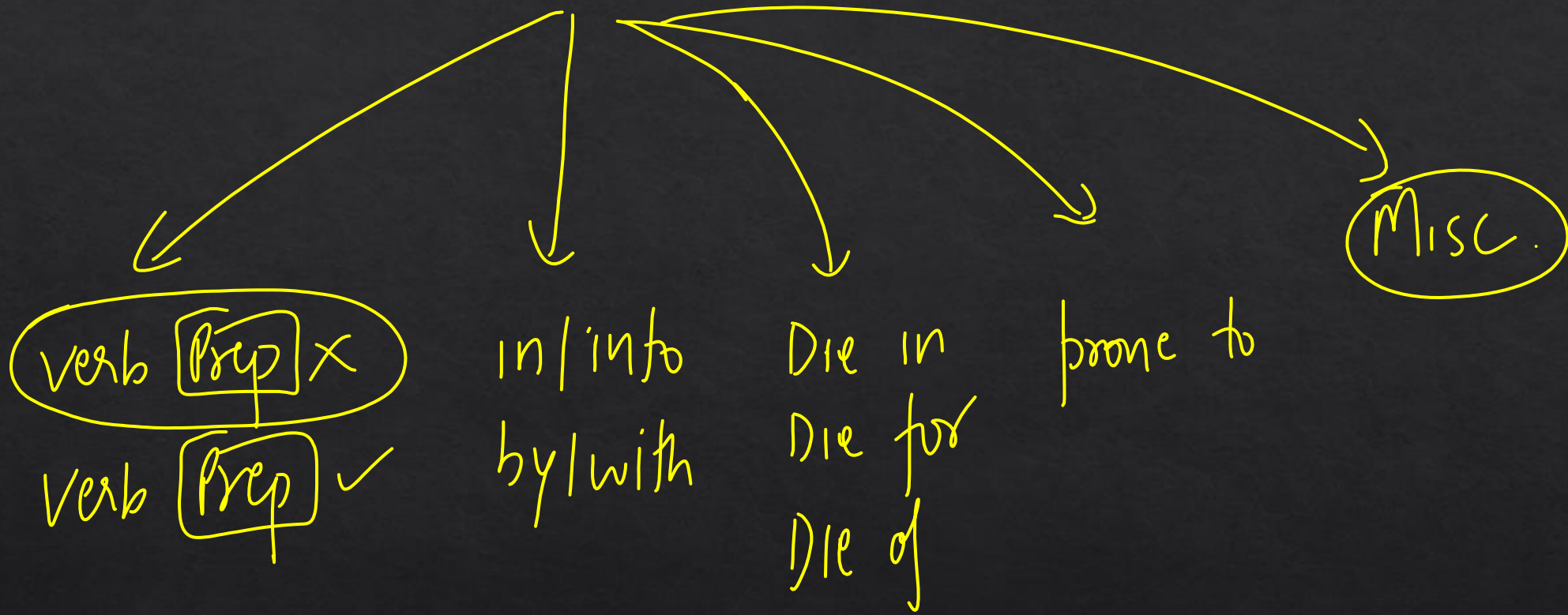


PREPOSITION

On – train, bus, plane, ship etc.

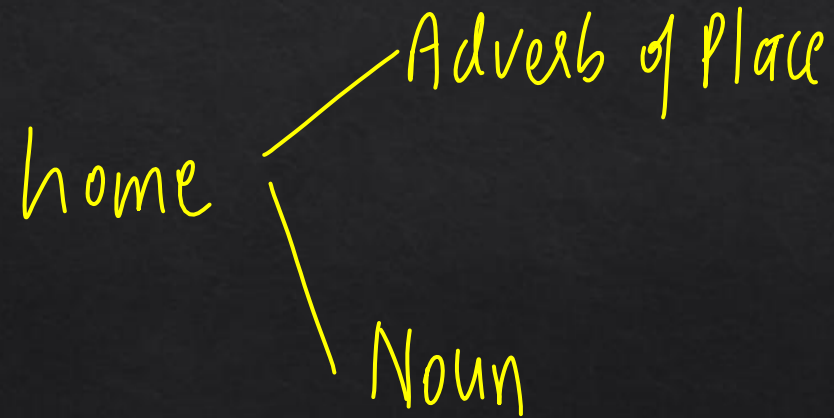
In- helicopter, car, auto, boat etc

Note:- If an infinitive is used to describe a noun or pronoun, that noun or pronoun must be the object of the verb used in the infinitive. If it is not so, use the necessary preposition after the infinitive.

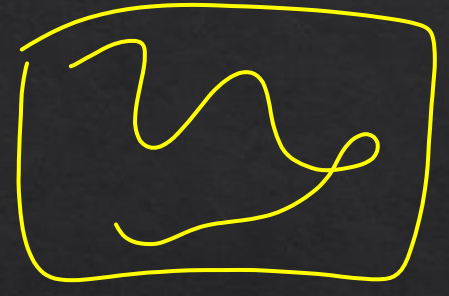
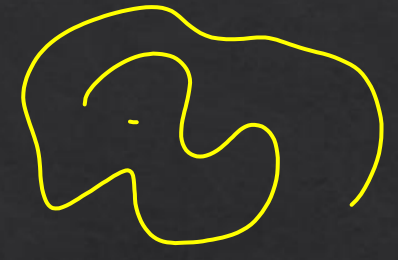
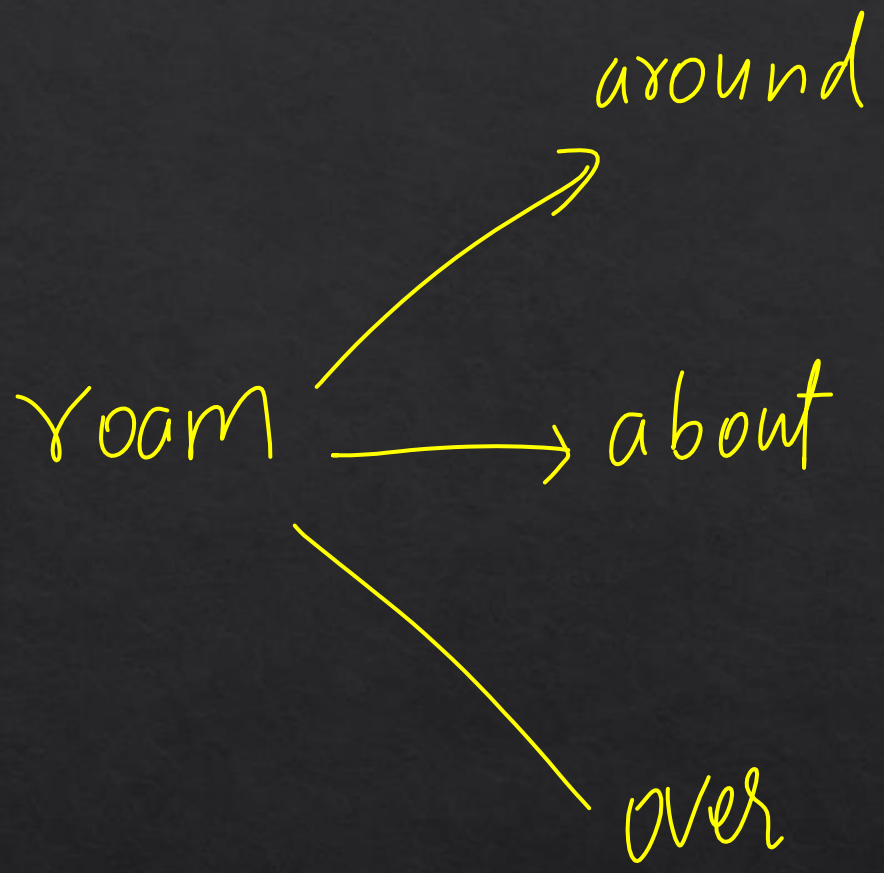
