<b>Zealous</b>	Using great energy and Enthusiasm
<b>Feeble</b>	With no energy or power, Weak
<b>Hostile</b>	Having very strong feelings against somebody/something
<b>Insidious</b>	Something unpleasant or Dangerous, Something gradually and secretly causing harm
<b>Abound</b>	To exist in large numbers
<b>Peruse</b>	To read through something, especially in order to find the part you are interested in
<b>Yield</b>	To give up under pressure; surrender.
<b>Consent</b>	To agree to something
<b>Vain</b>	too proud of appearance , abilities or achievements etc
<b>Vain</b>	Not producing a desired result
<b>Interlinked</b>	joined or connected together, with the parts that are joined often having an effect on each other
<b>Cautious</b>	Someone who is cautious avoids risks
<b>Intriguing</b>	- to make somebody very interested and wanting to know more
<b>Spurious</b>	Based on false reasoning or information, and therefore not to be trusted
<b>Verbose</b>	Using or containing more words than necessary
<b>Consequence</b>	A result of a particular action or situation, often one that is bad or not convenient
<b>Unbiased</b>	Able to judge fairly
<b>Utilitarian</b>	Designed to be useful rather than decorative
<b>Inevitable</b>	Certain to happen; Unavoidable

<b>Degradation</b>	The situation in which people are made to feel they have no value
<b>Certain</b>	Having no doubt or knowing Exactly that something is true
<b>Tedious</b>	Boring and rather frustrating
<b>Benevolent</b>	Giving money or help to people or organizations that need it
<b>Incredible</b>	Impossible, or very difficult to believe,Extremely good
<b>Vendetta</b>	A long and violent argument between people or families
<b>Adamant</b>	Determined in character, action, or ideas
<b>Treacherous</b>	A person who deceives someone who trusts them, or has no loyalty
<b>Sever</b>	To break or separate, especially by cutting
<b>Apathy</b>	A feeling of listlessness and dissatisfaction arising from a lack of occupation or Excitement.
<b>Diligent</b>	Careful and using a lot of effort
<b>Temerity</b>	Extremely confident behavior that shows a lack of respect and is considered rude
<b>Vulnerable</b>	Able to be easily physically or Mentally hurt, Influenced, or Attacked
<b>Immerse</b>	To put something or someone completely under the surface of a liquid
<b>Resplendent</b>	Having a very bright or beautiful appearance
<b>Delight</b>	The pleasures of something
<b>Absorbed</b>	Giving all your attention to something

<b>Genial</b>	Extremely nice and happy
<b>Jargon</b>	special words and phrases that are used by particular groups of people, especially in their work
<b>Fierce</b>	physically violent and frightening
<b>Misanthropic</b>	not liking other people
<b>Cheered</b>	to give a loud shout of approval or encouragement:
<b>Mitigation</b>	the act of reducing how harmful, unpleasant, or bad something is
<b>Transgression</b>	an action that breaks a law or rule
<b>Comprehensive</b>	complete and including everything that is necessary
<b>Crooked</b>	not forming a straight line, or having many bends:
<b>Earnestly</b>	in a serious and determined way, often without humour
<b>Enervate</b>	to make someone feel weak and without energy
<b>Exuberance</b>	the quality of feeling energetic, or the behaviour of someone who feels this way
<b>Judicious</b>	having or showing reason and good judgment in making decisions

<b>Extol</b>	to praise something or someone very much
<b>Gentle</b>	calm, kind, or soft
<b>Committed</b>	loyal and willing to give your time and energy to something that you believe in
<b>Predicament</b>	an unpleasant situation that is difficult to get out of
<b>Extinct</b>	not active or existing now
<b>Audacity</b>	courage or confidence of a kind that other people find shocking or rude
<b>Glorify</b>	to praise and honour God or a person
<b>Mortal</b>	those who will die
<b>Modest</b>	not large in size or amount, or not expensive
<b>Sustainable</b>	able to continue over a period of time
<b>Predators</b>	an animal that hunts, kills, and eats other animals
<b>Fragile</b>	Breakable
<b>Credible</b>	able to be believed or trusted
<b>Devastating</b>	causing a lot of damage or destruction
<b>Connote</b>	If a word, object, or situation connotes something, it makes you think of a feeling or an idea that is more than its basic meaning
