

**1. Dulcet:-** Sounding sweet and pleasant (कानों को प्यारी लगने वाली आवाज़)

**Mnemonics:-** diljit / dull mood set ho jata hai dulcet music se

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Musical, Pleasing, Mellifluous

**Antonyms:-** Harsh, Unpleasant, Unwelcome

**Eg:-** It does not take long for the baby to be comforted by his mother's dulcet singing.

**2.Pernicious:-** Highly injurious or destructive (धीरे-धीरे बहुत नुकसान पहुँचाने वाला)

**Mnemonics:-** parai naari pe nazar pernicious ho sakti hai

**Synonyms:-** Damaging, Malicious, Noxious

**Antonyms:-** Assisting, Wholesome, Beneficial

**Eg:-** Violence in the workplace is pernicious to an employee's need for safety.

**3.Suspicious:-** Feeling that somebody has done something wrong  
(जिस पर शक या संदेह हो)

**Mnemonics:-** saas ne paiso ke liye bahu pe kiya suspicion



**Synonyms:-** Doubtful, Skeptical, Wary

**Antonyms:-** Heedless, Inattentive, Certain

**Eg:-** The cop was suspicious of the man in the hood and the mask walking into the bank.

## 4. Subdued:- Held down (शांत या दबा हुआ महसूस करना)

**Mnemonics:-** sabke dwara dbaya gya



**Synonyms:-** Hushed, Muted, Restrained

**Antonyms:-** Aroused, Uncontrolled, Intensified

**Eg:-** According to the lawsuit, the officers subdued the suspect with unnecessary force and broke his arm.

**5. Witty:-** Funny and clever (मजाकिया और बहुत हाजिरजवाब)

**Mnemonics:-** kitty party me witty baate hoti hai

**Synonyms:-** Amusing, Waggish, Jocular

**Antonyms:-** Serious, Unfunny, Dull

**Eg:-** Known for his witty comebacks, the comedian's amusing stand-up routine is a hit with every audience.

**6.Unfavourable:-** Not good and likely to cause problems (जो हमारे पक्ष में न हो)

**Mnemonics:-** not in favour

**Synonyms:-** Adverse, Antagonistic, Calamitous

**Antonyms:-** Advantageous, Agreeable, Propitious

**Eg:-** The odds of us being able to go to the ballgame are unfavorable since the weatherman is calling for heavy rain.

**7.Overt:-** Done in an open way (खुल्लम-खुल्ला या बिल्कुल साफ)

**Mnemonics:-** open / opposite of covert



**Synonyms:-** Apparent, Open, Definite

**Antonyms:-** Covered, Obscure, Unclear

**Eg:-** His recent productions have been beautifully crafted works with little overt political content.

**8. Viability:-** The fact that something can be done and be successful  
(काम के सफल होने की उम्मीद)

**Mnemonics:-** Viv (life ) + able



**Synonyms:-** Feasibility, Possibility, Capability

**Antonyms:-** Apathy, Improbability, Unlikelihood

**Eg:-** The viability of the company was guaranteed by the success of its new product.

**9. Stare:-** To look at something for a long time (किसी को एकटक घूर कर देखना)

**Mnemonics:-** movie stars ko sab stare karte hain

**Synonyms:-** Glare, Gaze, Peer

**Antonyms:-** Ignore, Neglect, Look away

**Eg:-** The lonely puppy stared out the window, gazing at the yard and wishing he could go outside to play.

**10.Impeccable:-** Without mistake or faults (बिल्कुल बेदाग जिसमें कोई कमी न हो)

**Mnemonics:-** pakka kaam/ galti pick karna impossible

**Synonyms:-** Unblemished, Accurate, Unerring

**Antonyms:-** Flawed, Imperfect, Blemished

**Eg:-** With your impeccable English skills, writing essays should be a cinch.

**11.Contemplate:-** to consider something (किसी बात पर गहराई से सोचना)

**Mnemonics:-** temple me contemplate karna kon hain hum

**Synonyms:-** Consider, Envisage, Ponder

**Antonyms:-** Forget, Reject, Neglect

**Eg:-** When the accountant was asked to contemplate the current budget, he discovered many ways the company could save money.

**12.Puritanical:-** Practicing very strict moral or religious behavior  
(नैतिकता और नियमों में बहुत सख्त)

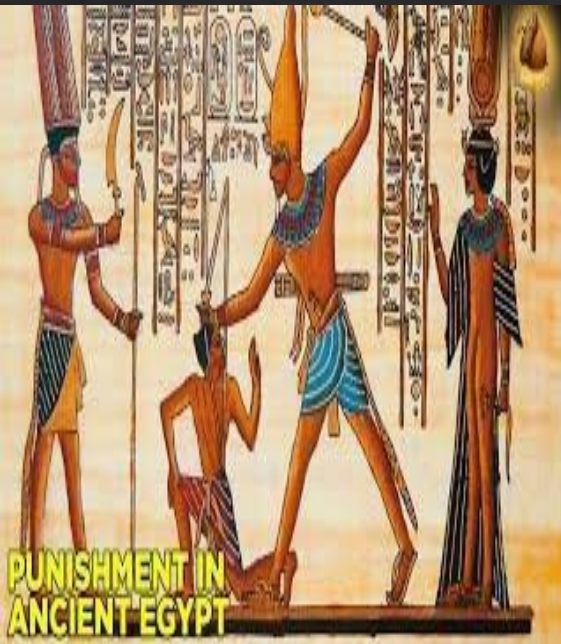
**Mnemonics:-** purane principals ko strictly man ne wala

**Synonyms:-** Prudish, Rigid, Conforming

**Antonyms:-** Permissive, Broad-minded, Liberal

**Eg:-** My parents sent me to live with my puritanical grandparents who punished me for my liberality.



**13. Harmony:-** A state of peaceful existence and agreement (आपसी तालमेल और भाईचारा)

**Mnemonics:-** har man khush / harm no one

Aman Sir English

**Synonyms:-** Conformity, Unanimity, Peace

**Antonyms:-** Hatred, Discord, Clash

**Eg:-** The laid-back husband wanted to live in harmony with his wife, but her argumentative ways wouldn't allow them to be at peace.

**14. Confess:-** To admit something that you feel ashamed about  
(अपनी गलती या सच मान लेना)

**Mnemonics:-** ki unko fasaya hai tumne confess karo



**Synonyms:-** Admit, Confide, Declare

**Antonyms:-** Deny, Refuse, Reject

**Eg:-** If you have wronged someone, it is up to you to confess what you have done and earn their forgiveness.

**15.Affliction:-** Pain and difficulty that causes it. (कोई बड़ी मुसीबत या शारीरिक कष्ट)

**Mnemonics:-** conflict se hota hai affliction

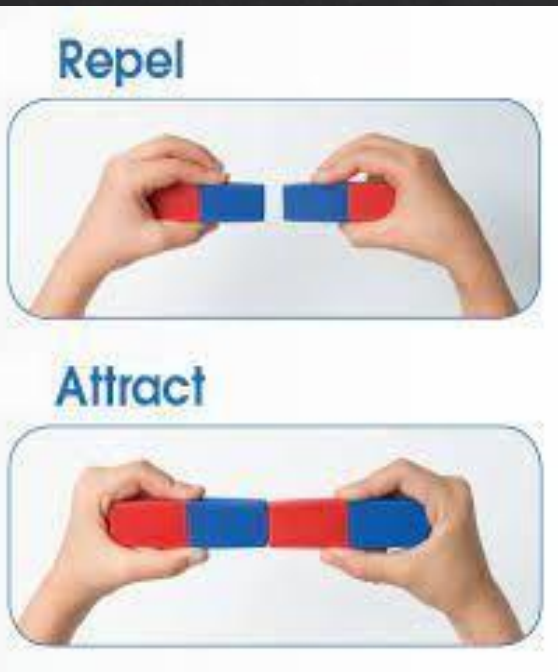
**Synonyms:-** Calamity, Hardship, Misery

**Antonyms:-** Advantage, Joy, Boon

**Eg:-** Although some people claim that she is lucky because she can't gain weight, she considers it an affliction.

**16.Repel:-** To push something away (पीछे हटाना या दूर भगाना)

**Mnemonics:-** repulsion



**Synonyms:-** Confront, Resist, Rebuff

**Antonyms:-** Aid, Sanction, Assist

**Eg:-** The king's men used arrows to repel invaders away from the castle.

**17.Ludicrous:-** Unreasonable; that you cannot take seriously  
(बिल्कुल बेतुका और हंसी के काबिल)

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** ludo ki wajah se ladai karna ludicrous hai



**Synonyms:-** Bizarre, Crazy, Farcical

**Antonyms:-** Familiar, Usual, Sensible

**Eg:-** The ludicrous movie is about a dog that becomes the president of a country.

**18. Benign:-** Having no significant effect; harmless (जो बिल्कुल भी नुकसानदायक न हो)

**Mnemonics:-** ben (good)

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Favorable, Gentle, Mild

**Antonyms:-** Harsh, Rough, Violent

**Eg:-** The medicine is benign in its effects and will cause you no harm.

**19. Fixation:-** The activity of fastening something firmly in position  
(किसी चीज़ का मन में जुनून होना)

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** fix mind / obsession



**Synonyms:-** Obsession, Infatuation, Fascination

**Antonyms:-** Dislike, Hate, Hatred

**Eg:-** Anna's preoccupation with her appearance and fixation on looking like a barbie doll lead her to undergo multiple plastic surgeries.

**20. Demonstrate:-** To prove something by showing examples  
(करके दिखाना या प्रदर्शन करना)

**Mnemonics:-** demo dena/ darshana

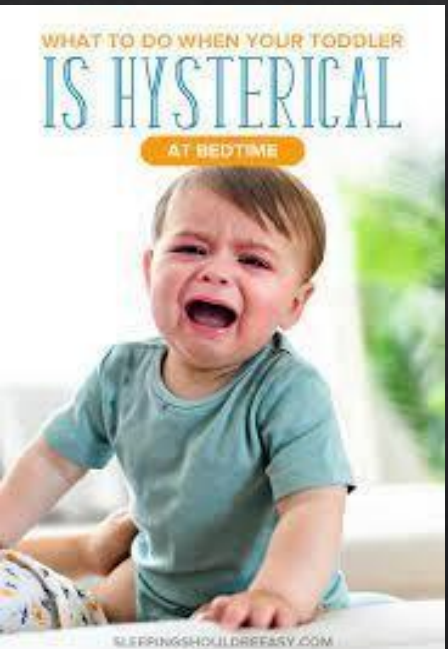
**Synonyms:-** Present, Exhibit, Expose

**Antonyms:-** Conceal, Hide, Disprove

**Eg:-** The basketball player hopes to demonstrate his skill during tryouts, so he can make the team this year.

**21.Hysterical:-** Affected by uncontrolled emotions (बेकाबू होकर हंसना या चिल्लाना)

**Mnemonics:-** hassi or cry uncontrollable



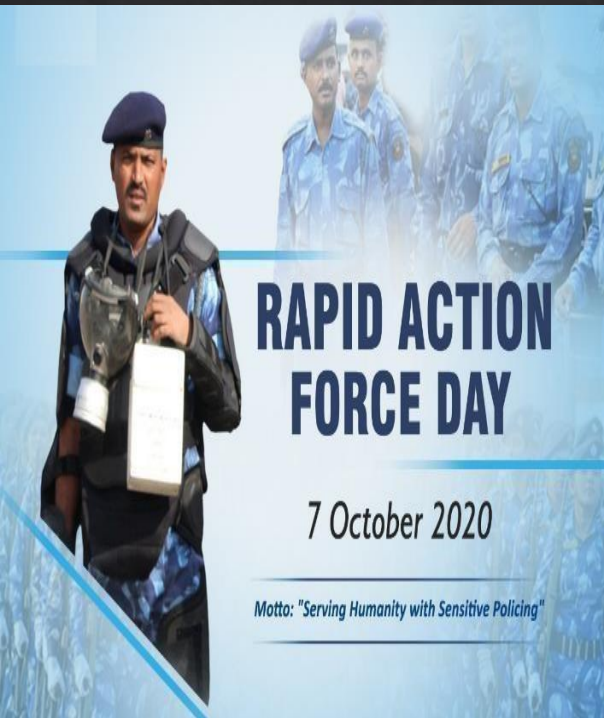
**Synonyms:-** Agitated, Distraught, Crazy

**Antonyms:-** Apathetic, Balanced, Controlled

**Eg:-** The hysterical play kept the audience cackling the entire show.

**22.Rapid:-** Happening very quickly (बहुत ही तेज रफ्तार वाला)

**Mnemonics:-** words in a rap



**Synonyms:-** Breakneck, Brisk, Hasty

**Antonyms:-** Delayed, Slack, Tardy

**Eg:-** If Lenny continues to lose blood at such a rapid rate, he'll die within minutes.

**23. Turmoil:-** A state of confusion or disorder (भारी उथल-पुथल या मानसिक बेचैनी)

**Mnemonics:-** oil price rise se turmoil



**Synonyms:-** Anxiety, Strife, Unrest

**Antonyms:-** Composure, Calmness, Contentment

**Eg:-** The turmoil after the war led to the formation of rival groups who all wanted to run the small country.

**24.Facilitate:-** To make something occur or less difficult (किसी काम को आसान बनाना)

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** online education ki facility ne padhai ko facilitate kar dia



**Synonyms:-** Expedite, Ease, Promote

**Antonyms:-** Cease, Delay, Impede

**Eg:-** The translator will facilitate the conversation between the immigrant and the attorney.

**25. Resolute:-** Strong and determined (अपने इरादे का बहुत पक्का होना)

**Mnemonics:-** resolution

**Synonyms:-** Adamant, Persistent, Stubborn

**Antonyms:-** Afraid, Meek, Complacent

**Eg:-** After such a heart-breaking loss, every member of the team was more resolute than ever to win the next game against their arch-rivals.



**26.Captivate:-** to catch and hold someone's attention (किसी का मन मोह लेना)

**Mnemonics:-** strange cap ne kiya captivate / capture your attention Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Bewitch, Dazzle, Seduce

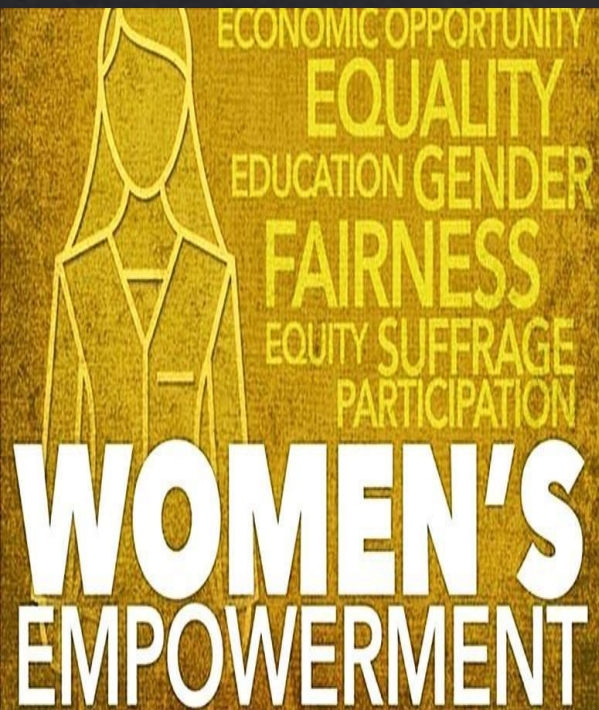
**Antonyms:-** Annoy, Disenchant, Displease

**Eg.:-** When the model walked down the street, she seemed to captivate every man who saw her.

**27. Empowered:-** Acting with confidence (आत्मनिर्भर या अधिकार से भरा हुआ)

**Mnemonics:-** I am powered

**Synonyms:-** Authorized, Chartered, Entitled

**Antonyms:-** Prevented, Unexempt, Disadvantageous

**Eg:-** After being praised to the sky, Jack felt empowered and was ready to tackle the job.

**28. Jovial:-** Very cheerful and friendly (हमेशा खुशमिजाज और हंसमुख रहने वाला)

**Mnemonics:-** joyful

**Synonyms:-** Affable, Festive, Jolly

**Antonyms:-** Depressed, Gloomy, Hateful

**Eg:-** Stories describe Santa Claus as a jovial man who gives toys to children.

**29.Lunacy:-** Behaviour that is stupid and crazy (पूरी तरह से पागलपन जैसी हरकत)

**Mnemonics:-** luna ke tika lagne se baad wo lunatic ho gyi

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Absurdity, Idiocy, Silliness

**Antonyms:-** Sanity, Wisdom, Intelligence

**Eg:-** I can't tolerate your lunacy anymore.

**30.Salvage:-** Something pulled out or saved because of its value  
(नुकसान होने के बाद सामान बचाना)

**Mnemonics:-** sea se la ke usage



**Synonyms:-** Redeem, Reclaim, Glean

**Antonyms:-** Damage, Abandon, Injure

**Eg:-** The metal salvage we got from the old car is worth a tidy sum.

**31. Allegation:-** a claim or a statement saying someone has done something illegal or wrong (बिना सबूत के लगाया गया आरोप)

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** ilzam lgana



**Synonyms:-** Accusation, Charge, Claim

**Antonyms:-** Exculpation, Testimony, Denial

**Eg:-** The professor made an allegation of cheating against his student.

**32.Affable:-** Pleasant, friendly and easy to talk to (मिलनसार और बहुत प्यारा व्यवहार)

**Mnemonics:-** lovable/ affection + able

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Amiable, Gracious, Obliging

**Antonyms:-** Rude, Uncivil, Disdainful

**Eg:-** Since he wanted to be voted the most affable boy at school, Jason always had a smile for everyone.

**33. Interminable:-** Lasting a very long time and therefore boring  
(जो कभी खत्म ही न हो)

**Mnemonics:-** in(not) + terminate (end) + able

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Boundless, Eternal, Limitless

**Antonyms:-** Brief, Ceasing, Halting

**Eg:-** As he listened to one interminable speech after another, the reporter felt his eyes grow heavy.

**34.Pacify:-** To make somebody who is angry become calm (किसी गुस्से वाले को शांत करना)

**Mnemonics:-** paise dekar pacify kiya/ peace dena kisiko

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Allay, Appease, Placate

**Antonyms:-** Aggravate, Agitate, Irritate

**Eg:-** The airline attempted to pacify the stranded passengers with offers of free flight vouchers.

**35. Sundry:-** A group of unrelated things (अलग-अलग तरह की कई चीजें)

**Mnemonics:-** sunday ko sab sundry activities karte hain

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Assorted, Various, Manifold

**Antonyms:-** Same, Similar, Identical

**Eg:-** My grandmother decided to open a sundry store where people could buy an assortment of goods.

**36. Ambivalent:-** Having both positive and negative feeling about something (जब मन में दो उलझे विचार हों)

**Mnemonics:-** ambi (both) + volo (wish)

**Synonyms:-** Contradictory, Doubtful, Hesitant

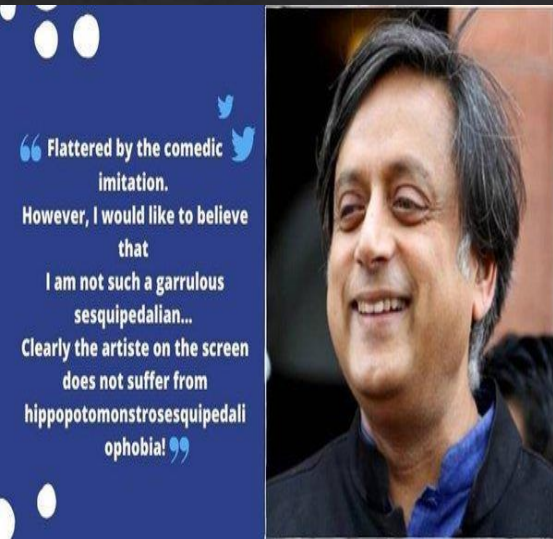
**Antonyms:-** Certain, Unequivocal, Determined

**Eg:-** When it comes to the election, I am ambivalent about the candidates.

**37. Verbose:-** Using or containing too many words (बात को बहुत ज्यादा शब्दों में कहना)

**Root words:-** verb( words) / words ka overdose

**Synonyms:-** Bombastic, Rhetorical, Garrulous

**Antonyms:-** Concise, Succinct

**Eg:-** The verbose man took thirty minutes to give me a simple answer.

**38.Raciness:-** Having a distinctive quality or taste (उत्साह, जोश या चटपटापन)

**Mnemonics:-** jisme logon ko ras aye mja aye

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Piquancy, Sharpness, Pungency

**Antonyms:-** Perfection, Blandness

**Eg:-** Her personal adventures were poured into nine bestselling books whose raciness and brio took the publishing world by surprise.

**39.Elusive:-** Difficult to find, define, achieve (पकड़ में न आने वाली चीज़)

**Mnemonics:-** ellude / elope / escape

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Illusory, Fleeting, Tricky

**Antonyms:-** Definite, Intelligible, Stable

**Eg:-** The police are finding it difficult to catch the elusive bank robber.

**40.Convoluted:-** Extremely complex and difficult to follow  
(बहुत ज्यादा पेचीदा या घुमावदार)

**Mnemonics:-** military covoy ko lootna convoluted task h



**Synonyms:-** Intricate, Tangled, Baffling

**Antonyms:-** Simplified, Uncomplicated, Straight

**Eg:-** Although Janice spoke slowly, I found it difficult to understand her convoluted story.

**41. Guile:-** The use of dishonest mean to trick someone (चालाकी, धोखा या छल-कपट)

**Mnemonics:-** girls best friends bna ke guile karti hai

Aman Sir English



**Synonyms:-** Trickery, Artfulness, Wiliness

**Antonyms:-** Honesty, Sincerity, Frankness

**Eg:-** Vivian used guile to trick the old man into giving her his money.

**42.Redeem:-** To recover something mortgaged (अपनी गलती सुधारना या सम्मान पाना)

**Mnemonics:-** re (again ) + de + money

**Synonyms:-** Reclaim, Recoup, Restore

**Antonyms:-** Forfeit, Lose, Abandon

**Eg:-** I save my coupons so that I can redeem them at the supermarket.

The coupon was redeemed
