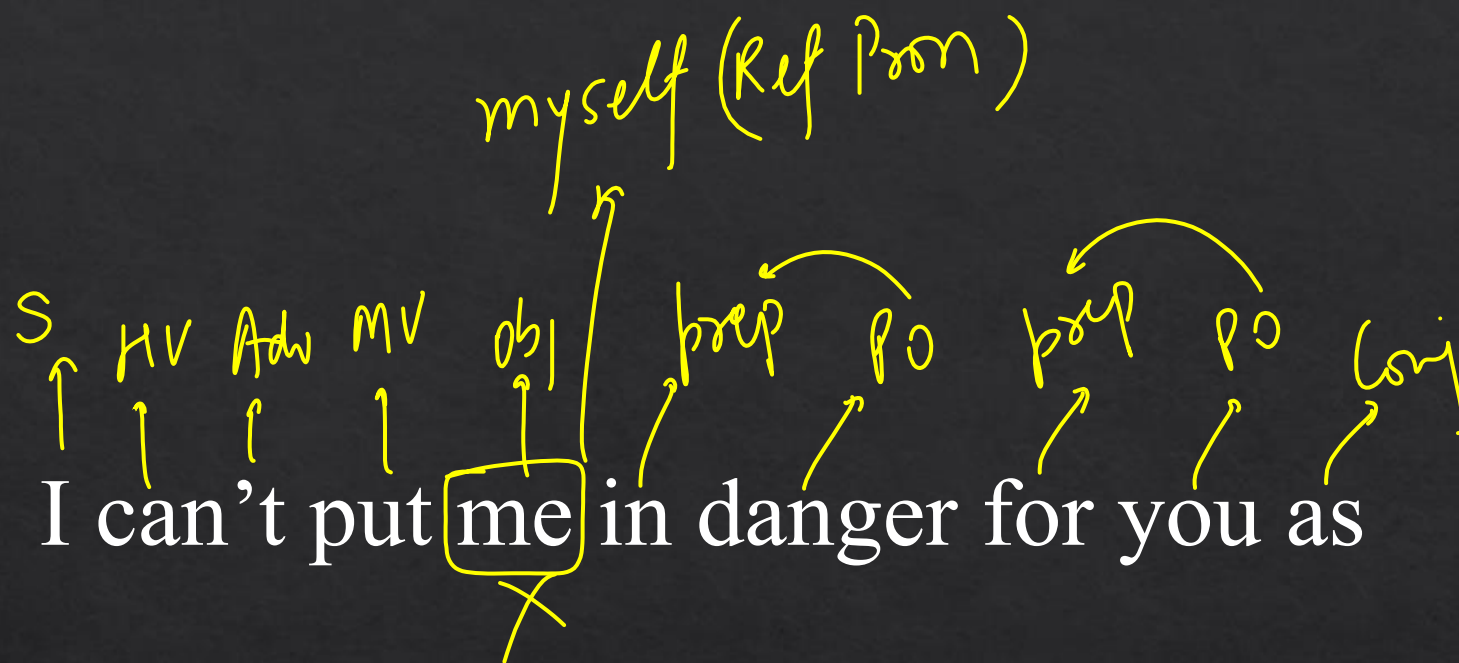

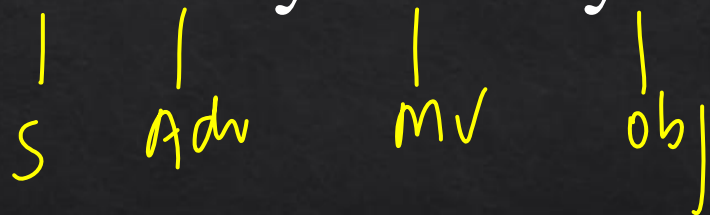

➤ Don't use reflexive pronoun after these verbs keep, stop, turn, qualify, bathe, move, rest, hide etc.

Emphatic Pronoun:- It is used to emphasise that the action was done by the subject himself.
