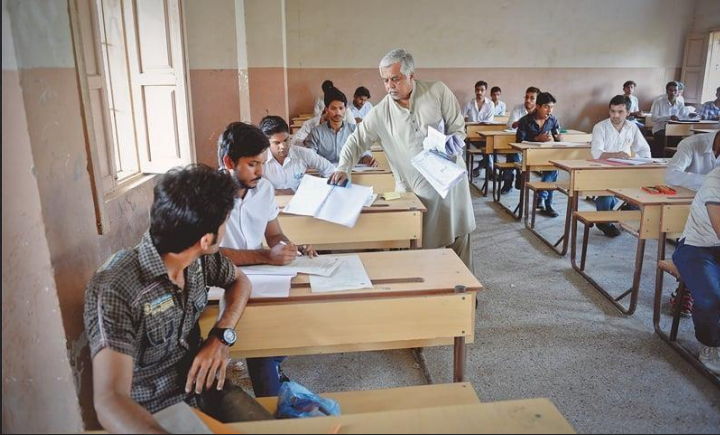
Synonyms:- Gloom, Sorrow, Despair

Antonyms:- Cheerfulness, Elation, Contentment

E.g. The film's tragic ending put us all in a melancholy mood.

Proactive :- taking action to make changes yourself rather than reacting to things that happen (समस्या आने से पहले ही उसकी तैयारी कर लेना)

Mnemonics :- Professor ke active hote hi nakal par kaabu pa liya Aman Sir English



Synonyms:- enterprising , energetic , driven

Antonyms:- Reactive, Neglectful, Inactive

E.g. Emergency procedures are proactive measures to ensure everyone's safety.

Joyless:- without happiness (जिसमें कोई खुशी या उत्साह ना बचा हो)



Synonyms: - Miserable, gloomy, dismal

Aman Sir English

Antonyms:- Joyful, cheerful, exuberant

E.g.:- The once vibrant town had become a joyless place after the factory closed, with empty streets and closed businesses.

Interacts:- to communicate with somebody, especially while you work, play or spend time with them (दो लोगों का आपस में मिलना और बातचीत करना)



Synonyms:- Communicates, engages, collaborate

Antonyms:- Ignores, avoids, isolates

E.g.:- He interacts very well with other children.

Worsened:- To become worse or more severe (पहले से ज्यादा खराब हालत में पहुंच जाना)



Synonyms:- Deteriorated, degraded, exacerbated. Aman Sir English

Antonyms:- Improved, bettered, ameliorated.

E.g.:- His health worsened after he ignored the doctor's advice and continued to overwork himself.

Cowardice:- lack of bravery (मुश्किल वक्त में डर दिखाना और पीछे हटना)



Synonyms:- Timidity, fearfulness, spinelessness

Aman Sir English

Antonyms:- Courage, bravery, valor

E.g. It is an act of moral cowardice for a society to neglect its poor.

Lenient:- not strict in enforcing rules, laws, or discipline.
(गलती होने पर भी नरम रवैया अपनाने वाला)



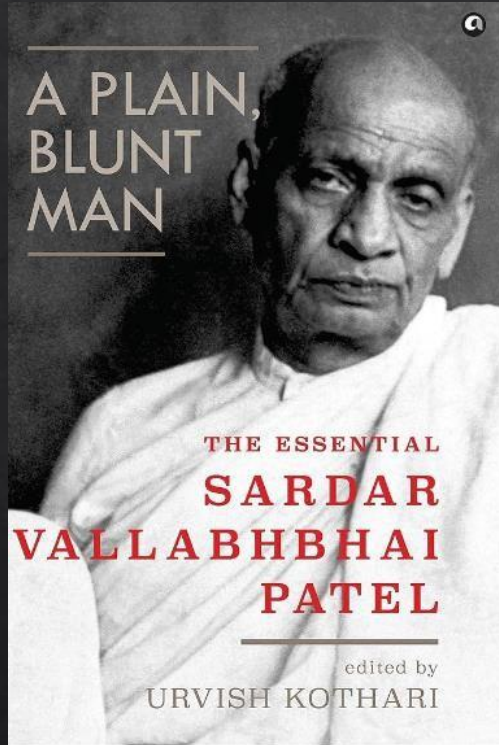
Synonyms:- Merciful, Tolerant, Indulgent

Aman Sir English

Antonyms:- Strict, Harsh, Severe

E.g. My parents are lenient when it comes to curfews, allowing me to stay out later than most of my friends.

Blunt:- very direct in one's words, usually in a negative manner and in a rude way (बिना लपेटे सीधा सच बोलने वाला या बिना धार का)



Synonyms:- Frank, Candid, Abrupt

Antonyms:- Tactful, Polite, Diplomatic

E.g. When I was very blunt about her new relationship, my friend became upset.

Impulsive:- tending to make decisions without thinking
(बिना सोचे-समझे तुरंत कोई फैसला ले लेना)



Synonyms:- Spontaneous, Hasty, Impetuous

Aman Sir English

Antonyms:- Cautious, Deliberate, Planned

E.g. She made an impulsive decision to buy the dress without trying it on first.

Massive:- very large, heavy and solid (जो आकार या वजन में बहुत ही बड़ा हो)



Synonyms:- Huge, Hasty, Gigantic

Antonyms:- Tiny, Petite, Slight

E.g. The construction of the massive skyscraper took several years to complete.

Fluctuate :- to change, especially continuously and between one level or thing and another (जो एक जगह ना रुके और बार-बार बदलता रहे)

Root words :- flu(x) (flow)



Synonyms:- Waver, Oscillate, Swing

Antonyms:- Stabilize, Steady, Persist

E.g. The stock market tends to fluctuate based on economic news and investor sentiment.

Confidential :- something that is private or secret (ऐसी जानकारी जिसे गुप्त रखना जरूरी हो)



Synonyms:- Private, Classified, Personal

Antonyms:- Public, Open, Transparent

E.g. He spoke in a confidential tone,
his voice low.

Pitiable :- deserving pity or sympathy (जिसकी हालत इतनी बुरी हो कि देखकर दया आ जाए)



Synonyms:- Miserable, Pathetic, Sorrowful

Aman Sir English

Antonyms:- Joyful, Fortunate, Content

E.g. After his car broke down, he was a pitiable sight walking down the highway in the rain.

Sarcastic :- Intended to ridicule or express scorn in a humorous or cutting manner. (किसी का मजाक उड़ाने के लिए उल्टा ताना मारना)



Synonyms:- Sardonic, Mocking, Satirical

Antonyms:- Genuine, Courteous, Respectful

E.g. "You have been working hard," he said with heavy sarcasm, as he looked at the empty page.

Troublesome:- causing a lot of problems for someone
(जो बार-बार परेशानी और रुकावट पैदा करे)



Synonyms:- Annoying, Bothersome, Vexing

Antonyms:- Convenient, Helpful, Obedient

E.g. The troublesome noise from the construction site made it hard to concentrate on work.

Ambitious:- strongly desirous and determined to succeed
(अपने जीवन में बहुत कुछ पाने की चाह रखना)



Synonyms:- Aspiring, Determined, Goal-oriented Aman Sir English

Antonyms:- Lazy, Unambitious, Unaspiring

E.g. She is an ambitious student, always striving for the highest grades in her class.

Elegance:- being graceful and stylish in appearance
(कपड़ों या व्यवहार में दिखने वाली शालीनता)



Synonyms:- Grace, Finesse, Refinement

Aman Sir English

Antonyms:- Crudeness, Clumsiness, Roughness

E.g. Mesmerized by the dancer's elegance, the man had never seen someone move with such grace.

Desperate :- a feeling of hopelessness in which someone is willing to try the impossible to solve a problem (किसी चीज को पाने के लिए बेचैन या मजबूर होना)



Synonyms:- Hopeless, Despairing, Anxious

Antonyms:- Confident, Calm, Optimistic

E.g. The doctors made one last desperate attempt to save the boy's life.

Nepotism :- The practice of showing favoritism, especially in business or politics (अपने रिश्तेदारों को बिना योग्यता के फायदा पहुंचाना)



Synonyms:- Bias, Partiality, Patronage

Antonyms:- Fairness, Impartiality, Equality

E.g. He was guilty of nepotism and corruption.
