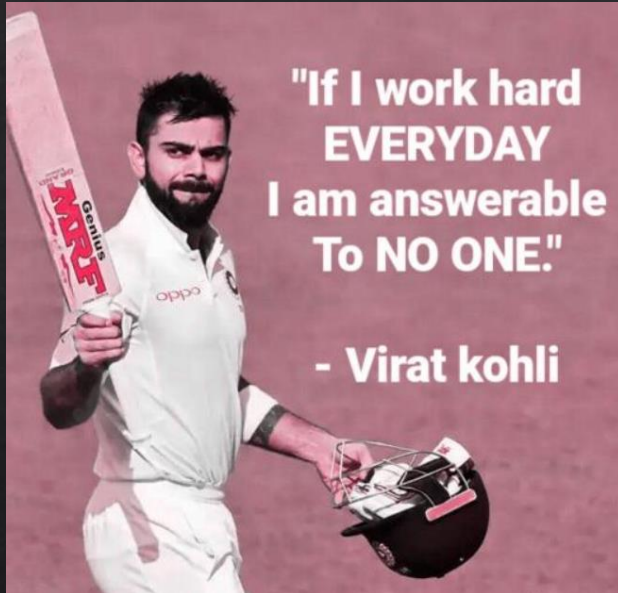

Account for:- To explain the reason for
(जबाब देना/कारण बताना)



Eg:- These new features account for the computer's higher price.

Answer for:- to be answerable for
(किसी गलत बात की जिम्मेदारी लेना)



Eg:- He will have to answer for the bad performance of the team in the tournament.

Ask after:- to inquire about (especially health)
(किसी के बारे में पूछताछ करना)



Eg:- Whenever she meets me,
she always asks after me.

Attend on:- to serve (सेवा करना)



Eg:- Anand has many servants to attend on him.

Back out:- to choose not to do something agreed
(किसी सहमत बात से पीछे हटना)



Eg:- You should not back out from your promise.

Bear down:- to press down heavily (दबाना या कुचलना)



Eg:- The snow bore down on the roof.

Blow over:- to pass without harming
(बिना नुकसान पहुँचाए गुजर जाना)



Eg:- Don't worry the crisis are likely to blow over.

Bound for:- going to a destination (किसी स्थान को जाता हुआ) Aman Sir English



Eg:- She was on a plane bound for Moscow when she got sick.

Break down (of machinery):- to stop working
(काम करना बंद कर देना)



Eg:- The bus broke down on the way so Komal could not reach the station on time.

Break down:- to lose control emotionally (रोने लगना)

Aman Sir English



Eg:- The old man broke down when heard news of his son's death.

Break into:- to enter illegally (जबरदस्ती घुसना)



Eg:- Thieves broke into his house yesterday and stole many valuable items.

Break out:- to start (of disease or war etc.)
(अचानक फैलना)



Eg:- Nipha virus broke out in Kerala.

Break up (of relationship):- to end/separate
(अलग हो जाना)



Eg:- Hrithik Roshan and Sussanne Khan broke up after 14 year's long relationship.

Bring about:- to cause to happen (होने का कारण होना)



Eg:- This injury on my leg brought about skin infection to my whole body.

Bring down:- to reduce (कम करना)

Back up:- give support or encouragement (सहायता देना) Aman Sir English



Eg:- She always backs me up whenever I need help.

Bring up:- to raise, to rear (पालन पोषण करना)



Eg:- After My parents death in an accident, I was brought up by my brother.

Call for:- to demand (मांग करना)



Eg:- The opposition party called for the minister's resignation after the scandal came into light

Call off:- to cancel (रद्द कर देना)



Eg:- Owing to heavy rain the match has been called off.

Call on:- to pay a visit (जाकर मुलाकात करना)



Eg:- As we were in the area, we called on my sister-in-law.

Call up:- to recall (याद करना)



Eg:- His brother's photo called up the memories of their childhood.

Carry on:- to continue (जारी रखना)



Eg:- Her bravery has given her the will to carry on with her life and her work.

Carry out:- complete or fulfil /to execute
(किसी कार्य को पूरा करना)



Eg:- Army men carried out all the orders given by the authorities without any questions.

Catch up (with):- to stop being behind (बराबरी पर आ जाना) Aman Sir English



Eg:- Though Sumit took admission in mid session, he caught up with his classmates in final exams.

Clear someone of:- to free from blame (आरोप मुक्त करना) Aman Sir English



Eg:- The Court has cleared of all the charges leveled against him.

Come about:- to happen (घटित होना)



Eg:- How did the problem come about in the first place?

Come across:- to meet by chance (अचानक मुलाकात होना) Aman Sir English



Eg:- Yesterday, while wandering in the market, I came across my old childhood friend.

Come off:- to be successful (सफल होना)



Eg:- That deal came off exactly as I expected.

Cordon off :- to seal a place (किसी स्थान की घेराबंदी करना)



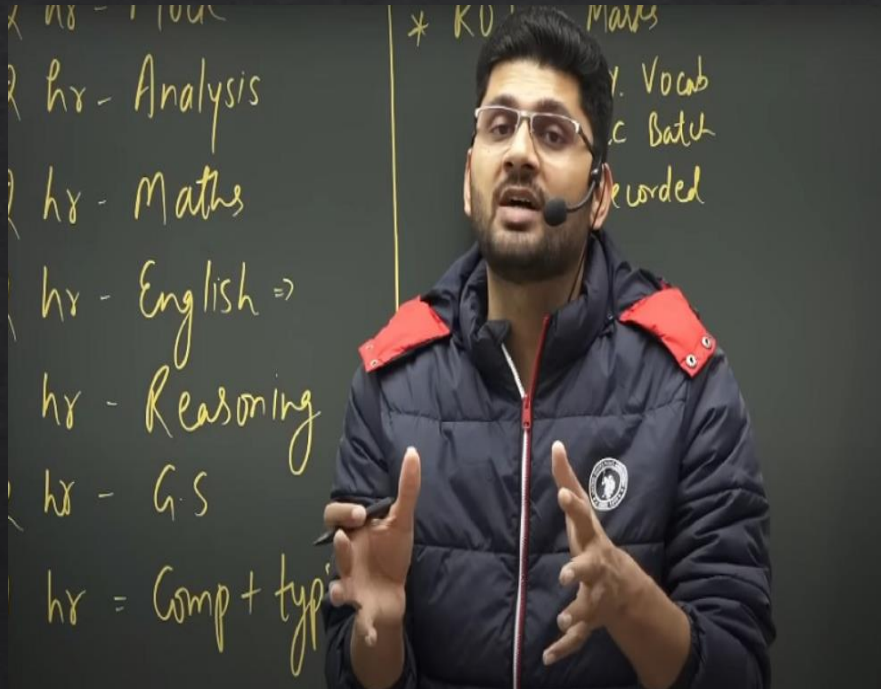
Eg:- The Police cordoned off the area, where the terrorist attack took place.

Count on :- to depend on, to rely on (निर्भर होना, भरोसा करना) Aman Sir English



Eg:- You can count on your best friend to support you in difficult times.

Cut out for :- to be suitable for (किसी कार्य के लिए उपयुक्त होना) Aman Sir English



Eg:- I am cut out for the profession of teaching.

Deal in :- to have business of (किसी चीज का व्यापार करना)

Aman Sir English



Eg:- Mukesh Ambani deals in oil and telecom industry.

Deal out :- to distribute (वितरित करना)



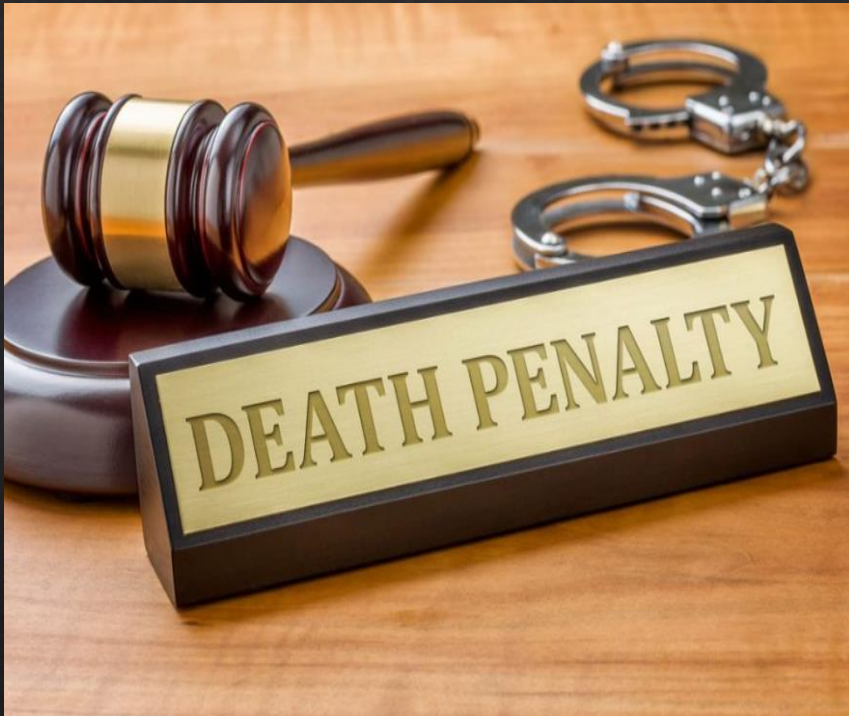
Eg:- The profits were dealt out among the investors.

Deal with :- to treat with a person (किसी से व्यवहार करना) Aman Sir English



Eg:- My mother deals with everyone in a very kind way.

Do away with :- to abolish/murder (समाप्त कर देना)



Eg:- The country decided to do away with the death penalty.

Drop in/by :- to visit informally (बिना पूर्व सूचना आ जाना) Aman Sir English



Eg:- I thought I'd drop in on you while I was passing.

Egg on :- to motivate /persuade someone (प्रेरित करना)



Eg:- They spectators egged on the runner to finish the race.

Fall for :- fall in love with (आकर्षित होना)



Eg:- He fell for her the moment their eyes met.

Fall out (with) :- to quarrel with (झगड़ा होना)



Eg:- Two people had a fall out over a trivial matter.

Feel like : to be excited to do something
(किसी काम को करने का इकछुक होना)



Eg:- A.R. Rahman loves singing, he feels like to sing it all the time.
