

**1.Satirize:-** cleverly make fun of something (मज़ाक उड़ाना)

**Mnemonics:-** jo gusse me hai usse kahen ki "you sat in fridge"  
ye satirize karna hua

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Ridicule, Mock, Lampoon

**Antonyms:-** Praise, Aid, Applaud

**Eg:-** Don't satirize her because she is already very angry.



**2.Sanguinity:-** cheerfully optimistic (अच्छे भविष्य की उम्मीद रखना)

**Mnemonics:-** cheerful like penguin

**Synonyms:-** Optimism, Anticipation, Certainty

**Antonyms:-** Depression, Distrust, Sorrow

**Eg:-** Some people expect the economy to continue to improve, but others are less sanguine.



**3.Expend:-** to use or spend time, effort, or money (पैसा या ताकत खर्च करना)

**Mnemonics:-** spend / expenditure



**Synonyms:-** Spend, Use, Consume

**Antonyms:-** Active, Animated, Unuse

**Eg:-** You have expended a lot of money in pursuing that court case.

**4.Uninhabited:-** having no people living there (जहाँ कोई इंसान न रहता हो)

**Mnemonics:-** un (not) + inhabited (where people live)



**Synonyms:-** Desolate, Deserted, Unoccupied

**Antonyms:-** Populated, Busy, Settled

**Eg:-** Jaco Island is uninhabited because the locals think it is sacred land that no one should live on.

**5. Disseminate:-** to scatter or spread widely (जानकारी को दूर-दूर तक फैलाना)

**Mnemonics:-** This seminar aims to disseminate information about healthy lifestyle

**Synonyms:-** Circulate, Advertise, Disperse

**Antonyms:-** Conceal, Hide, Collect

**Eg:-** The seminar aimed to disseminate information about healthy lifestyle.

**6.Startle:-** to frighten or surprise an individual (अचानक से किसी को चौंका देना)

**Mnemonics:-** usain bolt ne start lete hi sabko startle kar dia



**Synonyms:-** Agitate, Amaze, Astonish

**Antonyms:-** Bore, Calm, Reassure

**Eg:-** Usain bolt startled everyone by winning back to back gold medals in Olympic games.

**7.Stymie:-** to act as an obstacle (किसी के काम में अड़ंगा डालना)

**Mnemonics:-** stay me / tie me

**Synonyms:-** Crimp, Foil, Impede

**Antonyms:-** Abet, Advance, Assist

**Eg:-** Because Ritik wants to stymie his divorce, he is refusing to sign the final papers.

**8.Reconnoitre:-** (of soldiers or military aircraft) to get information about an area or the size and position of enemy forces (किसी इलाके की जांच-पड़ताल करना)

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** re kon kon utre wha reconnoitre karke aao



**Synonyms:-** Probe, Search, Seek

**Antonyms:-** Neglect, Overlook, Ignore

**Eg:-** A drone was used to reconnoitre the locality.

**9. Rescind:-** to take back/cancel a contract, law or proposal etc. (पुराने नियम या फैसले को हटाना)

**Mnemonics:-** agar apka ek proposal rescind ho jata hai to nya resend karna padta hai

**Synonyms:-** Abolish, Annul, Cancel

**Antonyms:-** Allow, Approve, Support

**Eg:-** We urge the committee to rescind its decision.



**10. Touting:-** The act of promoting something (किसी चीज की बहुत तारीफ करना)

**Mnemonics:-** shout to sell or promote something

**Synonyms:-** Advertising, Endorsing, Soliciting

**Antonyms:-** Ignoring, Criticizing, Disparaging

**Eg:-** He was touting his new product to everyone he met.



**11.Overture:-** a piece of music played at the beginning of an opera or musical play (मेल-जोल बढ़ाने की पहली कोशिश)

**Mnemonics:-** overview tune



**Synonyms:-** Opening, Preamble, Bid

**Antonyms:-** Conclusion, Ending, Epilogue

**Eg:-** The overture to the famous play 'Romeo and Juliet' was very melodious.

**12.Prosecute:-** to hold trial against someone charged with a crime  
(अदालत में मुकदमा चलाना)

**Mnemonics:-** case ko proceed karna

PUBLIC PROSECUTOR



**Synonyms:-** Arraign, Indict, Summon

**Antonyms:-** Exonerate, Free, Liberate

**Eg:-** DNA evidence was used to prosecute the killer and lock him up for good.

**13.Incite:-** to provoke somebody to do something illegal or bad  
(किसी को लड़ाई के लिए भड़काना)

**Mnemonics:-** negative kaam ke liye excite karna



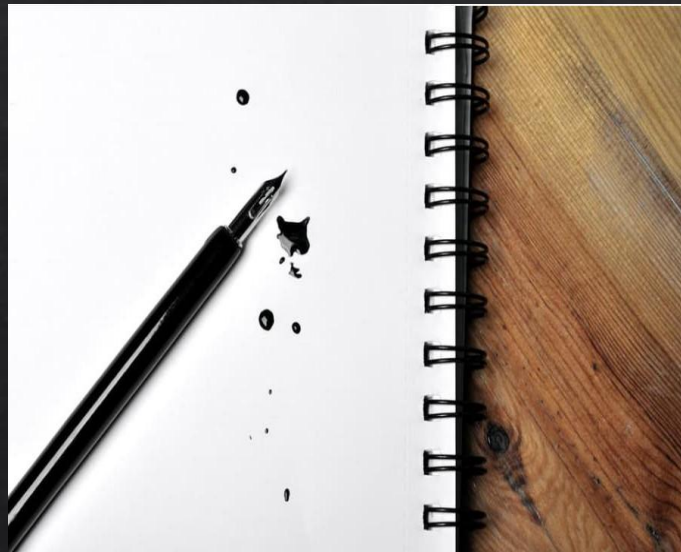
**Synonyms:-** Encourage, Agitate, Arouse

**Antonyms:-** Block, Calm, Dampen

**Eg:-** Do you know you can be arrested for trying to incite an uprising against the government?

**14.Fleck:-** a small patch of color or light (छोटा सा दाग या निशान)

**Mnemonics:-** fall + ink



**Synonyms:-** Speck, Stripe, Dot

**Antonyms:-** Blank, Perfection, Lot

**Eg:-** As we spent all day painting our house, there were flecks of paint on our clothes.

**15.Excruciating:-** extremely uncomfortable or painful  
(बहुत ज्यादा बर्दाश्त से बाहर दर्द)

**Mnemonics:-** Jab apki ex ek crore ka case kar de to excruciating  
pain hota hai

**Synonyms:-** Agonizing, Harrowing, Piercing

**Antonyms:-** Calm, Mild, Dull

**Eg:-** A woman has to go through excruciating  
pain during labor.

**16.Laconic:-** using very few words to express what you mean  
(बहुत कम शब्दों में बोलने वाला)

**Mnemonics:-** iconic log laconic speech bhi de sakte hain



**Synonyms:-** Brief, Concise, Compact

**Antonyms:-** Wordy, Lengthy, Verbose

**Eg:-** He gave a laconic speech while addressing his supporters.

**17.Quintessential:-** a perfect example of something (किसी चीज का सबसे अच्छा नमूना)

**Mnemonics:-** quite essential

**Synonyms:-** Typical, Classic, Ultimate

**Antonyms:-** Different, Abnormal, Unusual

**Eg:-** Everyone knows Virat Kohli is the quintessential man on a cricket team.

**18.Slender:-** having little width in proportion to the length or height  
(दुबला-पतला और सुंदर दिखने वाला)

**Mnemonics:-** slim and tender

**Synonyms:-** Slim, Thin, Frail

**Antonyms:-** Chubby, Fat, Firm

**Eg:-** Model's long and slender legs suits her personality a lot.

**19.Bestial:-** exceptionally violent and cruel (जानवरों जैसा घटिया और क्रूर)

**Mnemonics:-** like a beast

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Brutal, Barbarous, Cruel

**Antonyms:-** Generous, Gentle, Humane

**Eg:-** At the movie's conclusion, there was a bestial scene that ended with the beheading of the bad guy.



**20.Satiate:-** to satisfy someone fully (पूरी तरह मन भर देना)

**Mnemonics:-** I am satisfied with what I ate



**Synonyms:-** Gratify, Overfill, Content

**Antonyms:-** Disappoint, Deplete, Deprive

**Eg:-** He ate greedily until he satiated his hunger .

**21.Sedentary:-** A lifestyle characterized by little physical activity  
(ज्यादातर बैठे रहने वाला काम)

**Mnemonics:-** sat on sofa no entry no exit

**Synonyms:-** Inactive, Dormant, Lethargic

**Antonyms:-** Active, Energetic, Lively

**Eg:-** Sedentary lifestyle often leads to health problems.



**22.Imprisonment:-** the act of locking someone into a prison  
(जेल के अंदर बंद रहना)

**Mnemonics:-** in + prison



**Synonyms:-** Captivity, Custody, Restraint

**Antonyms:-** Freedom, Liberation, Discharge

**Eg:-** The thief's imprisonment only lasted a few months before he was able to escape.

**23. Expel:-** to force something out such as liquid and air; eliminate  
(बाहर निकाल देना या भगा देना)

**Mnemonics:-** tumhare naak me mucus hai isko pehle expel karo

Aman Sir English



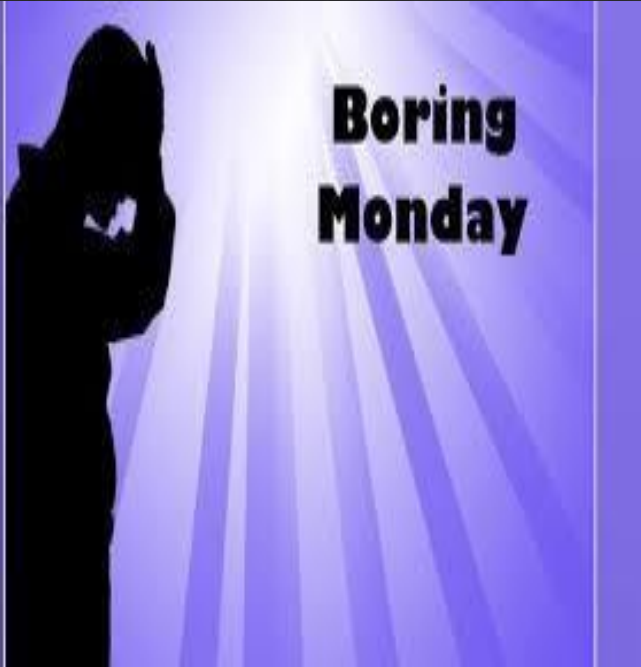
**Synonyms:-** Evacuate, Remove, Vomit

**Antonyms:-** Absorb, Admit, Take in

**Eg:-** He is trying to expel mucus from his nose.

**24.Mundane:-** not interesting or exciting (रोजाना का वही साधारण काम)

**Mnemonics:-** Sunday is interesting but Monday is mundane



**Synonyms:-** Dull, Boring, Ordinary

**Antonyms:-** Exciting, Lively

**Eg:-** Though his friends were having a fun time at the bar, Kevin settled for a mundane evening at home.

**25. Ameliorate:-** to make something better or more manageable  
(किसी खराब हालात को सुधारना)

**Mnemonics:-** Emily ko mehenge rate ka gift dene se ladai  
ameliorate ho sakti hai

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Alleviate, Mitigate, Lighten

**Antonyms:-** Aggravate, Increase, Intensify

**Eg:-** He tried to ameliorate the situation by  
gifting a costly ring to his wife.

**26. Ramification:-** unexpected and complicated results or consequences  
(किसी काम का बुरा असर)

**Mnemonics:-** sasti RAM fix karane ke ramification  
bure ho sakte hain

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Consequence, Upshot, Radiation

**Antonyms:-** Origin, Source, Juncture

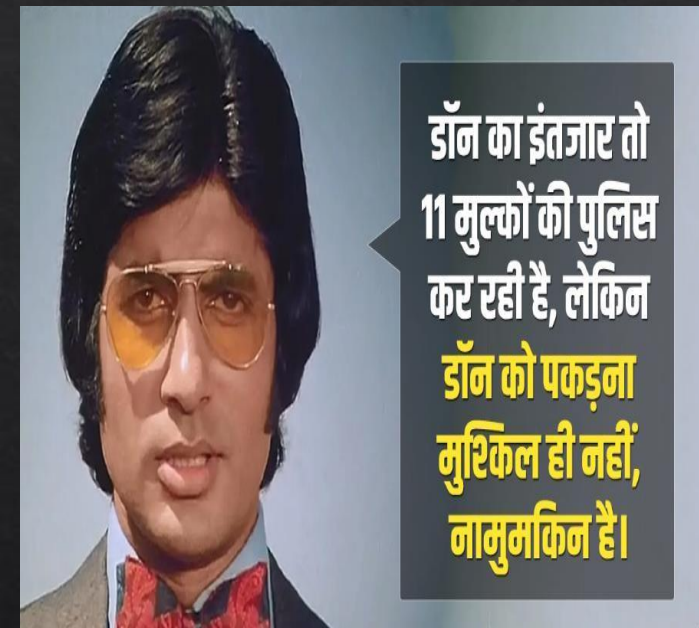
**Eg:-** Have you considered all the ramifications  
of changing careers at this stage of your  
life?



**27. Daunting:-** a task that appears challenging (डरा देने वाला मुश्किल काम)

**Mnemonics:-** don ko pakadna ek daunting task hai

**Synonyms:-** Challenging, Intimidating, Threatening

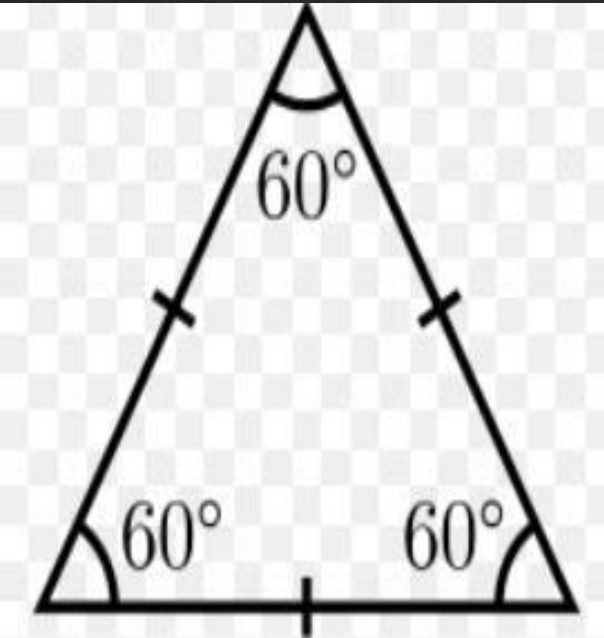
**Antonyms:-** Calming, Comforting, Satisfying

**Eg:-** If you have never done skydiving, it might appear somewhat daunting to you.

**28. Corollary:-** a natural consequence, or a result that naturally follows  
(किसी बात का सीधा नतीजा)

**Mnemonics:-** triangle ke corner angle same hai sides bhi same  
honggi ye cheez corollary hai

**Synonyms:-** Aftereffect, Culmination, Consequence

**Antonyms:-** Cause, Foundation, Origin

**Eg:-** Unfortunately, violence is the inevitable corollary of such a revolutionary change in society.

**29.Charlatan:-** a person who falsely pretends to know or be something in order to deceive people (धोखेबाज या खुद को जानकार बताने वाला)

**Mnemonics:-** future ki char same baate sabko btata hai wo charlatan

**Synonyms:-** Con, Pretender, Imposter

**Antonyms:-** Honest, Real

**Eg:-** The charlatan pretended to be a doctor so he could go into the hospital and steal prescription drugs.



**30.Coalesce:-** to come together to form one larger group  
(अलग चीजों का आपस में मिलना)

**Mnemonics:-** coalition government



**Synonyms:-** Consolidate, Blend, Unite

**Antonyms:-** Separate, Divide, Dissociate

**Eg:-** Because of the decreasing participation in both parties, all the members agreed to coalesce their groups into one large one.

**31.Circumvent:-** to find a way of avoiding a difficulty or a rule  
(चालाकी से बचकर निकल जाना)

**Mnemonics:-** seedhe na jake circumference se went



**Synonyms:-** Mislead, Fool, Bypass

**Antonyms:-** Aid, Assist, Liberate

**Eg:-** Teenagers often want to circumvent their parents' orders and rules.

**32.Contrition:-** the feeling of being very sorry for something bad that you have done (अपनी गलती पर दिल से दुख)

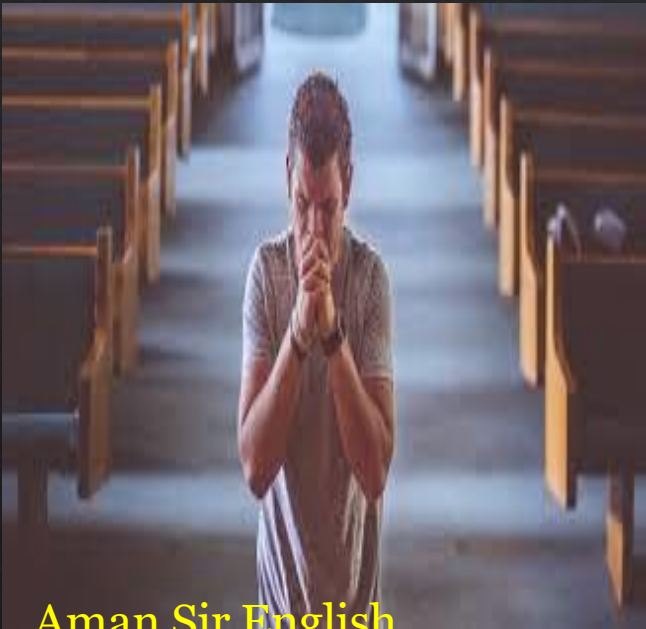

**Mnemonics:-** family ke liye nhi kiya kabhi koi contribution iss baat ka tha usko contrition

**Synonyms:-** Regret, Remorse, Attrition

**Antonyms:-** Happiness, Meanness, Hurtfulness

**Eg:-** The defendant pled guilty to the crime and expressed heartfelt contrition for the things he done.



**33. Enervate:-** to make somebody feel weak and tired (कमजोरी महसूस कराना या थकाना)

**Mnemonics:-** if you never ate , you would enervate

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Debilitate, Disable, Exhaust

**Antonyms:-** Energize, Invigorate, Aid

**Eg:-** As he is much stronger than I, the only way for me to enervate him is by putting a sleeping pill in his food.

**34.Repentance** :- feeling of regret (अपनी भूल पर पछतावा करना)

**Mnemonics:-** repent

**Synonyms:-** Grief, Guilt, Penitence

**Antonyms:-** Happiness, Satisfaction

**Eg:-** The guilty man believed that his repentance would save him from punishment.



**35.Purview:-** area of authority or control (देख-रेख या अधिकार का दायरा)

**Mnemonics:-** ye pura view humare purview me aata hai



**Synonyms:-** Domain, Extent, Vicinity

**Antonyms:-** Extreme, Height, Insignificance

**Eg:-** The island is treated as an outlying territory; it has not been brought within the full purview of the Japanese constitution.

**36.Revitalize** :- to make something stronger or energetic  
(किसी चीज में फिर से जान डालना)

**Mnemonics:-** revival kha k energize ya revitalize ho jate hain

**Synonyms:-** Enliven, Energize, Awaken

**Antonyms:-** Break, Depress, Discourage

**Eg:-** Whenever you are feeling down, you should consider hanging out with your friends or doing something you enjoy to revitalize you.



**37.Shambles:-** a state of disorder or chaos (सब कुछ पूरी तरह बिगड़ा हुआ)

**Mnemonics:-** exercise karne ke baad log dumbles ko shambles condition me chor jaate hain

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Mess, Disarray, Disorder

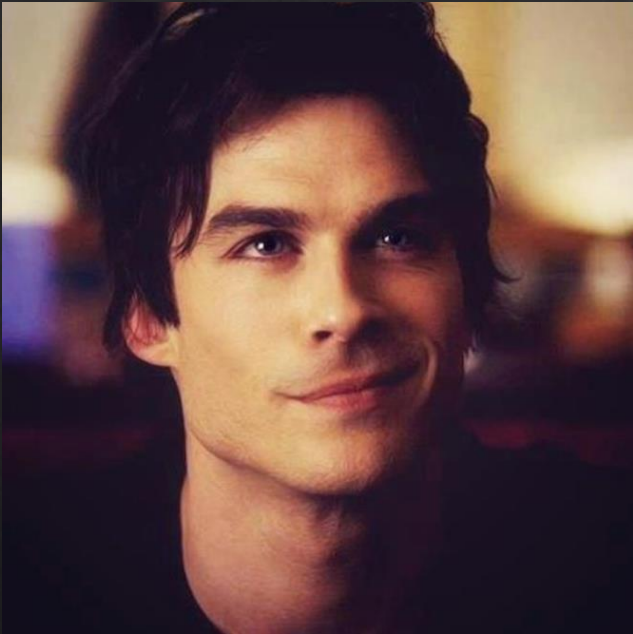
**Antonyms:-** Harmony, Peace

**Eg:-** When my wife left me and took our children, I felt as though my life was in shambles.



**38.Smirk:-** a kind of smile that one gives when acting in a smug or conceited way (बनावटी या टेढ़ी मुस्कान देना)

**Mnemonics:-** smile + farak na padna / smile + rich



**Synonyms:-** Sneer, Simper, Beam

**Antonyms:-** Applaud, Praise

**Eg:-** An arrogant smirk came across the suspect's face when he realized that the police had no real evidence.

**39.Intuitive** :- being able to sense or understand things with little or no information (अंदर से अपने आप समझ आना)

**Mnemonics:-** based on intuition

**Synonyms:-** Perceptive, Visceral, Instinctive

**Antonyms:-** Calculated, Meditated, Reasoned

**Eg:-** You should trust your intuition in making your decision.



**40.Outset:-** from the beginning of something (किसी भी काम की बिल्कुल शुरुआत)

**Mnemonics:-** set to go out



**Synonyms:-** Origin, Beginning, Source

**Antonyms:-** Completion, Conclusion, Ending

**Eg:-** At the outset of the training process, the safety rules were explicitly stated so that no one would get hurt.
