

**1. Resentment:-** A feeling of anger or unhappiness about something that you think is unfair. (किसी बात पर मन में नाराजगी)

Aman Sir English

➤ **Mnemonics:-** sentiment hurt hue hain to resentment to hoga hi

**Synonyms:-** Bitterness, Anger, Animosity

**Antonyms:-** Comfort, Delight, Calmness

**Eg:-** After several years of dealing with her husband's cheating, bitterness and resentment had built up in the wife's heart.

**2.Pompous:-** Showing that you think you are more important than other people especially by using long and formal words.  
(खुद को बहुत बड़ा समझने वाला)

**Mnemonics:-** pumped( hwa me hona)



**Synonyms:-** Boastful, Bombastic, Overbearing

**Antonyms:-** Humble, Modest, Selfless

**Eg:-** The millionaire was a pompous man who believed he should never wait in line for anything.

**3. Keen:-** Wanting to do something very much (किसी चीज़ में बहुत दिलचस्पी रखना)

**Mnemonics:-** keen to clean

**Antonyms:-** Apathetic, Calm, Indifferent

**Eg:-** You need a keen sense of observation to do well as a private investigator.

**4.Heckle:-** To interrupt discussion by asking difficult questions or rude comments (बोलते हुए बीच में टोकना)

**Synonyms:-** Bully, Interrupt, Rattle

**Antonyms:-** Please, Praise, Support

**Eg:-** As they began to heckle the speaker with insulting gestures, the two protesters were escorted from the building.

**6.Deride:-** To laugh at someone in a way that shows you think they are stupid or of no value (किसी का मजाक उड़ाना)

**Synonyms:-** Disdain, Mock, Ridicule

**Antonyms:-** Admire, Praise, Approve

**Eg:-** The movie critic took every opportunity to deride the A-list actor for making the awful film.

**7.Colossal:-** Extremely Large (आकार में बहुत ही विशाल)

**Mnemonics:-** big collection



**Synonyms:-** Huge, Gigantic, Immense

**Antonyms:-** Little, Miniature, Minute

**Eg:-** It took twelve men to carry the colossal pie to the pie festival.

**8.Exaltation:-** A feeling or state of extreme happiness. (बहुत ज्यादा खुशी या ऊँचा पद)

**Synonyms:-** Acclaim, Glory, Applause

**Antonyms:-** Criticism, Disdain, Scorn

**Eg:-** Tina yelled in exaltation when she saw the car her parents bought her.

**9.Rotate:-** To move something in a circle (अपनी जगह पर गोल घूमना)



**Synonyms:-** Revolve, Twist, Spin

**Antonyms:-** Straighten, Untwist

**Eg:-** The Earth does rotate on its axis near the sun so that each part of the Earth get daylight and night.

**10.Scrutiny:-** Careful and detailed examination of something in order to get information about it. (बहुत बारीकी से जांच-पड़ताल)

**Mnemonics:-** security wale scrutiny karte hain

**Synonyms:-** Analysis, Review, Audit

**Antonyms:-** Glimpse, Sight, Peek

**Eg:-** If you want to fly on an airplane, you should be prepared to deal with scrutiny from the airline personnel.

**11. Competent:-** Able to do something skillfully (काम करने में पूरी तरह काबिल)

**Antonyms:-** Unable, Insufficient, Incompetent

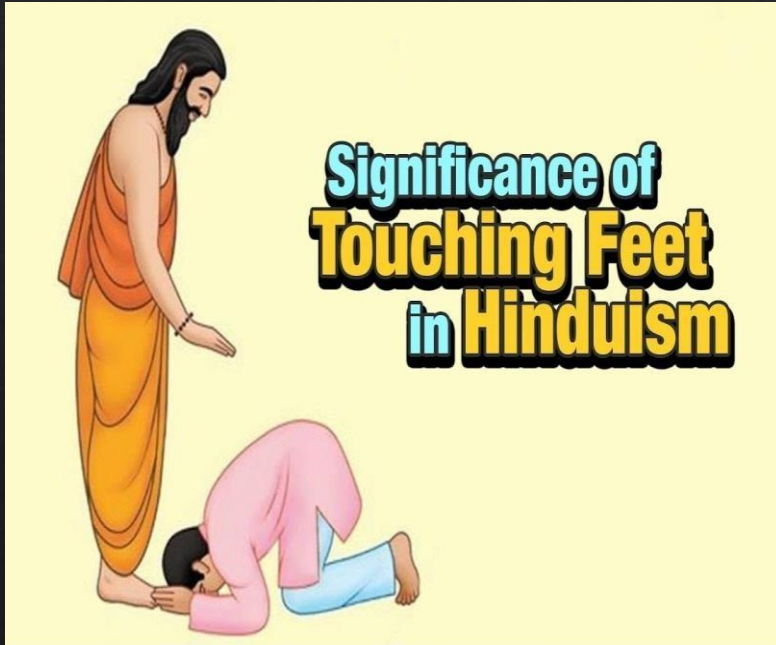
**Eg:-** Although the surgery is a difficult one, a competent surgeon will have no problem performing the operation.

**12.Perpetual:-** continuing forever, never-ending (जो हमेशा चलता रहे, कभी न रुके)

**Synonyms:-** Constant, Permanent, Ceaseless

**Antonyms:-** Bounded, Ceasing, Ended

**Eg:-** My perpetual struggle with alcohol is a strain  
on my marriage.

**13.Pervasive:-** Existing in all parts of a place or thing (जो हर जगह फैला हुआ हो)

**Synonyms:-** Extensive, Omnipresent, Universal

**Antonyms:-** Rare, Scarce, Uncommon

**Eg:-** The media's pervasive coverage of the epidemic has most of the country living in fear.

**14. Asphyxiation:-** To cause someone to be unable to breathe usually resulting into death. (दम घुटने की स्थिति)

**Antonyms:-** Breathe, Inhale

**Eg:-** The deputies pinned Saylor to the ground, and he died of asphyxiation.

**16. Tranquil:-** Relaxed; Peaceful (बिल्कुल शांत और सुकून भरा)

**Mnemonics:-** Trans + quilt



**Synonyms:-** Quiet, Peaceful, Calm

**Antonyms:-** Loud, Boisterous, Noisy

**Eg:-** Since we were the only ones on the beach, we enjoyed a tranquil day.

**17. Discreet:-** Being careful about what one says or does to avoid embarrassing or upsetting others. (सावधान या राज छुपाकर रखने वाला)

**Mnemonics:-** de(not) + secret

**Synonyms:-** Reserved, Foresighted, Canny

**Antonyms:-** Careless, Rash, Indiscreet

**Eg:-** The married politician wanted to keep his affair discreet and hidden.

**18.void:-** Not legal (बिल्कुल खाली या अमान्य)

**Mnemonics:-** Null and void / not valid



**Synonyms:-** Null, Illegal, Ineffective

**Antonyms:-** Valid, Legal, Binding

**Eg:-** The Supreme Court declared the lower court's decision void and overturned the ruling.

**19.Obligatory:-** that you must do (जो करना बहुत ज़रूरी या अनिवार्य हो)

**Mnemonics:-** obligation



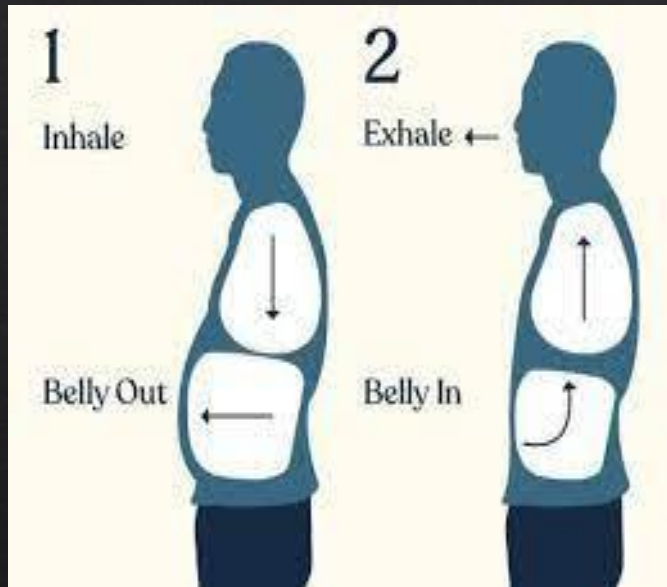
**Synonyms:-** Compulsory, Mandatory, Requisite

## 20.Exhaling:- To emit air (सांस बाहर की तरफ छोड़ना)

**Mnemonics:-** exit air



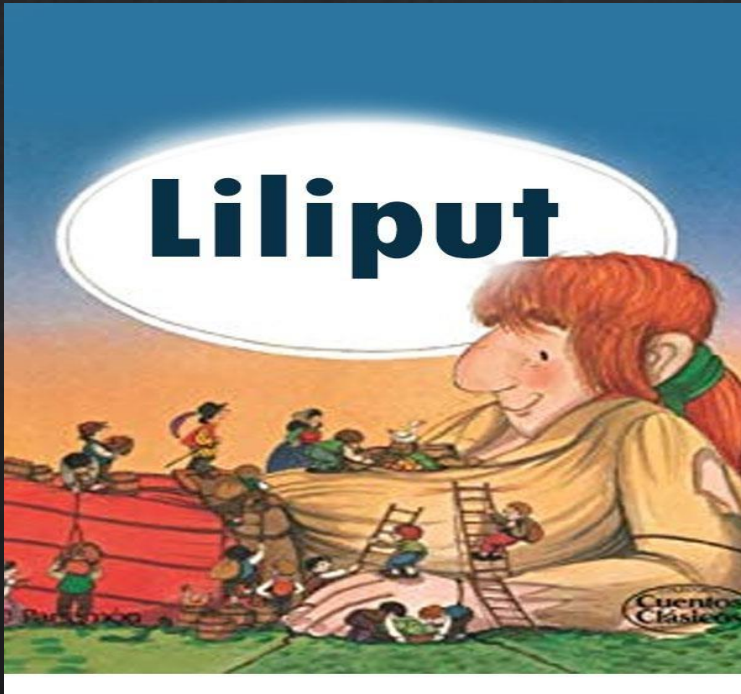
**Synonyms:-** Emitting, Blowing out

**Antonyms:-** Inhale, Inbreathing

**Eg:-** Human beings inhale oxygen into their lungs but exhale carbon dioxide out into the air.

**21. Diminutive:-** Very small (बहुत ही छोटे कद या आकार का)

**Mnemonics:-** divided + minute



**Synonyms:-** Miniature, Punny, Small

**Antonyms:-** Massive, Giant, Vast

**Eg:-** Surrounded by tall skyscrapers, the three-story apartment building looked diminutive.

**22. Brazen:-** Bold and without shame (बिल्कुल बेशर्म या निडर)

Aman Sir English

**Mnemonics:-** beach me brazen



**Synonyms:-** Unashamed, Impudent, Blunt

**Antonyms:-** Ashamed, Shy, Meek

**Eg:-** When the actress took off her blouse in public, she shocked everyone with her brazen behavior.

**23.Defunct:-** No longer existing (जो अब इस्तेमाल में न हो)

**Mnemonics:-** de + function



**Synonyms:-** Obsolete, Extinct, Vanished

**Antonyms:-** Alive, Extant, Existing

**Eg:-** Realizing the elevator was defunct, they were forced to take the stairs instead.

**24. Conspicuous:-** Easy to see or notice (जो आसानी से साफ दिखाई दे)

**Mnemonics:-** konsi pi ke aaya hai tu ye to conspicuous hai



**Synonyms:-** Obvious, Prominent, Noticeable

**Antonyms:-** Subtle, Hidden, Obscure

**Eg:-** Standing beside the skinny models, the fat girl looked very conspicuous.

**25. Antiquated:-** From the past, old fashioned (पुराने जमाने का या आउटडेटेड)

**Synonyms:-** Outdated, Ancient, Outworn

**Antonyms:-** Modern, Current, Recent

**Eg:-** Unfortunately, the practice of mailing handwritten letters seems to have become quite antiquated.

**26. Adulterated:-** To make a substance impure by adding something else to it (मिलावट किया हुआ)

**Eg.:-** I am not paying for the draft beer because I watched the bartender adulterate it with water.

**27. Worn:-** Damaged from too much use (पुराना या घिसा हुआ)

**Eg:-** The worn shoes should be thrown away since Chris has walked holes in the bottom of the pair.

**Antonyms:-** Improve, Ameliorate, Intensify

**Eg:-** Since Abha stopped attending piano practice,  
her playing skill has started to deteriorate.

**29. Enchanting:-** Captivating or charming (मन मोह लेने वाला)

**Mnemonics:-** chatting karke enchanting

**Synonyms:-** Appealing, Magical, Seductive

**Antonyms:-** Repugnant, Boring, Revolting

**Eg:-** It was enchanting to have a wedding in a massive cathedral that was filled with ancient architecture and art.

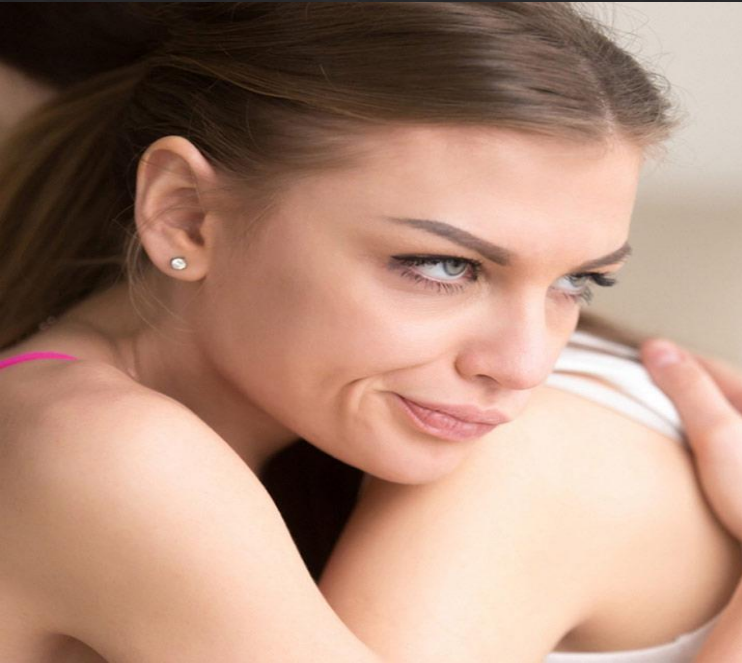

**Eg:-** Despite her wealth, the old lady was a callous woman who never gave to anyone in need.

**31. Retrogression:-** The act or an instance of going back to an earlier and lower level especially of intelligence or behavior. (पीछे की ओर गिरना या अवनति)

**Antonyms:-** Advancement, Evolution, Growth

**Eg:-** When Glenn became a millionaire, he swore he would never retrogress to a life of poverty.

**32.Specify:-** To state something clearly and accurately (खास तौर पर साफ-साफ बताना)

**Mnemonics:-** specific/ special

**Synonyms:-** Define, Prescribe, Dictate

**Antonyms:-** Disregard, Forget, Overlook

**Eg:-** In order to make sure everyone knew the details of the plan, the commander decided to specify the role of each individual soldier on his team.

**33.Frivolous:-** Of no real worth (हल्का या बिना मतलब की बात)

**Mnemonics:-** free things no value

**Synonyms:-** Worthless, Unimportant, Insignificant

**Antonyms:-** Important, Significant, Eventful

**Eg:-** Students who consider test instructions to be frivolous often fail exams.

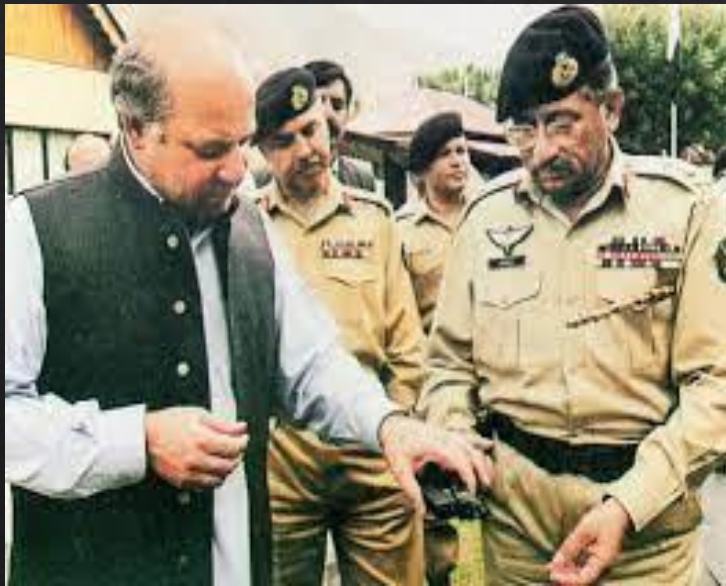

**Eg:-** The students have decided to conspire to steal the test papers.

**Eg:-** The room was full of erudite scholars who made the discussion on astronomy fun and interesting.



**36. Bewitching:-** Charming and attractive in a seductive way  
(जादुई रूप से आकर्षित करने वाला)

**Synonyms:-** Charismatic, Alluring, Enchanting

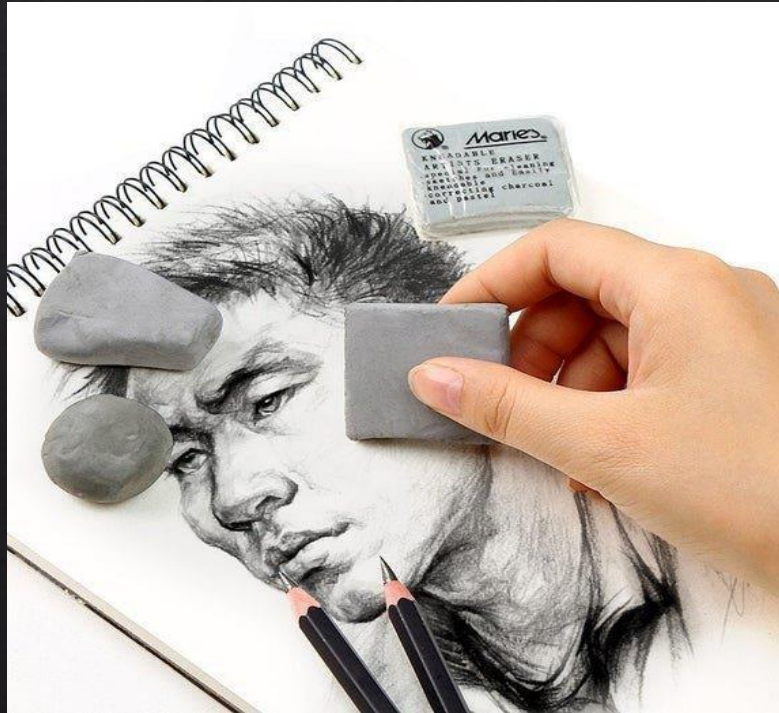
**Antonyms:-** Repulsive, Repugnant, Revolting

**Eg:-** Since the text was written in a foreign language, I could not comprehend its meaning.

**39. Itemize:-** To produce a detailed list of something (चीजों की अलग-अलग लिस्ट बनाना)

**Synonyms:-** Enumerate, List, Inventory

**Antonyms:-** Generalize, Guess

**Eg:-** I like to keep track of my expenses when on vacation, so I itemize the costs of the trip and see where I spend the most money.

**40. Assuagement:-** To ease, To lessen (दर्द या गुस्से में मिलने वाली शांति)

**Eg:-** To assuage his wife's grief, he took her on a tour of Europe.

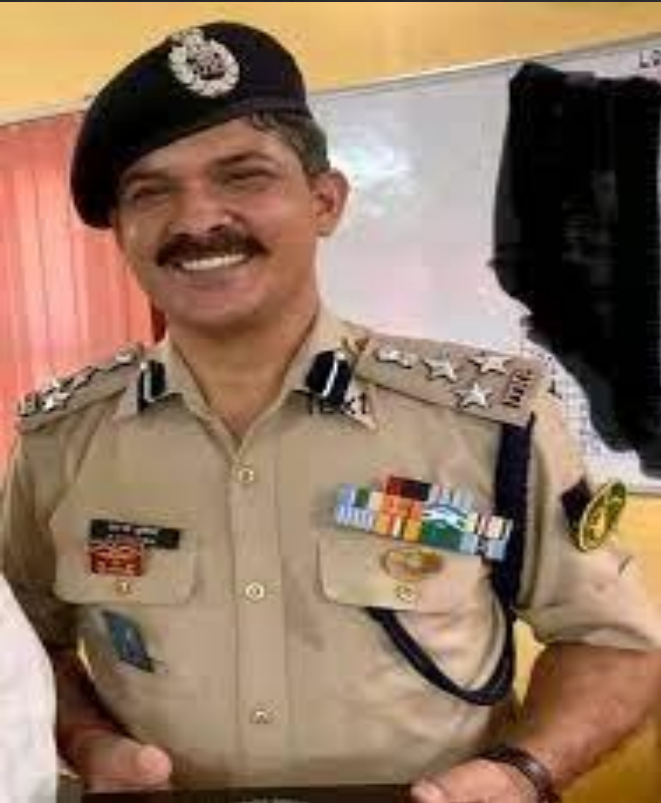

**Eg:-** Since the journey is perilous, be sure to bring a first-aid kit.

**43.Ponder:-** To think about something carefully or for a long time  
(किसी बात पर गहराई से सोचना)

**Mnemonics:-** wonder / ponder before jumping in the pond



**Synonyms:-** Consider, Evaluate, Weigh

**Antonyms:-** Discard, Neglect, Disregard

**Eg.:-** My father took a moment to ponder before signing the deeds of our ancestral home.

**44.Mitigate:-** Make less severe or painful (किसी दुख या परेशानी को कम करना)

**Synonyms:-** Alleviate, Relieve, Ease

**Antonyms:-** Harm, Injure, Hurt

**Eg:-** The doctor gave me a prescription to mitigate the pain.

**Eg.:-** The professor refused to comment on the erroneous description of the historical events in the journal.

**Eg.:-** Colonists protested the abominable tax laws that were keeping them poor and in debt.

**Antonyms:-** Rich, Opulent, Affluent

**Eg.:-** If you do not save your money when you are young, you may be destitute in your old age.

**50. Forgery:-** A fabricated replication of something meant to appear like the real thing (फर्जी या नकली हस्ताक्षर/दस्तावेज)

**Antonyms:-** Natural, Raw, Crude
