When his father came home, he was busy with and engaged in his work.

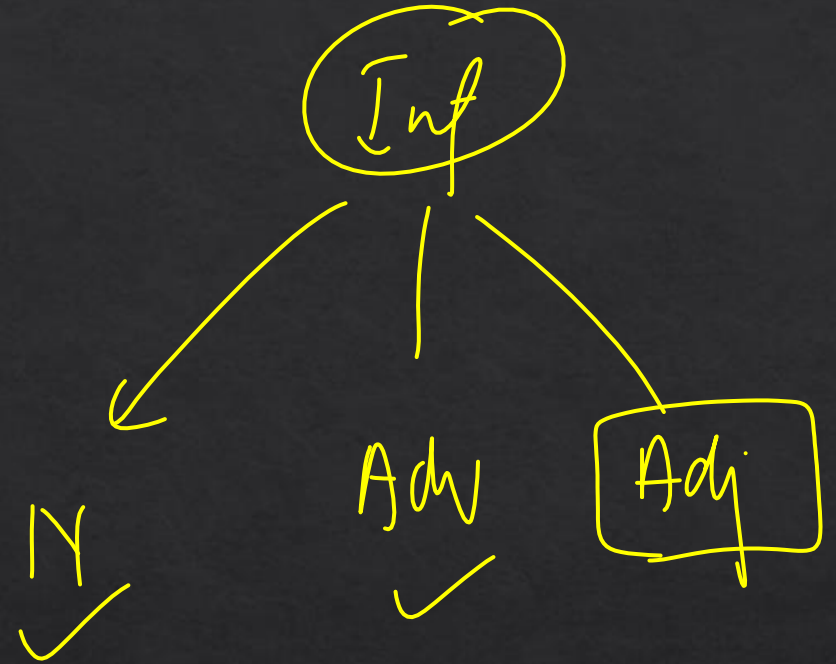

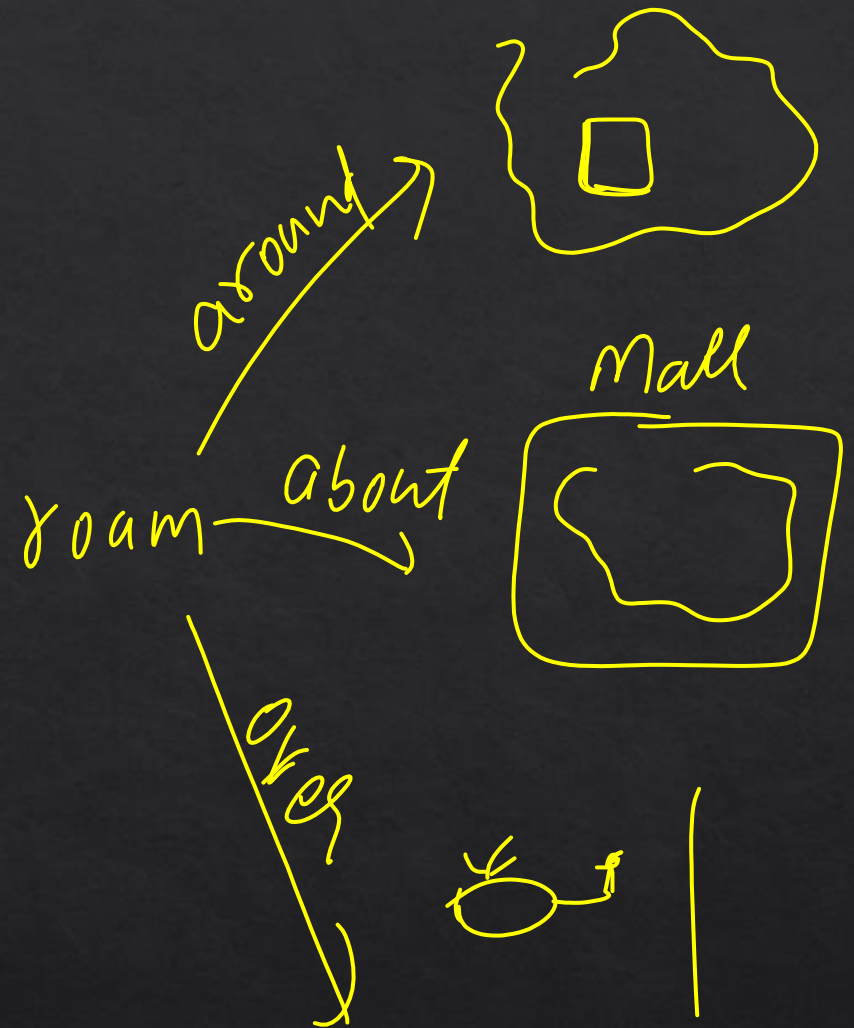
