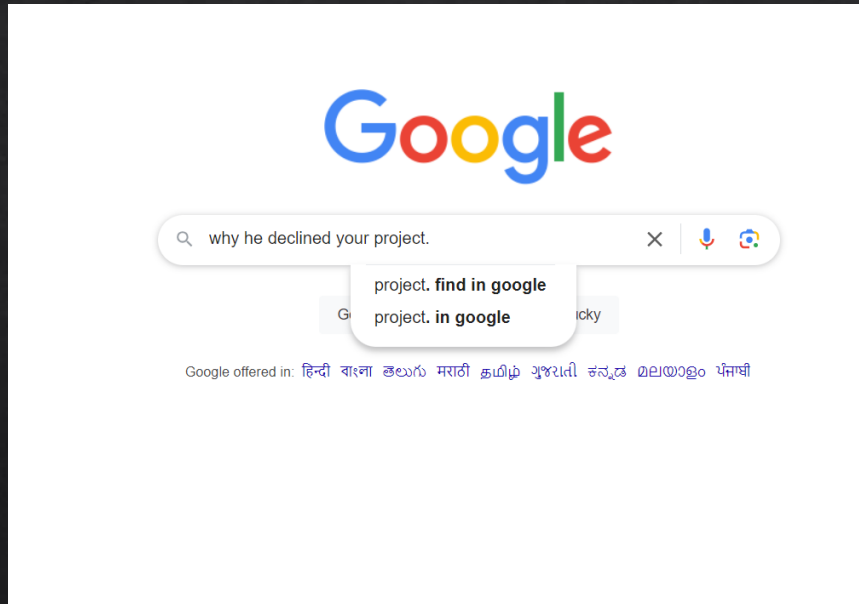


look (something) up :- to try to find a piece of information by looking in a book or on a computer. (खोजने या समझने की कोशिश करना)

Look over :- to examine (जांच करना)



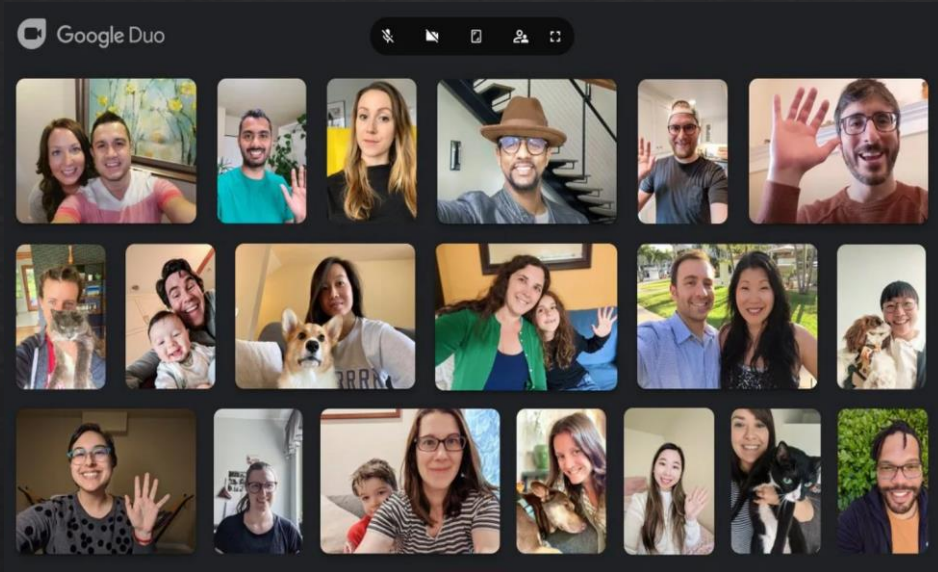
Eg:- He is giving the motorbike a thorough look-over.

Make do with :- to manage with limited means
(काम चलाना)



Eg:- My father could not afford to give me a new bike so I had to make do with his old moped.

Make for :- to make something possible or help in some process (किसी बात में सहायक होना)



Eg:- Internet makes for easy interview process .

Make out :- to understand something / make physical relations (किसी व्यक्ति या चीज को समझना)

Eg:- I am trying to make out what he was trying to say.

Make the most of :- to get maximum benefit of an opportunity (पूरा पूरा लाभ उठाना)

Eg:- We will make the most of this opportunity.

Occur to :- to understand something (समझ में आना)

Part with :- to leave or renounce something
(किसी चीज़ को छोड़ना या त्यागना)

Eg:- You need to part with your
some luggage as it is creating

Part from :- leave or separate from someone
(किसी को छोड़ना या अलग होना)

Eg:- Shalini parted from her boyfriend after 10 year's long relationship.

Pull off :- to succeed in doing something difficult
(किसी कठिन कार्य को करने में सफल होना)

Eg:- Everybody was surprised to see how virat pulled off that catch.

Pull up :- to criticize (आलोचना करना)



Eg:- Monu was pulled up severely by the manager for his procrastinating behavior.

Put across :- to convey one's ideas to others successfully (अपने विचारों को सफलतापूर्वक व्यक्त करना)

Aman Sir English



Eg:- In the meeting he put across his ideas very effectively.

Put aside :- to save for future or to avoid something
(भविष्य के लिए बचाना या उपेक्षा करना)



Eg:- It is always advised to put aside some money by our parents.

Put up with :- to tolerate something (सहन करना)



Eg:- I can't put up with my this behaviour of my classmates anymore .

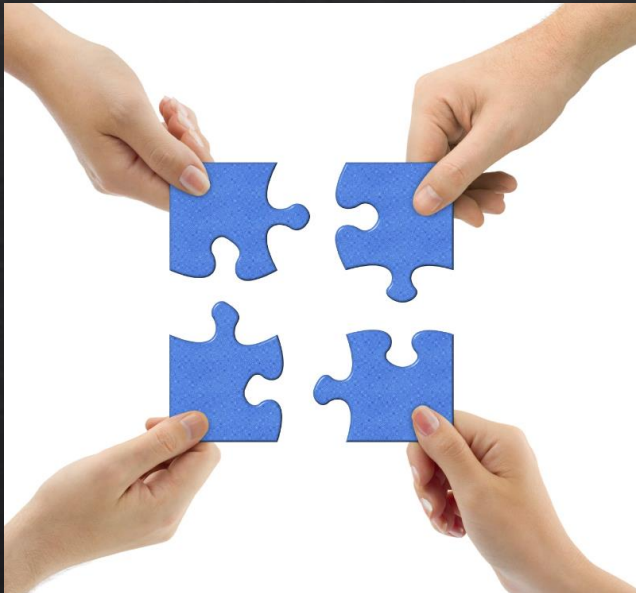
Put up at :- to stay at a place (ठहरना)

Aman Sir English



Eg:- We put up at a cheap road side motel for the night.

Put together :- make something by assembling different parts or people



Eg:- We have put together all the parts of this puzzle and now it is complete.

Put down :- to suppress or criticize
(दबाना या आलोचना करना)



Eg:- The brave queen put down her enemy bravely.

Pour out :- to express one's feelings without restrain (अपनी भावनाओं को स्वयत्त करना)

Eg:- I poured out all my deepest emotions before my best friend.

Put off :- to postpone (स्थगित करना)



Eg:- The judge put off the hearing for 2 weeks.

Put on :- to wear clothes/ gain weight
(कपड़े पहनना या वजन का बढ़ना)



Eg:- I have to put 3 jackets to save myself from this cold weather.

Put out :- to extinguish (बुझाना)



Eg:- At last, fire brigade arrived and put out the fire.

Put through :- to make someone feel something unpleasant (किसी को मुसीबत में डालना)

Eg:- He tried to put his friend through the difficult task but repented later.

Run down :- to criticize / to decline
(आलोचना करना या कमजोर पढ़ना)



Eg:- It's not fair to constantly run down other people.

Run into (problem) :- to get into some difficulty
(समस्या में पढ़ जाना)

Aman Sir English



Eg:- I just wanted to help him,
but I didn't know I would run
into this pathetic situation.

Run into :- to meet someone by chance
(अचानक मुलाकात होना)

Aman Sir English



Eg:- It was really unexpected to run into my old college friend in market.

Run over :- to crush by a vehicle (वाहन से कुचलना)



Eg:- The old man was run over by a speeding car.

Set about :- to initiate efforts for something
(प्रयास प्रारंभ करना)



Eg:- He set about studying to crack the exam this year.

Set up :- to establish (स्थापित करना)

Eg:- Aashirvaad atta has set up one of its branches in Palwal.

Sit around/about :- to spend time without any activity (खाली बेठना)



Eg:- They just sit around idly while the others did all the work.

(Fate) Smile on someone :- to make someone lucky or successful

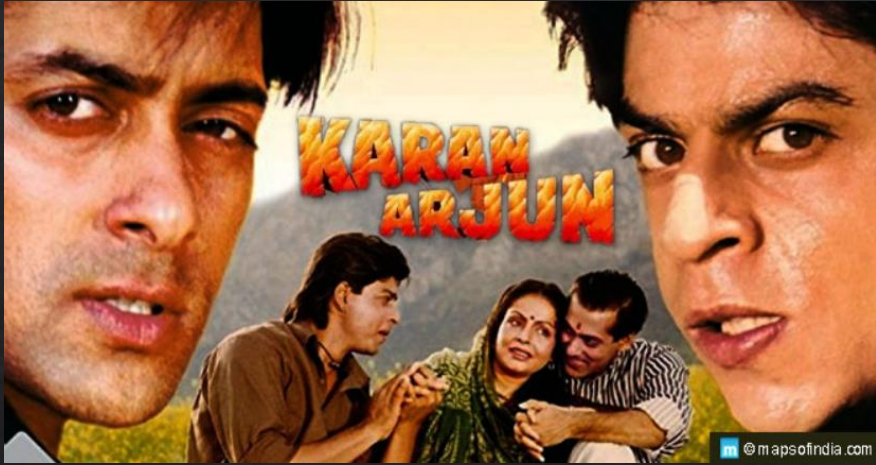
Eg:- Destiny has smiled on Ravi as he has cracked exam without preparing for it.

See off :- To take leave of (विदा लेना)



Eg:- We came to the airport to see off our friends.

Stand by :- To remain loyal/ to be ready
(समर्थन के लिए तैयार रहना)



Eg:- I will stand by you through thick and thin.

Taken aback :- To be surprised (अचंभित हो जाना)



Eg:- The boss was taken aback when his employee slapped him in his office.

Take after :- To resemble a close, older relative
(किसी करीबी, बड़े रिश्तेदार जैसा दिखना)

Aman Sir English



Eg:- He has taken after his father.

Take over :- To take responsibility for or control of
(पदभार संभालना)



Eg:- A new manager has taken over the key post.

Turn down :- Reject an offer, invitation, etc.
(इन्कार या अस्वीकार करना)



Eg:- They offered her the job,
but she turned down the offer.

Turn out (to be) :- To prove to be (साबित होना)



Eg:- She turned out to be a lazy and untrained employee

Wear off :- become less effective
(हल्का या कमजोर पड़ जाना)

Aman Sir English



Eg:- The effect of the painkiller began to wear off after a few hours

Weigh down :- burden with responsibilities, duties, etc. (जिम्मेदारियों, कर्तव्यों आदि का बोझ)



Eg:- You should not weigh down your children by so much pressure of studies .

Zero in on :- To concentrate on (ध्यान केन्द्रित करना)



Eg:- Meditation can help us zero in on problems that otherwise might not be found.
