Dicing with death	(जान जोखिम में डालकर काम करना) to take extreme risks that could result in death.
(take) In stride	(पेशानी को आसानी से झेलना) Face problems or criticism calmly and confidently without getting discouraged.
Star crossed lovers	(बदकिस्मत प्रेमी जोड़ा) Two people who are deeply in love but separated by fate or circumstances.
Dribs and drabs	(थोड़ा थोड़ा करके आना) In small amounts or irregular intervals, not all at once.
off one's rocker	(दिमाग से पागल होना) Behaving in a crazy, irrational, or very strange way.
Fringe benefits	(तनख्वाह के अलावा सुविधा) Extra advantages or perks in addition to a regular salary, such as allowances, bonuses, or facilities.
Beard the lion in his den	(खतरे में जाकर चुनौती देना) To bravely confront a powerful or dangerous person in their own place.
To be off base	(गलत समझना या भटक जाना) To be wrong or mistaken about something.
Jack up the rates	(कीमतें अचानक बहुत बढ़ाना) To increase prices or charges sharply.
Cast the first stone	(सबसे पहले किसी पर आरोप लगाना) Blame others first even when you also have faults.
Token strike	(विरोध में छोटी हड़ताल करना) A short or symbolic strike meant to show protest, not to stop work permanently.
Smoke and mirrors	(धोखा देने वाली चालाकी) Irrelevant or misleading details intended to obscure the truth of a situation.
Collision course	(टकराव की तरफ बढ़ना) Moving toward a serious conflict or unavoidable clash.
Out and about	(बाहर घूमना फिरना) Being away from home and busy with

	activities, such as work, shopping, or social tasks.; active and socializing
Pound of flesh	(बेहमी से पूरा हक माँगना) A harsh or exact payment or punishment, demanded without mercy.
Jump through hoops	(मुश्किल शर्तें पूरी करने पड़ना) To go through many difficult or unnecessary steps to achieve something.
Every nook and cranny	(हर कोना कोना छानना) every small corner or hidden part
Whatever floats your boat	(जो तुम्हें खुशी दे) something that makes you happy
Tread on someone's toes	(किसी को नाराज़ कर देना) To offend, upset, or annoy someone, usually by interfering in their work or personal space.
In a brown study	(गहरी सोच में डूब जाना) Being lost in deep thought or absent-minded.
All hands on deck	(सबका मदद के लिए जुटना) A situation where everyone must help or be involved, especially during an emergency or important task.
On the same wavelength	(एक जैसी सोच रखना) having similar ideas and understanding each other well
Fall off the radar	(नज़रों से ओझल होना) To stop being noticed or talked about due to absence or inactivity.; become unnoticed
Alma mater	(पढ़ाई की पुरानी संस्था) the school, college, or university that one attended or in which one has studied
On the warpath	(बहुत गुस्से में लड़ने) To be angry and ready to fight
Not worth his salt	(काम का नहीं होना) Lacking the skill, ability, or effort expected of someone in a particular role.

Mum's the word	(बात गुप्त रखना है) A request or promise to keep something completely secret.
Last laugh	(आखिर में जीत हासिल करना) to succeed or win after being laughed at or doubted by others
Run riot	(बेकाबू होकर हंगामा मचाना) to behave in a wild way without any control
Break the bank	(बहुत ज्यादा पैसा खर्च करना) To cost too much money or use up all one's savings.
Get your walking papers	(नौकरी से निकाल दिया जाना) To be dismissed or fired from a job.
Take the wind out of someone's sails	(किसी का जोश खत्म करना) To suddenly reduce someone's confidence, enthusiasm, or advantage.
Flog a dead horse	(बेकार कोशिश करते रहना) waste energy on something that has no chance of succeeding.
Show a clean pair of heels	(बहुत तेज भाग कर निकलना) To run away quickly or leave others far behind, especially in a race or chase.
Cast pearls before swine	(नासमझ को कीमती चीज देना) To present something valuable to one who does not recognize its worth
Slip of the tongue	(बोलने में गलती होना) a mistake in speech (or writing)

Throw in the towel	(हार मानकर कोशिश छोड़ना) To give up or admit defeat, especially after trying hard.
Take to task	(गलती पर किसी को डाँटना) To criticize or scold someone strongly for a mistake or wrongdoing.
Look before you leap	(सावधानी पूर्वक कार्य करना) don't be reckless and impulsive
Cut your coat according to your cloth	(आमदनी के हिसाब से खर्च करना) live within your income or means
Steal someone's thunder	(दूसरे की तारीफ खुद लेना) to prevent someone from having success or getting attention, praise, etc.
by fits and starts	(रुक रुक कर काम करना) Irregular activity with pauses and interruptions.
A thorn in the flesh	(लगातार परेशान करने वाली समस्या) A constant or persistent cause of annoyance, frustration, or trouble
pull the wool over someone's eyes	(किसी को धोखा देकर ठगना) to deceive someone
Leave in the lurch	(मुश्किल में अकेला छोड़ देना) At leave someone in helpless condition
know the ropes	(काम करने का तरीका जानना) to know all the ways and means to get something done
let sleeping dogs lie	(पुरानी बात को ना छेड़ना) To leave a person or situation alone if they might cause
