Lend your money and lose your friend	(उधार देकर दोस्ती खराब करना) Lending money to a friend will create quarrels between the two.	Better to wear out than to rust out:	(बेकार बैठने से काम बेहतर है) It is better to work hard and die than to sit idle.
Cross the stream where it is shallowest	(सबसे आसान तरीका अपनाना) Choose the easiest or safest way to do something.	A ship in the harbour is safe, but that's not what a ship is for	(जोखिम उठाना ही असली जीवन है) Get out of your comfort zone to grow and fulfill your potential
Appearances can be deceptive	(बाहरी दिखावा धोखा हो सकता है) Things or people may not be as good or as bad as they look on the outside.	Right on the button	(बिल्कुल सटीक या सही बात) Get Exactly right or exactly on time.

A drowning man will clutch at a straw	(डूबते को तिनके का सहारा) When someone is in big trouble, they will try anything to get help, even if it might not work.

Not fit to hold candle to	(किसी की तुलना में बहुत घटिया) To be far inferior to someone or something in quality, ability, or worth.
Skeleton in the closet	(परिवार का कोई शर्मनाक राज) A hidden or embarrassing secret
Great minds think alike	(बुद्धिमान लोग एक जैसा सोचते हैं) it is said when two people have the same opinion or make the same choice.
Single blessedness	(अविवाहित रहने का सुख) Single blessedness
Grind to a halt	(धीरे-धीरे पूरी तरह रुक जाना) To slow down gradually and then stop completely.
